INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN WILLIAMSON COUNTY AND THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY AND CITIES HEALTH DISTRICT FOR PUBLIC HEALTH DATA SHARING

This Interlocal Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), and the WILLIAMSON COUNTY AND CITIES HEALTH DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as "WCCHD"). WCCHD and the County are herein referred to collectively as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party."

WHEREAS, Texas Government Code, Chapter 791, Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, allows WCCHD and the County to contract with one another to perform governmental functions and services.

WHEREAS, WCCHD and the County, each are a "public health authority" as defined by the privacy rules adopted pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act ("HIPAA").

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 121, Texas Local Public Health Reorganization Act, WCCHD is a public health district that performs public health functions on behalf of its members, including the County.

WHEREAS, on March 13. 2020, Greg Abbott, Governor of Texas, issued a disaster proclamation certifying under Section 418.014 of the Texas Government Code that the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) poses an imminent threat of disaster for all counties in the State of Texas, and the disaster proclamation has been renewed for subsequent 30-day periods.

WHEREAS, during the pendency of the COVID-19 disaster proclamation, WCCHD has received data and information regarding the occurrence of COVID-19 within Williamson County, including protected health information (PHI) as defined by the HIPAA privacy rules.

WHEREAS, during the pendency of the COVID-19 disaster proclamation, the Parties have cooperated to share public health information regarding COVID-19, including PHI.

WHEREAS, the Parties anticipate that sharing of public health information, including PHI, will continue to be necessary after the termination of the COVID-19 disaster proclamation.

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to contract with each other for sharing public health information regarding communicable diseases.

WHEREAS, Section 81.046 of the Texas Health & Safety Code establishes the confidentiality of information regarding communicable diseases that is reported to a public health district.

WHEREAS, for some of its functions, WCCHD is a Covered Entity as defined by the HIPAA privacy rules and Chapter 181 of the Texas Health & Safety Code, and is committed to complying with the HIPAA privacy rules and the Texas Health & Safety Code.

WHEREAS, the Parties hereby make a determination that entering into this Agreement would be mutually beneficial and not detrimental to the Parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. **AUTHORITY**

This Agreement is entered into by and between the Parties pursuant to the authority contained in Texas Government Code, Chapter 791, Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act. The provisions of Chapter 791 of the Government Code are incorporated into this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the Act.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

For the purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

<u>Data</u> includes information regarding possible or suspected individuals with a communicable disease, including, without limitation, COVID-19. This may include direct identifiers and includes, but is not limited to:

- a) Dates of treatment, admission, and discharge,
- b) Name and address,
- c) Birth date, date of death,
- d) Age,
- e) Telephone numbers, fax numbers,
- f) Electronic mail addresses,
- g) Results of any tests administered,
- h) Symptoms,
- i) Treatment provided, and
- i) Other personal identifiers.

<u>Commercial Purposes</u>: The sale, lease, license, or other transfer of the Data to a for-profit organization or an insurance company and shall also include uses of the Data by any organization, to perform contract research, to produce or manufacture products for general sale, or to conduct research activities that result in any sale, lease, license, or transfer of the Data to a for-profit organization.

3. TERM

- 3.1 The initial term of this Agreement shall be for three (3) years from the effective date hereof. After that initial term, this Agreement shall automatically renew for successive terms of three (3) years each with such renewals to occur on the expiration date of the preceding term.
- 3.2 It is understood and expressly acknowledged by the Parties that Subsection 3.1 is subject to the provisions for early termination contained in Section 6.1 herein, and that this Agreement may be terminated for cause or convenience by either of the Parties in accordance with Section 6 herein, and that such termination may be effected at any time during the initial term or any successive renewal terms.

4. AGREEMENTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

- 4.1 This Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions pursuant by which WCCHD will share Data with the County.
- 4.2 At the request of the County, WCCHD will share with the County, Data within WCCHD's possession, including protected health information (PHI), on an ongoing basis regarding all prior and prospective cases of patients exposed to, suspected, or confirmed to have a communicable disease, including COVID-19.
- 4.3 The County will only use the Data shared pursuant to this Agreement for the purposes of controlling and preventing disease.
 - 4.4 The Data shall not be used for any Commercial Purposes.
- 4.5 The County agrees to use appropriate data security measures and other safeguards to prevent the inappropriate use or disclosure of the Data in accordance with relevant laws and this Agreement. The parties hereby incorporate the terms of the Business Associate Agreement included as Attachment A.
- 4.6 The Parties agree to comply with privacy standards adopted by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services as they may be amended from time to time, 45 C.F.R. parts 160 and security standards adopted by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services as they may be amended from time to time, 45 C.F.R. parts 160, 162 and 164, subpart C, and the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act, Title XIII of Division A and Title IV of Division B of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 and regulations promulgated thereunder, and any applicable state confidentiality laws.
- 4.7 Pursuant to Tex. Health & Safety Code § 181.006, PHI is not public information subject to disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act ("TPIA") found in Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code. WCCHD and the County agree that the sharing of Data is an intergovernmental transfer of information, and not the release of public information.
- 4.8 If either Party receives a request for the Data, including a subpoena or a TPIA request, it must inform the other Party within three days and at least five days before responding

to the request.

- 4.9 The Parties agree that there will be no payment to each other for labor services, expenses or any costs for the work to be performed under this Agreement. Each Party shall be responsible for its own costs and expenses, and neither Party shall be entitled to payment or reimbursement from the other Party for its services, provided however, the Parties will work together as necessary to obtain any available governmental reimbursement for services or projects under this Agreement, including reimbursement that may need to flow through one Party to the other.
- 4.10 The Parties' obligations to protect Data provided under, or in accordance with, this Agreement shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

5. LIABILITY

5.1 The Parties expressly agree that nothing in this Agreement adds to or changes the liability limits and immunities for a governmental unit provided by the Texas Tort Claims Act, Chapter 101, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, or other law. The Parties expressly agree that, in the execution of this Agreement, neither Party waives, nor shall be deemed hereby to waive, any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to it against claims arising in the exercise of its powers or functions or pursuant to the Texas Tort Claims Act or other applicable statutes, laws, rules, or regulations.

6. TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION

6.1 Either Party has the right to terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, for convenience and without cause, at any time upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other Party.

7. NOTICE

7.1 All notices, demands and requests, including invoices which may be given or which are required to be given by either Party to the other, and any exercise of a right of termination provided by this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be deemed effective when sent, by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the intended recipient at the address specified below:

The Parties may change the person designated for receipt of notice from time to time by giving notice in writing to the other parties, identifying the new person designated for receipt of service and identifying his/her name, title, address for notice and phone number.

8. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- **8.1** If a dispute or claim arises under this Agreement, the Parties agree to first try to resolve the dispute or claim by appropriate internal means, including referral to each Party's senior management. If the Parties cannot reach a mutually satisfactory resolution, then any such dispute or claim will be sought to be resolved with the help of a mutually selected mediator. If the parties cannot agree on a mediator, WCCHD and County shall each select a mediator and the two mediators shall agree upon a third mediator. Any costs and fees, other than attorney fees, associated with the mediation shall be shared equally by the Parties.
- **8.2** WCCHD and County hereby expressly agree that no claims or disputes between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement or a breach thereof shall be decided by any arbitration proceeding, including without limitation, any proceeding under the Federal Arbitration Act (9 USC Section 1-14) or any applicable state arbitration statute.

9. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 9.1 <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. No term or provision of this Agreement is intended to, or shall, create any rights in any person, firm, corporation, or other entity not a party hereto, and no such person or entity shall have any cause of action hereunder.
- 9.2 <u>No Other Relationship</u>. No term or provision in this Agreement is intended to create a partnership, joint venture, or agency arrangement between the Parties.
- 9.3 <u>Current Revenues</u>. Pursuant to Section 791.011(d)(3) of the Texas Government Code, each Party performing services or furnishing services pursuant to this Agreement shall do so with funds available from current revenues of the Party.
- 9.4 <u>Amendment</u>. Amendment of this Agreement may only be by mutual written consent of the Parties.
- 9.5 Governing Law and Venue. The Parties agree that this Agreement and all disputes arising thereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, and that exclusive venue for any action arising under this Agreement shall be in Williamson County, Texas.

- 9.6 Force Majeure. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Agreement to the contrary, no failure, delay or default in performance of any obligation hereunder shall constitute an event of default or a breach of this Agreement if such failure to perform, delay or default arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Party otherwise chargeable with failure, delay or default; including but not limited to acts of God, acts of public enemy, civil war, insurrection, riots, fires, floods, explosion, theft, earthquakes, natural disasters or other casualties, strikes or other labor troubles, which in any way restrict the performance under this Agreement by the Parties.
- 9.7 <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties regarding the subject matter contained herein. The Parties may not modify or amend this Agreement, except by written agreement approved by the governing bodies of each Party and duly executed by both Parties.
- **9.8** Approval. This Agreement has been duly and properly approved by each Party's governing body and constitutes a binding obligation on each Party.
- 9.9 <u>Assignment</u>. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, a Party may not assign this Agreement or subcontract the performance of services without first obtaining the written consent of the other Party.
- 9.10 <u>Non-Appropriation and Fiscal Funding</u>. The obligations of the Parties under this Agreement do not constitute a general obligation or indebtedness of either Party for which such Party is obligated to levy, pledge, or collect any form of taxation. It is understood and agreed that either Party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement at the end of either Party's fiscal year if the governing body of Party does not appropriate sufficient funds as determined by Party's budget for the fiscal year in question. Party may effect such termination by giving other the other Party written notice of termination at the end of its then-current fiscal year.
- 9.11 <u>Non-Waiver</u>. A Party's failure or delay to exercise a right or remedy does not constitute a waiver of the right or remedy. An exercise of a right or remedy under this Agreement does not preclude the exercise of another right or remedy. Rights and remedies under this Agreement are cumulative and are not exclusive of other rights or remedies provided by law.
- **9.12** Paragraph Headings. The various paragraph headings are inserted for convenience of reference only, and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement or any section thereof.
- 9.13 Severability. The Parties agree that in the event any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction that part of the Agreement is severable and the decree shall not affect the remainder of the Agreement. The remainder of the Agreement shall be and continue in full force and effect.
- **9.14** Open Meetings Act. The Parties hereby represent and affirm that this Agreement was adopted in an open meeting held in compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act (Tex. Gov. Code, Ch. 551), as amended.

- 9.15 Compliance with All Laws. The Parties agree and will comply with any and all local, state or federal requirements with respect to this Agreement.
- 9.16 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts which, when taken together, shall be considered as one original.
- 0.17 Effective Date. This Agreement is made to be effective on the latest date

ATTACHMENT A

HIPAA BUSINESS ASSOCIATE AGREEMENT

This HIPAA Business Associate Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into between Williamson County & Cities Health District ("Covered Entity") and Williamson County, Texas ("Business Associate") (collectively, the "Parties"), effective as of the Effective Date.

- 1. <u>Business Associate(s) Obligations</u>. Business Associate may receive from Covered Entity, or create or receive on behalf of Covered Entity, health information that is protected under applicable state and/or federal law, including without limitation, protected health information ("PHI") and electronic protected health information ("EPHI"). All references to PHI herein shall be construed to include EPHI. Business Associate agrees not to use or disclose (or permit the use or disclosure of) PHI in a manner that would violate the Privacy Standards, Security Standards or the HITECH Act, as applicable (collectively referred to hereinafter as the "Confidentiality Requirements") if the PHI were used or disclosed by Covered Entity in the same manner.
- 2. <u>Use of PHI</u>. Except as otherwise required by law, Business Associate shall use PHI in compliance with 45 C.F.R. § 164.504(e). Furthermore, Business Associate shall use PHI (i) for the purposes described in Section 2.1, (ii) for Data Aggregation Services (as hereinafter defined), and (iii) as necessary for the proper management and administration of Business Associate or to carry out its legal responsibilities, provided that such uses are permitted under federal and state law. Use, creation and disclosure of de-identified health information, as that term is defined in 45 CFR § 164.514, by Business Associate is permitted.
- 2.1 Covered Entity and Business Associate agree that the PHI contemplated under this Agreement will be utilized for the following purposes:
 - (i) Conducting disease and outbreak investigations;
 - (ii) Estimating disease case counts and incidence rates;
 - (iii) Analyzing disease data to monitor trends;
 - (iv) Conducting research to determine factors for disease; and
 - (v) Monitoring those individuals who are affected by a communicable disease.
- 2.2 Oral or written presentations containing or derived from PHI from Covered Entity and that are intended for release or disclosure to the public, including but not limited to compilations, intended publications, articles, or studies of the results of any analyses completed by Business Associate, or at the direction of Business Associate, will be submitted by Business Associate to Covered Entity for review and approval prior to release or publication of the same. This Section 2.2 does not apply to oral or written presentations containing only (i) aggregate data concerning health conditions required to be reported by applicable statutes or regulations, or (2) de-identified health information, as that term is defined in 45 CFR § 164.514.
- 3. <u>Disclosure of PHI</u>. Subject to any limitations in this Agreement, Business Associate may disclose PHI to any third-party persons or entities as necessary to perform its obligations under the Business Arrangement and as permitted or required by applicable federal or state law.

