Williamson County, Texas
For On-Site Sewage Facilities

Williamson County is proposing the adoption of rules for on-site sewage facilities (OSSF) for Williamson County, Texas. This notice advises the public that the County will be conducting an online virtual public meeting on these rules. The virtual public meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 9, 2020, at 5 p.m. To log onto the virtual public meeting, go to the following web address at the date and time indicated above: www.wilco.org/ossf. Project staff will give a presentation which will be a pre-recorded video and will include both audio and visual components. Please note the presentation will not be available on the website until the time and date listed above. Following the virtual public meeting, the presentation will remain available for viewing at the web address indicated above until Wednesday, December 23, 2020, at 5 p.m. If you do not have internet access, you may call 512-943-3330 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, to ask questions and access materials. Formal comments may be provided by mail, email, or voicemail as explained below.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has established rules for OSSF to provide the citizens of the state with adequate public health protection and a minimum of environmental pollution. The Texas Legislature, through the Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 366, authorizes local governments to regulate the use of on-site sewage facilities in its jurisdiction in order to abate or prevent pollution or injury to public health arising out of the use of such facilities. The Williamson County Commissioners Court finds that the Edwards Aquifer is a vital source of drinking water for its residents and is

susceptible to groundwater pollution. It also finds the use of OSSF may cause pollution. Given these facts, the Williamson County Commissioners Court has deemed it appropriate to enact an Order adopting Rules regulating on-site sewage facilities to abate or prevent pollution or injury to public health in Williamson County.

The virtual public meeting outlining these rules for OSSF in Williamson County will be conducted in English. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating effectively in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs. If you need interpretation or translation services or you are a person with a disability who requires an accommodation to attend and participate in the virtual public meeting, please contact the Williamson County Public Information Office at 512-943-1195 no later than 4 p.m. CT, Friday, December 11, 2020. Please be aware that advance notice is required as some services and accommodations may require time for the County to arrange.