- 3.1 Business Associate shall not and shall provide that its directors, officers, employees, subcontractors, and agents, do not disclose PHI to any other person (other than members of their respective workforce as specified in subsection 3.1(ii) below), unless disclosure is required by law or authorized by the person whose PHI is to be disclosed. Any such disclosure other than as specifically permitted in the immediately preceding sentences shall be made only if such disclosee has previously signed a written agreement that:
 - (i) Binds the disclosee to the provisions of this Agreement pertaining to PHI, for the express benefit of Covered Entity, Business Associate and, if disclosee is other than Business Associate, the disclosee;
 - (ii) Contains reasonable assurances from disclosee that the PHI will be held confidential as provided in this Agreement, and only disclosed as required by law for the purposes for which it was disclosed to disclosee; and
 - (iii) Obligates disclosee to immediately notify Business Associate of any breaches of the confidentiality of the PHI, to the extent disclosee has obtained knowledge of such breach.
- 3.2 Business Associate shall not disclose PHI to any member of its workforce and shall provide that its subcontractors and agents do not disclose PHI to any member of their respective workforces, unless Business Associate or such subcontractor or agent has advised such person of Business Associate's obligations under this Agreement, and of the consequences for such person and for Business Associate or such subcontractor or agent of violating them. Business Associate shall take and shall provide that each of its subcontractors and agents take appropriate disciplinary action against any member of its respective workforce who uses or discloses PHI in contravention of this Agreement.
- 3.3 In addition to Business Associate's obligations under Section 9, Business Associate agrees to mitigate, to the extent commercially practical, harmful effects that are known to Business Associate and are the result of a use or disclosure of PHI by Business Associate or Recipients in violation of this Agreement.
- 4. Access to and Amendment of PHI. Business Associate shall (i) provide access to, and permit inspection and copying of, PHI by Covered Entity; and (ii) amend PHI maintained by Business Associate as requested by Covered Entity. Business Associate shall respond to any request from Covered Entity for access by an individual within seven (7) days of such request and shall make any amendment requested by Covered Entity within twenty (20) days of the later of (a) such request by Covered Entity or (b) the date as of which Covered Entity has provided Business Associate with all information necessary to make such amendment. Business Associate may charge a reasonable fee based upon Business Associate's labor costs in responding to a request for electronic information (or the fee approved by the Texas Medical Board for the production of non-electronic media copies). Business Associate shall notify Covered Entity within five (5) days of receipt of any request for access or amendment by an individual. Covered Entity shall determine whether to grant or deny any access or amendment requested by the individual. Business Associate shall have a process in place for requests for amendments and for appending such requests and statements in response to denials of such requests to the Designated Record Set, as requested by Covered Entity.

- **Accounting of Disclosures.** Business Associate shall make available to Covered Entity in response to a request from an individual, information required for an accounting of disclosures of PHI with respect to the individual in accordance with 45 CFR § 164.528, as amended by Section 13405(c) of the HITECH Act and any related regulations or guidance issued by HHS in accordance with such provision.
- **Records and Audit.** Business Associate shall make available to the United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) or its agents, its internal practices, books, and records relating to the use and disclosure of PHI received from, created, or received by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity for the purpose of determining Covered Entity's compliance with the Confidentiality Requirements or the requirements of any other health oversight agency, in a time and manner designated by the Secretary.
- 7. <u>Implementation of Security Standards; Notice of Security Incidents.</u> Business Associate will use appropriate safeguards to prevent the use or disclosure of PHI other than as expressly permitted under this Agreement. Business Associate will implement administrative, physical and technical safeguards that reasonably and appropriately protect the confidentiality, integrity and availability of the PHI that it creates, receives, maintains or transmits on behalf of Covered Entity. Business Associate acknowledges that the HITECH Act requires Business Associate to comply with 45 C.F.R. §§164.308, 164.310, 164.312 and 164.316 as if Business Associate were a Covered Entity, and Business Associate agrees to comply with these provisions of the Security Standards and all additional security provisions of the HITECH Act.

Furthermore, to the extent feasible, Business Associate will use commercially reasonable efforts to secure PHI through technology safeguards that render such PHI unusable, unreadable and indecipherable to individuals unauthorized to acquire or otherwise have access to such PHI in accordance with HHS Guidance published at 74 Federal Register 19006 (April 17, 2009), or such later regulations or guidance promulgated by HHS or issued by the National Institute for Standards and Technology ("NIST") concerning the protection of identifiable data such as PHI. Lastly, Business Associate will promptly report to Covered Entity any successful Security Incident of which it becomes aware. At the request of Covered Entity, Business Associate shall identify: the date of the Security Incident, the scope of the Security Incident, Business Associate's response to the Security Incident and the identification of the party responsible for causing the Security Incident, if known.

8. <u>Data Breach Notification and Mitigation</u>.

8.1 <u>HIPAA Data Breach Notification and Mitigation</u>. Business Associate agrees to implement reasonable systems for the discovery and prompt reporting to Covered Entity of any "breach" of "unsecured PHI" as those terms are defined by 45 C.F.R. § 164.402. Specifically, a breach is an unauthorized acquisition, access, use or disclosure of unsecured PHI, including EPHI, which compromises the security or privacy of the PHI/EPHI. A breach compromises the security or privacy of PHI/EPHI if it poses a significant risk of financial, reputational, or other harm to the individual whose PHI/EPHI was compromised (hereinafter a "HIPAA Breach"). The parties acknowledge and agree that 45 C.F.R. § 164.404, as described below in this Section 8.1, governs the determination of the date of discovery of a HIPAA Breach. In the event of any conflict

between this Section 8.1 and the Confidentiality Requirements, the more stringent requirements shall govern.

- 8.2 <u>Discovery of Breach</u>. Business Associate will, following the discovery of a HIPAA Breach, notify Covered Entity immediately and in no event later than five (5) business days after Business Associate discovers such HIPAA Breach, unless Business Associate is prevented from doing so by 45 C.F.R. §164.412 concerning law enforcement investigations. For purposes of reporting a HIPAA Breach to Covered Entity, the discovery of a HIPAA Breach shall occur as of the first day on which such HIPAA Breach is known to Business Associate or, by exercising reasonable diligence, would have been known to Business Associate. Business Associate will be considered to have had knowledge of a HIPAA Breach if the HIPAA Breach is known, or by exercising reasonable diligence would have been known, to any person (other than the person committing the HIPAA Breach) who is an employee, officer or other agent of Business Associate.
- 8.3 Reporting a Breach. No later than seven (7) business days following a HIPAA Breach, Business Associate shall provide Covered Entity with sufficient information to permit Covered Entity to comply with the HIPAA Breach notification requirements set forth at 45 C.F.R. § 164.400 *et seq.* Specifically, if the following information is known to (or can be reasonably obtained by) Business Associate, Business Associate will provide Covered Entity with:
 - (i) contact information for individuals who were or who may have been impacted by the HIPAA Breach (e.g., first and last name, mailing address, street address, phone number, email address);
 - (ii) a brief description of the circumstances of the HIPAA Breach, including the date of the HIPAA Breach and date of discovery;
 - (iii) a description of the types of unsecured PHI involved in the HIPAA Breach (e.g., names, social security number, date of birth, addressees), account numbers of any type, disability codes, diagnostic and/or billing codes and similar information);
 - (iv) a brief description of what Business Associate has done or are doing to investigate the HIPAA Breach, mitigate harm to the individual impacted by the HIPAA Breach, and protect against future HIPAA Breaches; and
 - (v) appoint a liaison and provide contact information for same so that Covered Entity may ask questions or learn additional information concerning the HIPAA Breach.

Following a HIPAA Breach, Business Associate will have a continuing duty to inform Covered Entity of new information learned by Business Associate regarding the HIPAA Breach, including but not limited to the information described in items (i) through (v), above.

9. Termination.

- 9.1 This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date.
- 9.2 Upon the termination of the applicable Business Arrangement, either Party may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to the other Party.
 - 9.3 Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, Business Associate agrees:
 - (i) to return to Covered Entity or to destroy all PHI received from Covered Entity or otherwise through the performance of services for Covered Entity, that is in the possession or control of Business Associate or the agents of Business Associate. Business Associate agrees that all paper, film, or other hard copy media shall be shredded or destroyed such that it may not be reconstructed, and EPHI shall be purged or destroyed concurrent with NIST Guidelines for media sanitization at http://www.csrc.nist.gov/; or
 - (ii) in the case of PHI which is not feasible to "return or destroy," to extend the protections of this Agreement to such PHI and limit further uses and disclosures of such PHI to those purposes that make the return or destruction infeasible, for so long as Business Associate maintains such PHI. Business Associate further agrees to comply with other applicable state or federal law, which may require a specific period of retention, redaction, or other treatment of such PHI.

10. Miscellaneous.

10.1 <u>Notice</u>. All notices, requests, demands and other communications required or permitted to be given or made under this Agreement shall be in writing, shall be effective upon receipt or attempted delivery, and shall be sent by (i) personal delivery; (ii) certified or registered United States mail, return receipt requested; (iii) overnight delivery service with proof of delivery; or (iv) facsimile with return facsimile acknowledging receipt. Notices shall be sent to the addresses below. Neither party shall refuse delivery of any notice hereunder.

- 10.2 <u>Waiver</u>. No provision of this Agreement or any breach thereof shall be deemed waived unless such waiver is in writing and signed by the Party claimed to have waived such provision or breach. No waiver of a breach shall constitute a waiver of or excuse any different or subsequent breach.
- 10.3 <u>Assignment</u>. Neither Party may assign (whether by operation or law or otherwise) any of its rights or delegate or subcontract any of its obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Covered Entity shall have the right to assign its rights and obligations hereunder to any entity that is an affiliate or successor of Covered Entity, without the prior approval of Business Associate.
- 10.4 <u>Severability</u>. Any provision of this Agreement that is determined to be invalid or unenforceable will be ineffective to the extent of such determination without invalidating the remaining provisions of this Agreement or affecting the validity or enforceability of such remaining provisions.
- Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the complete agreement between Business Associate and Covered Entity relating to the matters specified in this Agreement, and supersedes all prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written, with respect to such matters. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the terms of the Business Arrangements or any such later agreement(s), the terms of this Agreement shall control unless the terms of such Business Arrangements are more strict with respect to PHI and comply with the Confidentiality Requirements, or the parties specifically otherwise agree in writing. No oral modification or waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be binding on either Party; provided, however, that upon the enactment of any law, regulation, court decision or relevant government publication and/or interpretive guidance or policy that the Covered Entity believes in good faith will adversely impact the use or disclosure of PHI under this Agreement, Covered Entity may amend the Agreement to comply with such law, regulation, court decision or government publication, guidance or policy by delivering a written amendment to Business Associate which shall be effective thirty (30) days after receipt. No obligation on either Party to enter into any transaction is to be implied from the execution or delivery of this Agreement. This Agreement is for the benefit of, and shall be binding upon the parties, their affiliates and respective successors and assigns. No third party shall be considered a third-party beneficiary under this Agreement, nor shall any third party have any rights as a result of this Agreement.
- 10.6 <u>Governing Law.</u> Both Parties agree that Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of Texas. Both Parties expressly consent to the jurisdiction of the state and federal courts located in Texas. The Parties further agree that the exclusive venue for the resolution of any dispute relating to the subject matter of this agreement shall be in the state courts located in Williamson County, Texas and in the federal courts in Travis County, Texas.
- 10.7 <u>Nature of Agreement</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create (i) a partnership, joint venture or other joint business relationship between the parties or any of their affiliates, or (ii) a relationship of employer and employee between the parties. Business Associate is not an agent of Covered Entity. This Agreement does not express or imply any commitment to purchase or sell goods or services.

- 10.8 <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same document. In making proof of this Agreement, it shall not be necessary to produce or account for more than one such counterpart executed by the party against whom enforcement of this Agreement is sought. Signatures to this Agreement transmitted by facsimile transmission, by electronic mail in portable document format (".pdf") form, or by any other electronic means intended to preserve the original graphic and pictorial appearance of a document, will have the same force and effect as physical execution and delivery of the paper document bearing the original signature.
- 10.9 <u>Definitions</u>. For the purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:
 - (i) "Business Associate(s)" shall have the meaning given to the term "Associate" under the Privacy Rule, including, but not limited to, 45 CFR Section 160.103.
 - (ii) "Covered Entity" shall have the meaning given to such term under the Privacy Rule, including, but not limited to, 45 CFR Section 160.103.
 - (iii) "Data Aggregation Services" shall mean the combining of PHI or EPHI by Business Associates with the PHI or EPHI received by Business Associate in its capacity as a business associate of another covered entity, to permit data analyses that relate to the health care operations of, payment to, and treatment of patients by the respective covered entities.
 - (iv) "Electronic Protected Health Information" or "EPHI" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA Rule, including but not limited to 45 CFR Parts 160, 162, and 164, and under HITECH.
 - (v) "Privacy Rule" shall mean the HIPAA Regulation that is codified at 45 C.F.R. Parts 160, 162 and 164.

Records Storage Service Descriptions

- **1. Records Center Stack Storage:** The monthly fee is \$0.20 per cubic foot. The industry standard is to assess a standard record storage box with the lid at 1.2 cubic feet each; this is equal to \$0.24 per month. Storage of containers other than the standard container includes either 36 or 48" roll plan (RP36, RP48).
- **2. Oversize Documents:** If documents are too large or too fragile to be housed in roll plan boxes, please contact the Records Center Manager to discuss alternatives. Charges will be based on the amount of space taken up on shelves. Arrangements for other types of storage and pricing will be taken on a case-by-case basis.
- **3. Map Storage:** Oversized maps that can be stored on shelves, map cabinets, or oversized flat boxes will be accepted on a case-by –case basis as room is available. Pricing will vary based on the amount of floor space or shelf space taken up by the maps. Please contact the State Records Center Manager for additional information.
- **4-6. Microform Storage:** Reels and Microfiche are stored in one of the microfilm vaults at the State Records Center. The rate of \$0.07 is for a 16mm reel, that fee is doubled for 35mm. The cost of storing each sheet of microfiche is \$0.0015.
- **7. Microfilm Storage Quarantine 16 mm roll:** Film that is identified as having oxidation, vinegar syndrome, or other degradation issues will be removed from storage. Film will be segregated into a vault designated for quarantined film. The owner of the film will have the option of duplicating the film or leaving the film in quarantine vault. 16 mm microfilm stored in this area will be charged a rate of \$0.21 per roll, per month.
- **8. Microfilm Storage Quarantine 35 mm roll:** Film that is identified as having oxidation, vinegar syndrome, or other degradation issues will be removed from storage. Film will be segregated into a vault designated for quarantined film. The owner of the film will have the option of duplicating the film or leaving the film in quarantine vault. 35 mm microfilm stored in this area will be charged a rate of \$0.42 per roll, per month.
- **9. Microfilm Storage Quarantine Microfiche:** Film that is identified as having oxidation, vinegar syndrome, or other degradation issues will be removed from storage. Film will be segregated into a vault designated for quarantined film. The owner of the film will have the option of duplicating the film or leaving the film in quarantine vault. Microfiche stored in this area will be charged a rate of \$0.0045 per sheet, per month.
- **10. Disaster Recovery Vault Storage:** The fee is assessed for the total volume of cubic feet stored in the disaster recovery vault that is not processed into and/or out of disaster recovery vault storage during each month, but remains in storage for the entire month.
- **11. Disaster Recovery Vault Circulation Services:** The fee is assessed for the total volume of cubic feet processed into and/or out of the disaster recovery vault storage during each month, and includes such processing for records that are stored for less than one month.
- **12.** Accession Services: The fee is assessed for accessioning items for storage including these activities: receive request to store; create new items in tracking software; assign locations; generate and print labels; affix labels; and add to shelves.

The charge is per item (box, reel, etc.).

- **13. Disposal and Destruction Services:** The fee is assessed for removing items from storage including these activities: verify request against retention schedule; staff pull from shelves; staff verify boxes pulled; palletize; shrink wrap; staff present at vendor pick up for secure destruction; and staff mark items as destroyed in tracking software. The charge is per item (box, reel, etc.).
- **14. Permanent Withdrawal Services:** The fee is assessed for permanent withdrawal of items from storage including these activities: pull from shelf; send to customer; and mark items as permanently returned to customer in tracking software. Includes items transferred from agency to agency or to transfer ownership to the State Archives. The charge is per item (box, reel, etc.).
- **15.1 Circulation Services:** The fee is assessed for circulating items to/from storage including these activities: process request from customer to borrow or return borrowed items stored box, file folder from box, or microfilm/microfiche; generate paper request; pull from/return to shelf; send to customer; and mark item in/out in tracking software. The charge is per item (box, file, reel, etc.) each time the item is handled.

- **15.2** Microfiche Circulation: Microfiche circulation will be calculated either by batch pull (pulling one set = 1 pull fee) or by individual fiche within a set if the request is for anything other than a full batch (e.g. 5 single fiche pulled from on large set or several different sets = 5 pull fees).
- **16.** Rush Circulation Services: The fee is assessed for circulating items from storage that are requested to be retrieved prior to the next standard delivery/pick up cycle. These activities include: process request from customer to borrow items stored box, file folder from box, or microfilm/microfiche; generate paper request; pull from a shelf; stage at records center for pick up by customer or send to customer; and mark item out in tracking software. The charge is per item (box, file, reel, etc.) each time the item is handled. In addition to the Rush circulation charge, if the item(s) is to be delivered to the customer the Rush Delivery charge will be applied as well (Item 18).
- **17.** Regular Deliveries/pickups (in City of Austin): Records requested will typically be delivered within one business day or customer can schedule one trip per week. Fee is assessed each way for each stop (individual, department, floor, building, etc.).
- **18.** Rush Deliveries/Pickups (in City of Austin): Applies to RUSH requests that were retrieved and delivered prior to the next standard delivery/pick up cycle. In addition, a Rush Circulation Service fee is also applied for Rush requests (Item 16).
- 19. Special Deliveries/Pickups surcharge (in City of Austin): This fee is added to each item over 30 items that requires additional time of State Records Center staff at the pickup/delivery site because items are not staged properly in a dock or prior agreed upon staging area. Some examples of when the surcharge would be applied are: when SRC staff are required to remove boxes from shelves; boxes or files are scattered across a facility requiring staff to wait to have items brought to them or go to multiple locations to pick up; boxes are stacked out of order; when returning boxes staff are requested to place boxes on a shelving unit or to stack boxes in anyway other than how they are on the carts.
- **20. Delivery Mileage Charge (outside City of Austin):** Applies to actual mileage for pickups or deliveries outside the City of Austin city limits. This is in addition to the Regular or Expedited delivery/pickup charges.
- **21. Scan on Demand:** Applies to a per page or per frame of microforms for the State Records Center to scan a document and digitally transmit that document to the customer. NOTE: Circulation and research charges also apply to the scan on demand service. (Items 15, 16 and 26).
- **22. Scan on Demand oversize documents:** Applies to a per page fee for the State Records Center to scan a document and digitally transmit that document to the customer. Circulation and research charges also apply to the scan on demand service. (Items 15, 16 and 26).
- **23**. **Data Entry**: The State Records Center has implemented a new automated inventory system that allows customers access to the system from their office. As a service to our customers the SRC will continue to data enter accession information or accept email and phone requests for circulation of items and then enter those requests into the system for a charge of \$0.50 per line. If customers choose to do their own data entry, the charge will be waived. Creation of labels will not incur a charge.
- **24. Relabel:** When boxes or files at the state records center are mislabeled and the owning agency requests new labels for their boxes or files. Examples of mislabeling might include misspelling names, mismatched alpha numeric codes, or removing PII from labels. This fee will not be assessed for damaged barcodes that are reprinted using the same information that was on the damaged barcode or for boxes transferred from one agency to another agency.
- **25.** Document Preparation (if required for scan on demand): Document preparation involves repairing and arranging documents in the proper order, removing fasteners, stamping/coding, etc. Charges calculated in 15-minute increments with a minimum charge of \$10.00.
- **26.** Research box, file, microform assistance: hourly charge of \$40.00 per hour to research box contents on customer's behalf; to search multiple boxes for particular files; to find individual images on reels of microfilm or sheets of microfiche to fulfill a scan on demand request. Charges calculated in 15-minute increments with a minimum charge of \$10.00.

- **27. Special reports research and generation:** hourly charge of \$40.00 per hour to research and create custom reports for customers. Standard reports can be generated by customers through the records tracking system for free. Charges calculated in 15-minute increments with a minimum charge of \$10.00.
- **28. Monthly Minimum Storage Fee:** A minimum monthly storage fee of \$15.00 will be charged at the end of each month for any customer that has a total storage cost of less than that amount.

Other Services: Other services are available and will be discussed with customers and estimates quoted before beginning work. Other services could include hourly charges to re-box materials if received in poor condition (including per box charge for new boxes); and storage of oversized and/or odd shaped records that will not fit in a standard records center box. Please call for quote.

Agency: A state executive, judicial, or legislative department, institution, board, or commission, including an eleemosynary institution.

Cubic Foot (CF): The industry standard is to assess a standard record storage box with the lid at 1.2 cubic feet. **Customer:** Includes state agencies and units of local government.

Disaster recovery services: The temporary off-site storage and regular rotation of a security backup copy of records for the purpose of recovering information in the event of a disaster.

Local Government: A county, including all district and precinct offices of a county, municipality, public school district, appraisal district, or any other special-purpose district or authority.

Imaging Microfilm Service Descriptions

- **1. Source Document Microfilming:** Imaging Services films documents on rotary cameras using 16mm film. The charges include film processing; quality control editing according to client requirements; methylene blue testing; proper targeting and certification; density and resolution readings; and computer-generated container labels and transmittal Information that provide the records series title, roll number, and beginning and ending contents of each roll.
- **2-3. Digital Archiving Services:** Digital archiving converts digital images to archival microfilm for permanent storage and vital/essential record protection in the case of disaster (including technology obsolescence). Input file formats can vary, and the agency should contact Imaging Services prior to beginning project to discuss options. Files can be sent to the Texas State Library using CD-ROMs, a portable hard drive, or through a secure SFTP site. Output format is archival 16mm or 35 mm silver halide microfilm. The charges include film processing; quality control editing according to client requirements; methylene blue testing; proper targeting and certification; density and resolution readings; and computer-generated container labels as well as transmittal information that provide the records series title, roll number, and beginning and ending contents of each roll.
- **4-6. Original Reels Processed:** For reels of film produced by agencies and sent to Imaging Services for processing. The charges include film processing; quality control editing according to client requirements; methylene blue testing; proper targeting and certification; density and resolution readings; and computer-generated container labels.
- **7-13. Reels Duplicated:** A secondary silver film or diazo copy for agency use or distribution. The charges include quality control editing according to client requirements.

This Master Services Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "MSA"), made this January 5, 2016 is by and between Williamson County, an Texas corporation ("Customer") having its principal place of business at 710 S. Main Street, Georgetown, Texas 78627, and Winston Financial Services, Inc., located at 2399 Highway 34, Suite C2, Manasquan, NJ 08736 (hereinafter referred to as "Winston").

This MSA and the one or more attached Appendices and Statements of Work (each an "SOW"), each fully incorporated herein; together comprise the complete agreement between the parties ("Agreement") regarding those Services to be provided hereunder.

In consideration of the mutual promises contained in this Agreement, Customer and Winston agree as follows.

1. Nature and Scope of Services.

We shall provide the Services described in each SOW upon the terms and conditions specified in this MSA and the applicable SOW. Specifications and additional applicable terms shall be set forth in the SOW for the Services.

Notwithstanding any provision of this Agreement, we do not assume any responsibility for (I) the general design of any Plan or Program, (ii) the adequacy of the Plan or Program funding, or (iii) any act or omission or breach of duty by Customer, nor are we in any way to be deemed an insurer, underwriter, or guarantor with respect to any benefits under a Plan or Program. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to impose upon us any obligation to any employee of Customer or any person who is participating in a Plan or Program ("Participant").

WINSTON IS NOT AN ADMINISTRATOR, PLAN ADMINISTRATOR OR FIDUCIARY AS DEFINED UNDER ERISA. The Customer acknowledges, agrees and warrants that the Customer is the named administrator, plan administrator and/or fiduciary within the meaning of ERISA for any and all of Customer's Plan or Programs, as applicable, and, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, we are not a fiduciary nor do we have any discretionary authority with respect to nor control over such Plan or Programs, or any plan assets relating to same. It is understood and agreed that Customer and/or the relevant Plan or Programs have full and final authority and responsibility for the Plan, Programs, plan assets, and operation of same including without limitation, the authority and responsibility for administering, construing and interpreting the provisions of the Plan and the Programs and making all determinations and exercising all discretion there under, responsibility for the benefits structure of the Plan and Programs, claims and appeals decisions, cost containment Program decisions, utilization benefits management, compliance with the requirements of COBRA, compliance with the reporting and disclosure requirements of ERISA, compliance with the requirements of HIPAA, and compliance with any other state and federal law or regulation applicable to the Customer, the Plan or the Programs. We shall not have any duty or power to act on behalf of Customer or any participant or beneficiary in connection with such Plan or Programs other than as expressly stated in this Agreement or upon instruction and direction from the Customer. All final determinations as to a Participant's entitlement to coverage or benefits under the Plan or a Program are to be made by Customer, including any determination upon appeal of a denied claim for Program benefits, unless such determination is to be made by the applicable insurance carrier pursuant to the terms of the Plan or Program.

The Customer shall provide any and all necessary and appropriate instruction with respect to Services set forth in any SOW hereunder regarding the Customer's operation of the Plan or Programs. Winston shall exclusively rely on instruction from the Customer with respect to the operation of such Plan or Programs and shall be entitled to conclusively rely on any written communication received from the Customer, which it reasonably believes to be genuine and signed by a person with apparent authority to issue such a communication. Winston shall then be under no duty to make an investigation or inquiry as to the truth, accuracy, or completeness of any statement or information contained therein.

Customer acknowledges that we are not providing tax or legal advice and that Customer shall be solely responsible for determining the legal and tax status of the Program and the Plan. Winston does not accept any fiduciary or trust responsibilities in connection with the performance of the Services except to the extent required by applicable law.

2. Information From Customer

Customer agrees to and is responsible to promptly provide us with all information we reasonably require to perform the Services hereunder, including without limitation the Plan and Program documents and any Plan or Program amendments, all necessary Plan

information, rates, eligibility rules, exceptions, grand-fathering rules, class distinctions, elimination periods, waiting periods, contributions, census reports, enrollment materials, forms, and booklets. Such information shall be provided in such format, electronic or otherwise, as may be requested by us to perform the Services. Customer shall notify us of any changes to the Plan or Program at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of such changes.

Customer shall be responsible for ensuring the accuracy of its census/eligibility and other files and information provided and shall be solely responsible for any inaccuracies contained therein, except for files modified by us. We shall have no liability to Customer or any Participant as a consequence of an inaccurate file except for files materially modified by us, and we shall not have any obligation as a consequence of Customer failing to review any census/eligibility file for accuracy. Winston shall assume that all such information is complete and accurate and is under no duty to question the completeness or accuracy of such information.

3. Billing and Payment Terms.

<u>Pricing and Compensation</u>. Customer agrees to pay the fees and/or make appointments as specified in each Statement of Service as payment for corresponding Services.

Payment for goods and services shall be governed by Chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code. An invoice shall be deemed overdue the 31st day after the later of (1) the date The County receives the goods under the contract; (2) the date the performance of the service under the contract is completed; or (3) the date the Williamson County Auditor receives an invoice for the goods or services. Interest charges for any overdue payments shall be paid by The County in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 2251.025. More specifically, the rate of interest that shall accrue on a late payment is the rate in effect on September 1 of The County's fiscal year in which the payment becomes due. The said rate in effect on September 1 shall be equal to the sum of one percent (1%); and (2) the prime rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first day of July of the preceding fiscal year that does not fall on a Saturday or Sunday.

<u>Taxes</u>. Prices are exclusive of all sales, use and similar taxes. Customer is responsible for paying the amount of any applicable sales, use or service tax, fees or charges for Services delivered and invoiced to Customer (except for any franchise tax, withholding tax or any tax imposed on Winston's net income), which Winston may be required to collect because of its performance of this Agreement.

Invoices. Customer will be invoiced monthly and pay the agreed upon fee to Winston within 30 business days of the date of the invoice. We may accept any payment without prejudice to our right to recover any remaining balance or to pursue any other remedy available to us.

<u>Payment Dispute</u>: You must notify us of any dispute concerning any payment within 30 business days after receipt of the invoice. Winston and Customer will use their good faith efforts to resolve any disputed fee amount or refusal of payment. We may, in addition to asserting any of our other rights, suspend any further services if your non-payment continues beyond 60 business days.

4. Term and Termination.

This Agreement shall become effective on the Effective Date and shall continue in effect until terminated as specified in this Section ("Term"), subject to any effective date provision in an SOW.

Initial Term shall commence on January 5, 2016 and terminate on January 4, 2019. The agreement shall automatically renew for additional one (1) year terms, and may be terminated by Williamson County upon at least sixty (60) days written notice to Winston prior to the expiration of annual term of its intent not to renew.

<u>Automatic Termination</u>. This Agreement shall automatically terminate as of the earliest of the following: (1) the effective date of any legislation which makes this Agreement illegal; (2) the date Customer becomes insolvent, or bankrupt, or subject to liquidation, receivership, or conservatorship; or (3) the termination date of the Plan and the Programs, subject to any agreement between Customer and Winston regarding payment of benefits after such Plan or Programs are terminated.

Optional Termination. This Agreement may be terminated as of the earliest of the following: (1) by Winston upon the failure of Customer to pay any undisputed charges within sixty (60) business days after written notice to Customer; (2) by Winston upon the failure of Customer to perform its obligations in accordance with this Agreement other than payment of fees for Services which failure has not been cured within 60 days of notice to Customer by Winston of such failure or substantial steps taken towards the cure and diligently pursued; (3) by Customer upon the failure of Winston to perform its obligations in accordance with this Agreement which failure has not been cured within 30 days of notice to Winston by Customer of such failure; or at any time at the option of either party, without future or prospective liability for performance upon giving one hundred twenty (120) days written notice thereof. In the event of termination, Customer will only be liable for its pro rata share of services rendered and goods actually received.

Limited Continuation After Termination. If this Agreement is terminated, Customer and Winston may mutually agree in writing that this Agreement shall continue for the sole purpose of providing certain Services with respect to certain payment of any Plan or Program benefits, expenses, or claims incurred prior to the date of Program such termination. In addition, if this Agreement is terminated while a Program continues in effect, Customer and Winston may mutually agree in writing that this Agreement shall continue for the purpose of payment of any claims for which requests for reimbursements have been received by Winston before the date of such termination. If this Agreement is continued in accordance with this subsection, Customer shall pay the Service Fee incurred during the period that this Agreement is so continued and a final termination fee equal to the final month's Service Fee.

<u>Damages for wrongful termination</u>. In the event this Agreement is terminated by Customer for any reason other than as set forth in this Section, Customer shall pay Winston within 30 days of the date of such termination an amount equal to the sum of any Service Fees unpaid as of the date of such termination.

<u>Survival of Certain Provisions</u>. Termination of this Agreement shall not terminate the rights or obligations of either party arising out of a period prior to such termination. The indemnity, confidentiality, privacy, and security provisions of this Agreement shall survive its termination.

5. Intellectual Property Rights.

Ownership. Each party agrees that except as provided below, it shall acquire no right, title or interest in or to the other party's information, software, data, tools, processes or methods, or any copyrights, trademarks, service marks, trade secrets, patents or any other intellectual or intangible property or property rights of the other by virtue of the service provided or materials delivered pursuant to this Agreement. Customer shall own all right title and interest in and to the underlying factual data gathered through the delivery of services under this Agreement. Winston shall own all right title and interest in and to Winston's trade secrets, Confidential Information or other proprietary rights in any creative or proprietary ideas, information or other material used by Winston or presented to Customer ("Technical Elements") including, but not limited to: data, software, modules, components, designs, utilities, databases, subsets, objects, program listings, tools, models, methodologies, programs, systems, analysis frameworks, leading practices, report formats, manner of data expression and specifications. Winston grants Customer a nonexclusive, royalty-free license to use only the Technical Elements integrated into any deliverable for Customer's internal purposes only. We, upon written notification to us, authorize you to use any of the Technical Elements so long as such use is not to create derivative works and is for your internal business purposes and, if disclosed to a third party, is subject to a written nondisclosure agreement to which we are a party requiring such third party to maintain the confidentiality of the Technical Element and use such Technical Element only for your benefit. Technical Elements shall not include those deliverables Winston creates uniquely for your sole use ("Custom Materials") as further defined in an applicable SOW. Custom Materials shall be deemed a "Work Made For Hire" under the Copyright Act of 1976.

Marks. Neither party shall use the other party's trademarks, service marks, trade names or product names other than as explicitly set forth in this Agreement. During the Term, unless you notify us otherwise, we may include your name in a list of customers on our website or in promotional materials or as a reference in sales presentations. If you are granted the right to use any of our certification seals or logos ("Winston Marks") under the terms of this Agreement, you may use the Winston Marks only as we may authorize. If we install or provide any Winston-owned hardware or software tools to facilitate our performance of the SOW, you agree to use the hardware or software for your internal purposes only as defined in the SOW, not to distribute the hardware or software, and not to reverse engineer, decompile, or disassemble the hardware or software. We shall have the right to revoke your right to use such hardware or software at any time, in which case you shall return the hardware or software to us. Your right to use the hardware or software shall automatically terminate on termination of this Agreement or on completion of the SOW for which the hardware or software was provided.

Representations.

ALL SERVICES AND DELIVERABLES PROVIDED BY US ARE PROVIDED "AS IS". EXCEPT AS SPECIFICALLY SET FORTH IN THIS AGREEMENT, WE DISCLAIM ALL WARRANTIES, CONDITIONS, REPRESENTATIONS, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, ARISING BY LAW OR CUSTOM OR OTHERWISE, INCLUDING ANY WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. WE DO NOT GUARANTEE THAT ANY NETWORK, COMPUTER SYSTEMS, OR ANY PORTIONS THEREOF ARE SECURE. NEITHER PARTY MAKES ANY WARRANTY HEREUNDER TO ANY THIRD PARTY ON BEHALF OF THE OTHER PARTY. THIS AGREEMENT IS NOT INTENDED TO CREATE ANY THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY RELATIONSHIP.

7. Indemnity.

To the extent authorized under Texas law, each party ("Indemnifying Party") agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other, their affiliates, the present and former officers, members, shareholders, directors, employees, representatives, attorneys, insurers and agents of any of these, and their successors, heirs and assigns (each, an "Indemnified Party") from and against any and all losses, liabilities, claims, damages and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of litigation) incurred by the Indemnified Party as the result of any claim by a third party arising out of the Indemnifying Party's material breach of its obligations of this Agreement, gross negligence or willful misconduct; provided, however, that the Indemnifying Party shall not be required to reimburse the Indemnified Party for such amounts if the court rendering the judgment or the agency making the award determines that the liability underlying the judgment or award (and attorneys' fees or penalties with respect thereto) was caused by the negligence, fraud or criminal conduct of the Indemnified Party. The Indemnified Party shall promptly notify the Indemnifying Party of any potential claim covered by this indemnity, cooperate with the Indemnifying Party in the investigation and defense of the same, and allow the Indemnifying Party to control the negotiation, litigation and settlement of the claim. The Indemnifying Party's undertaking to defend, indemnify and hold harmless shall be limited to the extent that any delay by the Indemnified Party in giving notice to adversely affects the defense of, or ability to settle, such losses, liabilities, claims, damages or expenses.

Winston shall defend or settle (at our expense and discretion) any action or proceeding brought against you based upon a claim that our Technical Elements violate or infringe any existing patent, copyright, trademark, or trade secret, provided you notify us promptly and give us all necessary information and authority required for the defense or settlement of such action or proceeding, but we shall not be responsible for any cost or expense incurred or compromise made by you without our prior written consent or for any expenses incurred by you (including legal fees and expenses) in investigation or participation in any such action or proceeding. Our undertaking to indemnify and hold harmless shall not apply if the infringement or violation of rights is due to any modification or alteration of the Technical Elements that was not provided to you by us, by your use of a non-current copy or by combination of a Technical Element or portion thereof with an element owned by any third party that is not specifically authorized by us. Our undertaking to defend, indemnify and hold harmless shall be limited to the extent that any delay by you in giving notice to us adversely affects our defense of, or ability to settle, such claim. If any Technical Element or portion thereof is, in our opinion, likely to be or becomes the subject of a claim of infringement of any patent, copyright, trade secret or proprietary rights of any third party, we may at our option and expense, procure for you the right to continue using that portion affected, modify it to become non-infringing (so long as the Technical Element, as modified, has functionality substantially equivalent to that provided at the time of such modification) or substitute a Technical Element of functionality substantially equivalent to that provided at the time of such substitution; if we are reasonably unable to modify, substitute or procure the right to continue using the subject Technical Element, we may require that you remove the Technical Element, and you shall promptly return or destroy all copies of such Technical Element and receive a pro-rata refund of the fee paid therefore, less accumulated depreciation calculated on a straight-line method over a useful life of four years from the Effective Date. You agree, as a material term of this Agreement, that your rights and remedies for any breach of any representation or warranty by us herein shall be as provided in this Agreement as your exclusive remedy and that we shall have no liability to you or others except as provided herein.

8. Limitation of Liability.

TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE LAW, AND EXCEPT FOR A BREACH OF PERSONAL INFORMATION OR PROTECTED HEALTH INFORMATION, NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE FOR ANY SPECIAL, INDIRECT, PUNITIVE OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OF THE OTHER PARTY OR ANY THIRD PARTY, OR FOR LOSS OF BUSINESS, PROFITS, BUSINESS INTERRUPTION, OR LOSS OF DATA, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER SUCH PARTY RECEIVES NOTICE OF THE POTENTIAL FOR SUCH DAMAGES. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THIS AGREEMENT, AS WELL AS ANY BUSINESS ASSOCIATE AGREEMENT ENTERED INTO BETWEEN THE PARTIES, AND EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY SET FORTH IN ANY APPLICABLE SOW ENTERED INTO PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT, IN NO EVENT (OTHER THAN A PARTY'S GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT) SHALL EITHER PARTY'S AGGREGATE LIABILITY FOR ANY CLAIMS, ACTIONS, FEES, COSTS, MITIGATION-RELATED OR OTHER EXPENSES, PENALTIES OR SIMILAR AMOUNTS RELATING TO OR ARISING OUT OF ANY BREACH OF PERSONAL INFORMATION OR PROTECTED HEALTH INFORMATION, EXCEPT FOR CIVIL MONETARY PENALTIES IMPOSED BY ANY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY) REGARDLESS OF THE FORM OF ACTION (INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, CONTRACT, TORT, PRODUCTS LIABILITY, STRICT LIABILITY, COMPLIANCE REVIEW OR SIMILAR INQUIRY), EXCEED ONE MILLION DOLLARS. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE TERMS "BREACH," "PERSONAL INFORMATION," AND "PROTECTED HEALTH INFORMATION" (OR ANY SIMILAR TERMS UNDER APPLICABLE LAW) SHALL HAVE THE SAME MEANINGS AS UNDER THE APPLICABLE FEDERAL OR STATE BREACH NOTIFICATION STATUTE(S) OR REGULATION(S). THIS AGREEMENT ALLOCATES RISKS BETWEEN THE PARTIES AND OUR PRICING REFLECTS THIS ALLOCATION OF RISK AND THE LIMITATION OF LIABILITY SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION.

Insurance.

During the term of this agreement, Winston agrees to maintain, at its own expense, the following minimum insurance coverage and limits:

- a) Worker's Compensation insurance as required by law and employer's liability insurance.
- b) Commercial General Liability Insurance, including Products, Completed Operations Liability and Personal Injury, Blanket Contractual Liability and Broad Form Property Damage Liability coverage for damages to any property or person with limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for each occurrence and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate.
- c) Errors and Omissions Liability Insurance covering the liability for financial loss due to error, omission, negligence of employees and machine malfunction with a limit of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for each occurrence and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate.
- d) Cyber Liability Policy covering liability and/or damages due to theft or loss of Customer Data with limits of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for each occurrence and aggregate.

If requested, Winston shall provide to Customer insurance certificates showing compliance with this paragraph.

10. Dispute Resolution & Escalation Policy.

The parties shall make a good faith effort to resolve, without resort to arbitration or litigation, any dispute arising under or related to this Agreement. If the parties do not agree upon a resolution of the dispute, any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement (except as provided below with respect to Sections 5, 10 and 11) between Customer and us, or the breach thereof, shall be subject to non-binding arbitration prior to the filing of a complaint in a court of law; provided, however, that such arbitration shall be final and binding and may be enforced in any court with the requisite jurisdiction if the parties agree in advance, in writing, that such arbitration shall have final, binding effect. All arbitration, whether binding or non-binding, shall be conducted in accordance with the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association.

Notwithstanding the paragraph above, each party acknowledges that violation by it of any provision of Section 5, 10 and 11 of this Agreement may cause irreparable damage to the other party for which any remedy at law would be inadequate and that the affected party shall be entitled either in any court of law or equity or in any arbitration proceeding, whichever forum is selected by the affected party, to (i) temporary, preliminary, permanent, and other injunctive relief against any breach of the provisions contained in such sections and (ii) such damages as may be awarded.

11. Confidential Information

Each party acknowledges that it and its officers, employees, independent contractors, agents or subcontractors may, in the course of the Agreement, be exposed to or acquire information that is proprietary or confidential to the other party.

<u>Definition</u>. "Confidential Information" shall include: any information relating to a party's research, development, trade secrets, processes, procedures, formulas, business practices, business plans, strategies, budgets, customer and vendor relationships, financial information and other similar business information of a confidential nature. The term "Confidential Information" shall not include information that is (a) known to the receiving party prior to disclosure by the disclosing party or its personnel; (b) publicly available through no act or omission of the receiving party; or (c) lawfully received by the receiving party from a third party (other than the disclosing party's former or current personnel) that is not under any confidentiality obligation to the disclosing party.

Use. Each party agrees to use Confidential Information received from the other party pursuant this Agreement solely in connection with the performance of such party's obligations under this Agreement. Each party agrees to use industry standard security tools to protect its own confidential and proprietary information and/or to protect the Confidential Information of the other party from disclosure to any third party. Unless authorized to do so in writing by the other party, neither party, nor any third party acting on either's behalf, will for any reason use or disclose to any person any of the other party's Confidential Information. The term "person" as used in this Section shall be interpreted to include, without limitation, any individual, partnership, corporation or other entity. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as granting any rights to the receiving party, by license or otherwise, to any of the disclosing party's Confidential Information, except as expressly stated in this Agreement. In the event that a party is required to disclose Confidential Information to a court or governmental agency or pursuant to any other applicable law, such party shall, to the extent practicable prior to such disclosure, and as soon as practicable and by the best available means, notify the other party to allow it an adequate opportunity to object to the disclosure order or to take other actions to preserve the confidentiality of the information. Prior to any disclosure pursuant to this Section, a party required to disclose Confidential Information shall cooperate with the party claiming confidentiality of the information in such party's reasonable efforts to limit the disclosure by means of a protective order or a request for confidential treatment.

HIPAA. We acknowledges that, in the course of performing Services, we may receive certain confidential health information protected under state or federal law, including but not limited to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("Health Information"). We will not disclose or use Health Information except as required in furtherance of our obligations under this Agreement and will use measures no less stringent than those we use to protect our own confidential and proprietary information, which measures shall be no less than reasonable care, and we shall protect all Health Information in compliance with applicable laws. In the event of any unauthorized use or disclosure or loss of any Health Information, we shall notify Customer and take such actions as may be necessary or reasonably requested by Customer to minimize the violation or the damage resulting there from. Our joint responsibilities as it pertains to protected information is detailed in our Business Associate Agreement.

Notification Protocol The parties to this Agreement agree the services may require access to personal information or protected health information of Participants. The handling of such information shall be subject to the terms of the Business Associate Agreement ("BAA") attached hereto as Appendix A and the notification protocol to covered entities of potential data breach or mishandling is covered by the BAA document (see OBLIGATIONS AND ACTIVITIES OF BUSINESS ASSOCIATE, SECTION C)

12. Employee Non-Solicitation.

Except with the prior written consent of the other party, both parties to this Agreement agree that, during the term of this Agreement and for a period of twenty-four (24) months thereafter, they shall not directly solicit, divert or recruit any employee of the other, who is or was an employee of that party at any time during the Term, to leave such employment.

13. Cooperation.

You shall coordinate and manage your employees, contractors or agents to facilitate the performance of any SOW by us. You shall be responsible for, and we may rely upon, the accuracy, timeliness and completeness of all data, reports and other information you supply us. You agree that prompt review and acceptance of any part of the SOW requiring acceptance is required to ensure compliance with any milestones or other specified deadlines. Any commitments we make in this Agreement or any SOW are contingent upon you meeting your obligations, as defined here. You will make your management and technical personnel who will work with us and will perform those activities described as your responsibility in the SOW reasonably available to us. Each party will designate and maintain during the term of the Agreement a point of contact, and will notify the other party of the name of such point of contact who will have the authority and power to make decisions with respect to actions to be taken in connection with the Agreement and all documentation included in a SOW. We agree to treat this information with confidentiality as provided in this Agreement and to only use this information as required to provide the Services. You shall obtain all governmental approvals, licenses, and permits necessary, if any, for completion of any SOW. If required by an SOW, you shall prepare any installation site in accordance with our instructions ensuring that any equipment that interfaces with your computer system operates in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. If you fail to make any preparations required by an SOW, and this failure causes us to incur costs during our service implementation, you agree to reimburse us for those costs.

14. General Provisions.

Severability & Waiver. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement. In the event that any provision is determined to be invalid, unenforceable or otherwise illegal, such provision shall be deemed restated, in accordance with applicable law, to reflect as nearly as possible the original intentions of the parties, and the remainder of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. No term or condition of this Agreement shall be deemed waived, and no breach shall be deemed excused, unless such waiver or excuse is in writing and is executed by the party from whom such waiver or excuse is claimed. No such waiver shall be deemed a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach or right in the same or in any other provision hereof.

Headings and References. Section numbers and headings are used for convenience and are not to be construed as limitations of the substance of any provision. The words "you", "your" and "Customer" mean the Customer indicated above, and the words "we", "us", "our" and "Winston" refer to Winston Financial Services, Inc. and its affiliates.

Mediation: The parties agree to use mediation for dispute resolution prior to and formal legal action being taken on this Contract.

Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas without regard for its conflicts of law provisions. Each party irrevocably agrees that any legal action, suit or proceeding brought by it in any

way arising out of this Agreement must be brought solely and exclusively in state or federal courts located in the State of Texas, and each party irrevocably submits to the sole and exclusive jurisdiction of these courts in person, generally and unconditionally with respect to any action, suit or proceeding brought by it or against it by the other party. Venue for state court actions shall be Williamson County, Texas, and venue for Federal Court actions shall be the Austin Division of the Central District of Texas.

Force Majeure. With the exception of a party's obligation to make payments properly due to the other party, neither party shall be deemed in default or otherwise liable under this Agreement for any cessation, interruption or delay in the performance of its obligations hereunder due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including, but not limited to, natural disaster, act of God, labor controversy, civil disturbance, disruption of the public markets, war or armed conflict, or the inability to obtain sufficient materials or services required in the conduct of its business, including Internet access, or any change in or the adoption of any law, judgment or decree.

Assignment. Neither this Agreement nor any right or obligation arising hereunder may be assigned (voluntarily, by operation of law, or otherwise), in whole or in part, by either party without the prior written consent of the other party, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld; provided, however, that either party shall have the right, upon written notice to the other party, to assign this Agreement to any person or entity that acquires all or substantially all of such party's business or assets. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the parties and their respective successors and permitted assigns.

Entire Agreement & Amendment. This Master Services Agreement ("MSA") and the one or more attached Appendices and Statements of Services (each an "SOW"), along with Williamson County 15RFP123 ("Hosted Solution Service - Web Based Benefit Enrollment System" and the Winston Response dated October 20, 2015, each fully incorporated herein, together comprise the contract documents and the complete agreement between the parties ("Agreement") regarding those Services to be provided hereunder. From time to time, additional terms governing the Services to be provided under this Agreement may be contained in a subsequent SOW, and each such SOW shall become part of this Agreement when signed on behalf of Winston and Customer effective as of the date set forth in the SOW. If there is a conflict between the terms of this MSA and any SOW, the terms of the SOW shall prevail.

This Agreement states the entire understanding of the parties relating to the subject matter thereto and supersedes all prior discussions and negotiations and may only be modified in a writing signed by both parties. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same Agreement. The parties may deliver signed copies of this Agreement via facsimile or as a PDF via email, and such copies shall be deemed originals. Communication by electronic mail shall not be construed as an effective amendment to the Agreement unless accompanied by a manually signed attachment.

Notice. All notices provided for herein shall be sent by confirmed facsimile, or guaranteed overnight mail, with tracing capability, or by first class United States mail, with postage prepaid, addressed to the other party at their respective addresses set forth below or such other addresses as either party may designate in writing to the other from time to time for such purposes. All notices provided for herein shall be deemed given or made when received.

APPENDIX A: Business Associate Agreement

Effective: January 5, 2016

BUSINESS ASSOCIATE AGREEMENT (the "BAA") is entered into by and between all benefit plans sponsored by Williamson County (referred to collectively as "Covered Entity"), and Winston Financial Services, Inc. ("Business Associate").

DEFINITIONS

Except as otherwise provided herein, the terms used in this BAA shall have the same meaning as those terms in the Electronic Transaction, Security or Privacy Rule, as the case may be.

Specific definitions:

- (a) Electronic Transaction Rule means the standards for processing Standard Transactions and Code Sets at 45 CFR Parts 160 and 162.
- (b) *Individual* has the same meaning as the term "individual" in 45 CFR §160.103 and shall include a person who qualifies as a personal representative in accordance with 45 CFR §164.502(g).
- (c) Personal Information means any data in whatever format that is subject to federal or state laws requiring the safeguarding of, and regulating and restricting access, collection, use, disclosure, processing, destruction, and free movement of individually identifiable personal information.
- (d) *Privacy Rule* means the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information at 45 CFR Part 160-164.
- (e) *Protected Health Information* has the same meaning as the term "protected health information" in 45 CFR §160.103, including electronic protected health information, but limited to the information created or received by Business Associate from or on behalf of Covered Entity.
 - (f) Secretary means the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services or his designee.
- (g) Security Rule means the Security Standards for the Protection of Electronic Protected Health Information at 45 CFR Parts 160-164.

OBLIGATIONS AND ACTIVITIES OF BUSINESS ASSOCIATE

- (a) Business Associate agrees to not Use or Disclose Protected Health Information other than as permitted or required by this BAA or as Required by Law.
- (b) Business Associate agrees to use appropriate safeguards to prevent the Use or Disclosure of Protected Health Information other than as provided for by this BAA. In addition, Business Associate agrees to Implement Administrative, Physical and Technical safeguards consistent with the requirements of the Security Rule that reasonably and appropriately protect the Confidentiality, Integrity and Availability of Electronic Protected Health Information that it creates, receives, maintains or transmits on behalf of Covered Entity. Effective February 17, 2010, and subject to regulatory or other guidance issued pursuant or in response to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), Business Associate will comply with the Privacy Rule and the Security Rule to the extent required under ARRA which are incorporated herein by reference, including but not limited to 45 CFR §§ 164.308, 164.310, 164.312, and 164.316.
- (c) Business Associate agrees to report to Covered Entity and/or Plan Sponsor (i) any Use or Disclosure of Protected Health Information not provided for by this BAA, (ii) any Security Incident, (iii) any Breach of Unsecured Protected Health Information, or (iv) to the extent required under any state breach notification statute, any unauthorized acquisition or access to Personal Information, as soon as possible, but not later than 30 calendar days following the date it becomes aware of such Use or Disclosure, Security Incident, Breach or unauthorized acquisition or access; provided, however, that to avoid unnecessary burden on either party, Business Associate shall report to Covered Entity any Unsuccessful Security Incidents of which it becomes aware of only upon request of Covered Entity. The frequency, content and the format of the report of Unsuccessful Security Incidents shall be

mutually agreed upon by the parties. If the definition of "Security Incident" under the Privacy and Security Laws is amended to remove the requirement for reporting "unsuccessful" attempts to use, disclose, modify or destroy electronic PHI, then this Section shall be amended so that the provisions relating to "Unsuccessful Security Incidents" no longer apply as of the effective date of such change to the law. For the purposes of this BAA, "Unsuccessful Security Incidents" mean Security Incidents that do not result in unauthorized access, use, disclosure, modification or destruction of electronic PHI.

- (d) Business Associate agrees to ensure that any agent, including a subcontractor, to whom it provides Protected Health Information received from, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of, Covered Entity, agrees to the same restrictions and conditions that apply through this BAA to Business Associate with respect to such information.
- (e) Business Associate agrees to provide access, at the request of Covered Entity and in a reasonable time and manner, to Protected Health Information in a Designated Record Set, to Covered Entity or, as directed by Covered Entity, to an Individual in order to enable Covered Entity to meet the requirements under 45 CFR §164.524.
- (f) Business Associate agrees to make any amendment(s) to Protected Health Information in a Designated Record Set that the Covered Entity directs or agrees to pursuant to 45 CFR §164.526 at the request of Covered Entity or an Individual, and in a reasonable the time and manner as required under the Privacy Rule.
- (g) Business Associate agrees to make internal practices, books, and records, including policies and procedures and Protected Health Information, relating to the Use and Disclosure of Protected Health Information received from, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of, Covered Entity available to the Secretary, in a reasonable time and manner or as designated by the Secretary, for purposes of determining Covered Entity's compliance with the Privacy Rule.
- (h) Business Associate agrees to document such Disclosures of Protected Health Information and Information related to such Disclosures as would be required for Covered Entity to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of Disclosures of Protected Health Information in accordance with 45 CFR §164.528.
- (i) Business Associate agrees to provide to Covered Entity or an Individual, in a reasonable time and manner, information collected in accordance with the preceding paragraph (i), to permit Covered Entity to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of Disclosures of Protected Health Information in accordance with 45 CFR §164.528.
- (j) Business Associate agrees to mitigate to the extent practicable any harmful effect known to Business Associate of any Security Incident, or Breach of Unsecured Protected Health Information.
- (k) If Business Associate conducts any Standard Transaction for or on behalf of Covered Entity, Business Associate shall comply with the requirements under the Electronic Transaction Rule.
- (I) To the extent Business Associate creates or receives Personal Information from Covered Entity or Plan Sponsor, or on behalf Covered Entity or Plan Sponsor it shall collect, maintain, process, handle, use, disclose and destroy all Personal Information in compliance with all applicable data privacy and protection laws.
- (m) Solely to the extent any Breach of Unsecured Protected Health Information or unauthorized acquisition or access to Personal Information is attributable to a breach of the obligations under this BAA by Business Associate, Business Associate shall bear the reasonable costs incurred by Covered Entity and Plan Sponsor to the extent it is necessary for Covered Entity and Plan Sponsor to comply with its legal obligations relating to such breach under the applicable breach notification statute or regulation, which shall be limited to the following costs reasonably incurred by Covered Entity and Plan Sponsor in responding to such breach: (1) the reasonable cost of preparing and distributing notifications to affected individuals, (2) the reasonable cost of providing notice to government agencies, credit bureaus, and/or other required entities, (3) to the extent required by the applicable statute, the reasonable cost of providing affected individuals with credit monitoring services for a specific period not to exceed twelve (12) months, and (4) the reasonable cost of any other measures required under applicable law.
- (n) To the extent Business Associate receives, stores, processes or otherwise deals with any patient records from the Covered Entity or Plan Sponsor that are entitled to protection under the federal regulations issued at 42 CFR Part 2, Business Associate agrees to be bound by those regulations. In addition, if necessary, Business

Associate will resist in judicial proceedings any efforts to obtain access to such patient records except as permitted by 42 CFR Part 2.

- (o) Except for payments from Covered Entity for services performed pursuant to this BAA and the Agreement, Business Associate may not directly or indirectly receive remuneration in exchange for PHI.
- (p) Business Associate may not use or disclose Protected Health Information for research or marketing purposes without first receiving prior written approval from the Covered Entity and obtaining the necessary authorization from the affected individuals.

PERMITTED USES AND DISCLOSURES BY BUSINESS ASSOCIATE

General Use and Disclosure Provisions

Except as otherwise limited in this BAA, Business Associate may Use or Disclose Protected Health Information to perform functions, activities, or services for, or on behalf of, Covered Entity as specified in the Agreement, provided that such Use or Disclosure would not violate (i) the Privacy Rule if done by Covered Entity or (II) the minimum necessary policies and procedures of the Covered Entity supplied to Business Associate.

Specific Use and Disclosure Provisions

- (a) Except as otherwise limited in this BAA, Business Associate may Use Protected Health Information for the proper management and administration of the Business Associate or to carry out the legal responsibilities of the Business Associate.
- (b) Except as otherwise limited in this BAA, Business Associate may Disclose Protected Health Information for the proper management and administration of the Business Associate, provided that (i) Disclosures are Required by Law, or (ii)(A) Business Associate obtains reasonable assurances from the person to whom the information is Disclosed that it will remain confidential and Used or further Disclosed only as Required by Law or for the purpose for which it was Disclosed to the person, and (ii)(B) the person notifies the Business Associate of any instances of which it is aware in which the confidentiality of the information has been breached.
- (c) Except as otherwise limited in this BAA, Business Associate may Use Protected Health Information to provide Data Aggregation services to Covered Entity as permitted by 45 CFR §164.504(e)(2)(i)(B).
- (d) Business Associate may Use Protected Health Information to report violations of law to appropriate Federal and State authorities, consistent with §164.502(j)(1).

OBLIGATIONS OF COVERED ENTITY

Provisions for Covered Entity to Inform Business Associate of Privacy Practices and Restrictions

- (a) Covered Entity shall notify Business Associate of any limitation(s) in its notice of privacy practices of Covered Entity in accordance with 45 CFR §164.520, to the extent that such limitation may affect Business Associate's Use or Disclosure of Protected Health Information.
- (b) Covered Entity shall notify Business Associate of any changes in, or revocation of, permission by an Individual to Use or Disclose Protected Health Information, to the extent that such changes may affect Business Associate's Use or Disclosure of Protected Health Information.
- (c) Covered Entity shall notify Business Associate of any restriction to the Use or Disclosure of Protected Health Information that Covered Entity has agreed to In accordance with 45 CFR §164.522, to the extent that such restriction may affect Business Associate's Use or Disclosure of Protected Health Information.

Requests by Covered Entity

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this BAA, Covered Entity shall not request Business Associate to Use or Disclose Protected Health Information in any manner that would not be permissible under the Privacy Rule if done by Covered Entity.

TERM AND TERMINATION

- (a) Term. The term of this BAA shall be effective as of January 5, 2016 and shall terminate when all of the Protected Health Information provided by Covered Entity to Business Associate, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity, is destroyed or returned to Covered Entity, or, if it is infeasible to return or destroy Protected Health Information as determined by Business Associate, protections are extended to such information, in accordance with the termination provisions in this Section, subject to any record retention requirements under the BAA or required by law.
- (b) Termination for Cause. Upon either party's knowledge of a breach by the other party, the non-breaching party shall either:
 - (1) Provide an opportunity for breaching party to cure the breach or end the violation and terminate this BAA and the Agreement, if any, if the breaching party does not cure the breach or end the violation within a reasonable time specified by the non-breaching party;
 - (2) Immediately terminate this BAA and the Agreement, if any, if the breaching party has breached a material term of this BAA and, in the non-breaching party's sole discretion, cure is not possible; or
 - (3) If, in the non-breaching party's sole discretion, neither termination nor cure is feasible, the non-breaching party will report the violation to the Secretary.
 - (c) Effect of Termination.
 - (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this Section, upon termination of this BAA, for any reason, Business Associate shall return or destroy all Protected Health Information received from Covered Entity, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity. This provision shall apply to Protected Health Information that is in the possession of subcontractors or agents of Business Associate. Business Associate shall retain no copies of the Protected Health Information.
 - (2) In the event that Business Associate determines that returning or destroying the Protected Health Information is infeasible, Business Associate shall provide to Covered Entity notification of the conditions that make return or destruction infeasible. Upon such determination that return or destruction of Protected Health Information is infeasible, Business Associate shall extend the protections and obligations of this BAA to such Protected Health Information and limit further Uses and Disclosures of such Protected Health Information to those purposes that make the return or destruction infeasible, for so long as Business Associate maintains such Protected Health Information.

MISCELLANEOUS

- (a) Regulatory References. A reference in this BAA to a section in the Electronic Transaction, Privacy or Security Rule means the section as in effect or as amended.
- (b) Amendment. In the event that additional standards are promulgated under the Administrative Simplification Section of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, or any existing standards are amended, including without limitation the Privacy Standards, Security Standards, and the Transactions and Code Sets Standards, such as under the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act, enacted under ARRA, the parties agree to take such action as is necessary to amend this BAA from time to time as is necessary for Covered Entity to comply with the requirements of the Electronic Transaction, Privacy or Security Rule, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. 104-191, or any applicable state law, as amended. Except as herein otherwise provided, no amendment or modification of, or supplement to, this BAA shall be binding unless duly executed in writing by each of the parties hereto.
- (c) Survival. The respective rights and obligations of Business Associate under the Section of this BAA entitled "Effect of Termination" shall survive the termination of this BAA.
- (d) *Interpretation*. Any ambiguity in this BAA shall be resolved to permit Covered Entity to comply with the Electronic Transaction, Privacy or Security Rule.
 - (e) Counterparts. This BAA may be signed in counterparts, which together will constitute one agreement.

- (f) Successors and Assigns. This BAA and each party's obligations hereunder will be binding on the representatives, assigns, and successors of such party and will inure to the benefit of the assigns and successors of such party; provided, however, that any such assignment shall not be effective absent the consent of the non-assigning party which shall not unreasonably withheld or delayed.
- (g) No Third Party Beneficiaries. Nothing express or implied in this BAA is intended to confer, nor shall anything herein confer, upon any person other than parties and their respective successors or assigns, any rights, remedies or obligations whatsoever.
- (h) Governing Law. This BAA will be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, without regard to principles of conflicts of law. Each party irrevocably agrees that any legal action, suit or proceeding brought by it in any way arising out of this BAA must be brought solely and exclusively in state or federal courts located in the State of New York, and each party irrevocably submits to the sole and exclusive jurisdiction of these courts in person am, generally and unconditionally with respect to any action, suit or proceeding brought by it or against it by the other party.
- (k) Entire Agreement. This BAA sets forth the full and complete understanding of the parties hereto with regard to its subject matter.
- (I) Waiver. The failure of the Covered Entity or Business Associate to object or to take affirmative action with respect to any conduct of the other which is in violation of this BAA shall not be construed as a waiver of that violation or any prior or future violations of this BAA.
- (m) *Headings*. The sections and subsections headings used herein are for reference and convenience only, and shall not enter into the interpretation thereof.
- (n) *Notices*. Any notice which is to be given by one party to the other under this BAA will be given in writing and delivered in accordance with the addresses specified in the Agreement.

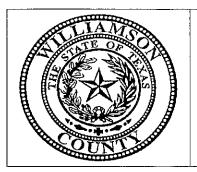

AGREEMENT BETWEEN WILLIAMSON COUNTY AND BUTLER FAMILY PARTNERSHIP, LTD.

I. PARTIES

This document constitutes an agreement ("Agreement") between Williamson County ("County") and the Butler Family Partnership, Ltd. ("BFP") relating to the Williamson County Sheriff's Office's use of BFP's real property, as more fully described herein below.

II. PURPOSE

BFP owns an unoccupied building located on the real property at 17580 W. Hwy. 29, Liberty Hill, TX 78642 (hereinafter referred to as the "Property").

The Williamson County Sheriff's Office ("WCSO") wants to use the Property in conjunction with law enforcement training exercises; and the BFP hereby agrees to permit County to use the Property for said limited purpose. County may, at its own expense and upon consent of BFP, install temporary improvements and/or lighting as necessary on the Property. All improvements situated on the Property shall be immediately removed following the termination of this Agreement. Any property that is left on the Property following the termination of this agreement will be deemed abandoned property and County hereby grants BFP the right to remove it and dispose of it, at County's sole cost and expense, as the BFP deems fit. County agrees to maintain the Property and keep it clean and free of debris and/or trash at all times during and after its use of the Property. County agrees to restore the Property to the condition in which the same was found before County used such area.

The BFP reserves the right to use the Property for its own purposes and the County hereby agrees to allow the BFP to use the Property for such purposes.

III. LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION

COUNTY, IN USING THE PROPERTY DOES SO AT ITS OWN RISK. BFP SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGES TO PROPERTY OR DAMAGES ARISING FROM PERSONAL INJURIES SUSTAINED BY COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES, IN, ON OR ABOUT THE PROPERTY, OR OF ANY OTHER PORTION OF THE PROPERTY, INCLUDING BUILDINGS, PARKING AREA WALKWAYS OF THE PROPERTY, UNLESS SUCH DAMAGE OR INJURY IS CAUSED BY THE BFP'S NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT. COUNTY ASSUMES FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY PROPERTY DAMAGE OR INJURY WHICH MAY OCCUR TO COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES IN, ON OR ABOUT THE PROPERTY OR OTHER PORTION OF THE PROPERTY, UNLESS SUCH DAMAGE OR INJURY IS CAUSED BY THE BFP'S NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT.

COUNTY SHALL CONDUCT ITS ACTIVITIES UPON THE PROPERTY SO AS NOT TO ENDANGER ANY PERSON THEREON. IN CONSIDERATION OF BFP'S AGREEMENT TO ALLOW COUNTY TO USE THE PROPERTY, COUNTY AGREES, TO THE EXTENT

AUTHORIZED BY LAW, TO HOLD HARMLESS BFP AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES ("BFP PERSONS") FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, LOSSES, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, FINES, PENALTIES, COSTS AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ATTORNEYS' FEES AND LITIGATION EXPENSES) TO WHICH ANY OF THE BFP PERSONS MAY BECOME SUBJECT BY REASON OF, OR IN ANY WAY RELATED TO, (A) THE USE OF THE PROPERTY BY COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES, (B) BREACHES OF APPLICABLE CODES, LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS BY THE COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES, OR (C) ANY ACTION, OMISSION OR NEGLIGENCE, WHETHER IN WHOLE OR IN PART, OF THE COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES. THE BFP PERSONS SHALL NOT BE LIABLE OR RESPONSIBLE FOR, AND THE COUNTY HEREBY RELEASES AND FOREVER DISCHARGES, TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED BY LAW, THE BFP PERSONS FROM, ANY LOSS, DAMAGE OR INJURY TO ANY PERSON OR PROPERTY OF COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES IN, ON OR AROUND THE PROPERTY OR OTHER PORTION OF THE PROPERTY RESULTING FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER. IN NO EVENT SHALL ANY BFP PERSONS BE LIABLE TO COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, SPECIAL, EXEMPLARY OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES SUFFERED OR INCURRED BY COUNTY AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES AS A RESULT OF THE ACTIONS OR OMISSIONS OF ANY BFP PERSONS.

County shall be responsible for initiating, maintaining and supervising all safety precautions and programs in connection with the WCSO's use of the Property. County shall take all reasonable precautions for the safety of and shall provide all reasonable protection to prevent damage, injury or loss to County and/or its respective officials, officers, agents, employees and representatives, all other persons in, on or around the Property and all property in, on or around the Property, including trees, shrubs, lawns, walks, pavements, roadways, structures and utilities.

The County agrees to engage TFE to assist in providing certain operational services pursuant to the following terms, conditions, and restrictions:

I.

Pursuant to the Laws and Rules of the State of Texas, the Texas Health & Safety Code, Chapter 711, Section 711.002(e), and the common law granting the County authority to regulate the public health and safety, the Commissioners Court of Williamson County finds that:

Sandra L. McDaniel (SSN xxx-xx-9867) passed away on June 26, 2021 at the age of 76 in Justice of the Peace, Pct. 2 of Williamson County, Texas while residing at: Cottonwood Creek Nursing and Rehabilitation, Cedar Park, Texas.

The Court finds that there has been investigation to obtain information regarding next of kin and the ability to pay for interment expenses. However, all attempts to contact any known next of kin of the deceased's family have failed to identify any responsive or known next of kin with the ability to pay for necessary expenses. In the facts presented in this case, the deceased's body has either become abandoned or those with the ability to pay are unable to do so.

The Court finds that this case involves either an abandoned body or is qualified on the facts of this case for indigent burial; therefore, the county has

discretion to cover the costs of interment.

The Court further finds that there has been no inquest ordered in this case, and there is no person with duty to inter as set forth in Chapter 711 of the Texas Health & Safety Code; therefore, the duty to inter the remains or falls to Williamson County at this time.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT the deceased body shall be interred (*i.e.*, permanent disposition of remains by cremation, entombment, burial, or placement in a niche).

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF Extension of DSRIP Program

WHEREAS, in December 2011, the United States Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approved a five-year healthcare funding program through the Medicaid 1115 Transformation Waiver (1115 Waiver) and extended it for an additional five-year period in December 2017; and

WHEREAS, that approved program included the Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) Program that used regional partnerships to enhance healthcare options for uninsured Texans and expand access to care for Williamson County residents; and

WHEREAS, Williamson County's most vulnerable residents have benefited immensely from the DSRIP Program through regional partnerships with local hospital systems, Williamson Counties and Cities Health District, Bluebonnet Trails Community Services and safety net providers, drawing down millions of dollars in federal funds since the Program's inception that were used to meet the health care needs of uninsured/under-insured by providing timely access to care; and

WHEREAS, in January 2021, CMS approved a ten-year \$100 billion extension to the 1115 Waiver transitioning the DSRIP Program to a new Public Health Provider Charity Care Pool and Directed Payment Program for Behavioral Health Services; and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2021, CMS rescinded the 1115 Waiver leaving the current waiver in effect until is expiration on September 30, 2022, while expiring the DSRIP Program on September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, if the DSRIP Program is not extended to September 30, 2022 or the DSRIP transition programs included within the now-rescinded 1115 Waiver are not approved, Williamson County will lose hundreds of thousands of dollars in health care and mental health support funding;

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Health and Human Services and CMS are encouraged to expeditiously approve an extension of the DSRIP Program through at least September 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Health and Human Services Commission is encouraged to quickly negotiate with CMS to extend the DSRIP Program to at least September 30, 2022 or seek an alternative structure that will allow the programs currently authorized by the DSRIP Program in Williamson County to continue unabated; and

WHEREAS, it is requested that the State of Texas and the Biden Administration work collaboratively for a speedy resolution to the DSRIP Program expiration, to allow Williamson County to continue to expand access to care for vulnerable residents; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Williamson County Commissioners Court supports an extension of the DSRIP program and encourages other Texas County Commissioners Courts, the Texas Association of Counties, the Conference of Urban Counties, and the County Judges, Sheriffs and Commissioners Associations to adopt resolutions and statements of support requesting an extension of this valuable program through at least September 30, 2022.

FOR

TEXAS VETERANS COMMISSION GRANT SERVICES

THIS SERVICES CONTRACT ("Contract") is made and entered into by and between Williamson County, Texas ("County"), a political subdivision of the State of Texas, acting herein by and through its governing body, and Veritas Well-Being, PLLC ("Service Provider"). The County agrees to engage Service Provider as an independent contractor, to assist in providing certain services pursuant to the following terms, conditions, and restrictions:

I.

No Agency Relationship & Indemnification: It is understood and agreed that Service Provider shall not in any sense be considered a partner or joint venturer with the County, nor shall Service Provider hold himself out as an agent or official representative of the County unless expressly authorized to do so by a majority of the Williamson County Commissioners Court. Service Provider shall be considered an independent contractor for the purpose of this Contract and shall in no manner incur any expense or liability on behalf of the County other than what may be expressly allowed under this Contract. The County will not be liable for any loss, cost, expense or damage, whether indirect, incidental, punitive, exemplary, consequential of any kind whatsoever for any acts by Service Provider or failure to act relating to the services being provided. Service Provider agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the County against any claim, demand, loss, injury, damages, action, or liability of any kind against the County resulting from any services Service Provider Perform on Behalf of the County.

II.

No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity or Powers: Nothing in this Contract will be deemed to constitute a waiver of sovereign immunity or powers of the County, the Williamson County Commissioners Court, or the Williamson County Judge.

III.

No Assignment: Service Provider may not assign this Contract.

IV.

<u>Compliance with All Laws</u>: Service Provider agrees and will comply with any and all local, state or federal requirements with respect to the services rendered.

V.

Consideration and Compensation: Service Provider will be compensated based on rates set out in the attached Exhibit "A", which is incorporated herein as if copied in full. The not-to-exceed amount under this Contract shall be \$30,000.00, unless amended by a change order and approved by the Williamson County Commissioners Court. Payment for goods and services shall be governed by Chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code. An invoice shall be deemed overdue the 31st day after the later of (1) the date the County receives the goods under the contract; (2) the date the performance of the service under the contract is completed; or (3) the date the Williamson County Auditor receives an invoice for the goods or services. Interest charges for any overdue payments shall be paid by the County in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 2251.025. More specifically, the rate of interest that shall accrue on a late payment is the rate in effect on September 1 of the County's fiscal year in which the payment becomes due. The said rate in effect on September 1 shall be equal to the sum of one percent (1%); and (2) the prime rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first day of July of the preceding fiscal year that does not fall on a Saturday or Sunday.

VI.

<u>Services</u>: Service Provider shall provide and perform the services set out in the Scope of Services attached hereto as **Exhibit** "A". At all times under this Contract, Service Provider shall be an independent contractor. Service Provider expressly acknowledges that he or she is not an employee of the County.

VII.

Good Faith Clause: Service Provider agrees to act in good faith in the performance of this Contract.

VIII.

<u>Confidentiality</u>: Service Provider expressly agrees that he or she will not use any incidental confidential information that may be obtained while working in a governmental setting for his or her own benefit, and agrees that he or she will not enter any unauthorized areas or access confidential information and he or she will not disclose any information to unauthorized third parties, and will take care to guard the security of the information at all times.

IX.

<u>Termination</u>: Either party may terminate this Contract for convenience and without cause or further liability upon ten (10) business day's written notice to the other party. In the event of termination, it is understood and agreed that only the amounts due to Service Provider for services

provided and incurred to and including the date of termination, will be due and payable. No penalty will be assessed for County's termination of this Contract for convenience.

X.

<u>Venue and Applicable Law:</u> Venue of this Contract shall be Williamson County, Texas, and the laws of the State of Texas shall govern all terms and conditions.

XI.

Effective Date and Term: This Contract shall be in full force and effect when signed by all parties and shall continue for a reasonable time period for the specific project and shall terminate upon project completion or when terminated pursuant to paragraph IX above.

XII.

<u>Severability</u>: In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Contract shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision in this Contract and this Contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in it.

XIII.

Right to Audit: Service Provider agrees that the County or its duly authorized representatives shall, until the expiration of three (3) years after final payment under this Contract, have access to and the right to examine and photocopy any and all books, documents, papers and records of Service Provider which are directly pertinent to the services to be performed under this Contract for the purposes of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions. Service Provider agrees that the County shall have access during normal working hours to all necessary Service Provider facilities and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space in order to conduct audits in compliance with the provisions of this section. The County shall give Service Provider reasonable advance notice of intended audits.

XIV.

<u>County Judge or Presiding Officer Authorized to Sign Contract</u>: The presiding officer of the County's governing body who is authorized to execute this instrument by order duly recorded may execute this Contract on behalf of the County.

XV.

<u>Entire Agreement:</u> This Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either oral or written. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by each party to this Agreement.

This Vehicle Reimbursement Agreement with Non-Governmental Organization Regarding Off-Duty Contracting of County Deputies (hereinafter, the "AGREEMENT") is entered into by and between the company/organization set forth on the signature page below (hereinafter, "NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION") in the State of Texas, and Williamson County, Texas (hereinafter, "COUNTY") a political subdivision of the State of Texas, and the Williamson County Law Enforcement Agency set forth on the signature page below (hereinafter, "LEA").

CONTRACTING OF COUNTY DEPUTIES

For and in consideration of the permission given by COUNTY for the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION to contract in a private capacity DEPUTIES of the LEA (hereinafter "DEPUTIES"), while DEPUTIES are not on duty with and for the COUNTY, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. It is mutually agreed that while the DEPUTIES are working for the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION, the DEPUTIES' primary responsibility is the enforcement of Federal and State laws and COUNTY Ordinances or Regulations to protect life and property and to keep the peace. The DEPUTIES are not allowed to enforce NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION policies or rules. DEPUTIES are at all times subject to the rules and policies of the LEA. NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION expressly acknowledges and agrees that such DEPUTIES are at all times independent contractors of the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION when contracted by the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION.
- 2. It is understood by the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION that the COUNTY shall retain the right to withdraw at any time its permission for the DEPUTIES to work in a private capacity (including the right to terminate this agreement at any time). If the permission of the COUNTY is withdrawn, the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION agrees to terminate its contracting relationships with DEPUTIES. The NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION, as part of this AGREEMENT, binds itself to release and hold harmless the COUNTY from any liability or claim for damages in the event such permission is withdrawn by the COUNTY.
- Prior to the beginning of DEPUTIES contracting with the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION, the NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION shall obtain a comprehensive general liability insurance policy

from a company authorized to do business in the State of Texas with minimum amounts of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) per occurrence for property damage, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) per person, and Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) per occurrence for personal injury. COUNTY SHALL BE NAMED AS AN ADDITIONAL INSURED UNDER THIS COVERAGE.

- 4. The term of this AGREEMENT shall begin on the 2021 and shall terminate on September 30, 2025 Any extension of this AGREEMENT must be set forth in writing and signed by both parties.
- 5. State law requires that law enforcement personnel conducting "off-duty" work must be both "full time" and "entitled" to fringe benefits. Tex. Occup. Code Sec. 1702.322(A) & (B)(i). Thus, part-time deputies and "reserve" officers may not conduct "off-duty" work.
- 6. The COUNTY agrees that each of the DEPUTIES will be properly insured with automobile liability insurance while operating the patrol vehicle in accordance with Section 612.005(b) of the Texas Government Code, and any other applicable laws.

Important Notice: County Purchase Orders and Contracts constitute expenditures of public funds, and all vendors are hereby placed on notice that any quotes, invoices or any other forms that seek to unilaterally impose contractual or quasicontractual terms are subject to the extent authorized by Texas law, including but not limited to Tex. Const. art. XI, § 7, the Texas Government Code, the Texas Local Government Code, the Texas Transportation Code, the Texas Health & Safety Code, and Opinions of the Texas Attorney General relevant to local governmental entities.

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between Williamson County, Texas (hereinafter "The County"), a political subdivision of the State of Texas, acting herein by and through its governing body, and J.T. Vaughn Construction, LLC (hereinafter "Service Provider"), with mailing address at 10355 Westpark Drive Houston, Texas 77042 (phone 713-243-8300). The County agrees to engage Service Provider as an independent contractor, to assist in providing certain operational services pursuant to the following terms, conditions, and restrictions:

I.

No Agency Relationship & Indemnification: It is understood and agreed that Service Provider shall not in any sense be considered a partner or joint venturer with The County, nor shall Service Provider hold himself out as an agent or official representative of The County unless expressly authorized to do so by a majority of the Williamson County Commissioners Court. Service Provider shall be considered an independent contractor for the purpose of this agreement and shall in no manner incur any expense or liability on behalf of The County other than what may be expressly allowed under this agreement. The County will not be liable for any loss, cost, expense or damage, whether indirect, incidental, punitive, exemplary, consequential of any kind whatsoever for any acts by Service Provider or failure to act relating to the services being provided. Service

Provider agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend The County against any claim, demand, loss, injury, damages, action, or liability of any kind against The County resulting from any services Service Provider perform on behalf of The County.

II.

Entire Contract & Incorporated Documents: This Contract constitutes the entire Contract between the parties and may not be modified or amended other than by a written instrument executed by both parties. Documents expressly incorporated (as if copied in full) into this Contract include the following:

- A. As described in the attached Statement of Work/Proposal, dated June 28, 2021 which is incorporated herein as if copied in full;
- B. Choice Partners Contract Number: 15/041JN-16; and
- C. Any required insurance certificates evidencing required coverages.

III.

No Assignment: Service Provider may <u>not</u> assign this contract.

IV.

<u>Compliance with All Laws</u>: Service Provider agrees and will comply with any and all local, state or federal requirements with respect to the services rendered.

V.

Consideration and Compensation: Service Provider will be compensated based on the attached Statement of Work/Quotation dated June 28, 2021 which is incorporated herein as if copied in full. The not-to-exceed amount under this agreement is \$168,350.00, unless amended by a change order and approved by the Williamson County Commissioners Court. Payment for goods and services shall be governed by Chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code. An invoice shall be deemed overdue the 31st day after the later of (1) the date The County receives the goods under the contract; (2) the date the performance of the service under the contract is completed; or (3) the date the Williamson County Auditor receives an invoice for the goods or services. Interest charges for any overdue payments shall be paid by The County in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 2251.025. More specifically, the rate of interest that shall accrue on a late payment is the rate in effect on September 1 of The County's fiscal year in which the payment becomes due. The said rate in effect on September 1 shall be equal

Some of the project challenges involved moving the Union Pacific mainline rail traffic to a shoofly detour. This allowed a new railroad bridge to be built on the mainline. Once the new railroad bridge was completed rail traffic was moved back onto the mainline and the shoofly detour was removed. Excavation then began under two existing bridges on Hwy 79. This was needed to extend the new Kenney Fort Blvd. under the highway and under the new rail bridge. The 24-month project was finished over two months ahead of schedule and was one of the largest road & bridge projects ever constructed by the City of Round Rock.

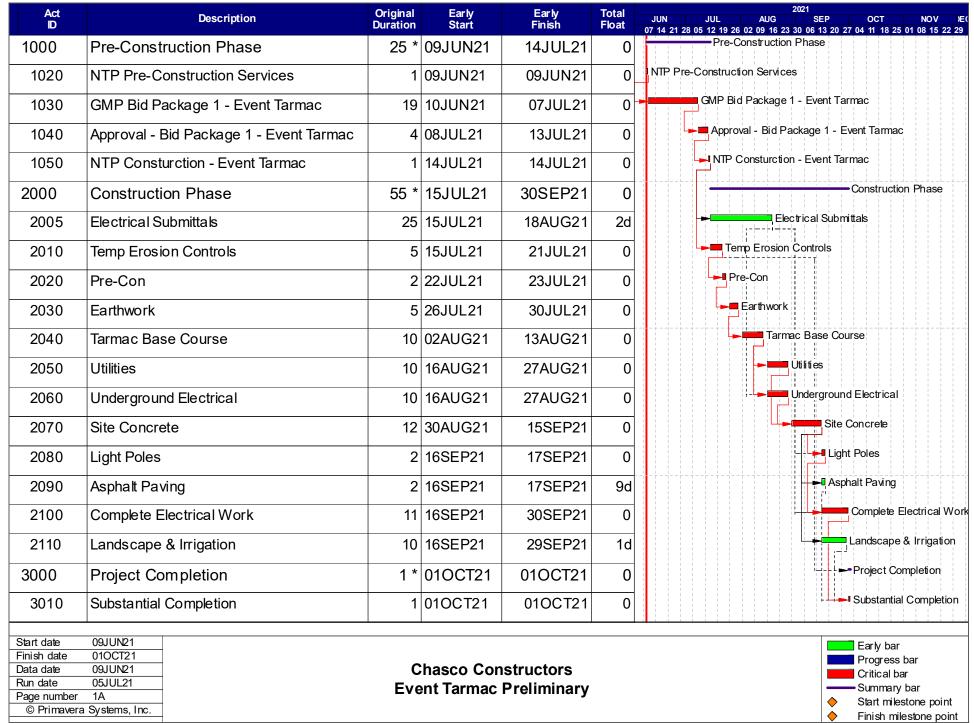

ARTICLE 1 SCOPE OF WORK: The Owner desires to retain Contractor to provide the construction services described herein. The Contractor shall have the overall responsibility for and shall provide complete construction services and furnish all materials, equipment, tools and labor as necessary or reasonably inferable to complete the following described construction services, or any phase of such services, in accordance with the Owner's requirements and the terms of this Agreement (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Work"):

ARTICLE 2 CONTRACT PRICE: Owner agrees to pay to the Contractor, for the satisfactory performance of the Work, the not-to-exceed amount ofOne million one hundred twenty three
thousand seven hundred eighty two and 03 cents (\$_1,123,782.03) in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
terms and conditions of this Agreement. ARTICLE 3 PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS: The Work shall be performed pursuant to and in

ARTICLE 4 SUBSTANTIAL AND FINAL COMPLETION:

4.1 Commencement of Work. Contractor shall commence the Work upon instruction to do so from the Owner and Construction shall be deemed to have commenced on the date of such instruction.

4.2 Substantial Completion. "Substantial Completion" means the stage in the progress of the Work when the Work, or designated portions thereof, may still require minor modifications or adjustments but, in the Owner's opinion, the Work has progressed to the point such that all parts of the Work under consideration are fully operational and usable for intended purposes, as evidenced by a Certificate of Substantial Completion approved by the Owner. If a Certificate of Occupancy is required by public authorities having jurisdiction over the Work, said certificate shall be issued before the Work or any portion thereof is considered substantially complete. When the Contractor considers that the Work, or a portion thereof which the Owner agrees to accept separately, is substantially complete, the Contractor shall notify Owner's Designated Representative (sometimes referred to as the "ODR") and request a determination as to whether the Work or designated portion thereof is substantially complete. If the ODR does not consider the Work substantially complete, the ODR will notify the Contractor giving reasons therefore. Failure on the Owner's part to list a reason does not alter the responsibility of the Contractor to complete all Work in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. After satisfactorily completing items identified by Owner's Designated Representative, the Contractor shall then submit another request for the ODR to determine Substantial Completion. If The ODR considers the Work substantially complete, The ODR will prepare and deliver a certificate of Substantial Completion which shall establish the date of Substantial Completion, shall include a punch list of items to be completed or corrected before final completion and final payment, shall establish the time within which the Contractor shall finish the punch list, and shall establish responsibilities of the Owner and the Contractor for security, maintenance, heat, utilities, damage to the Work, warranty and insurance. Failure to include an item on the punch list does not alter the responsibility of the Contractor to complete all Work in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The certificate of Substantial Completion shall be signed by the Owner and the Contractor to evidence acceptance of the responsibilities assigned to them in such certificate.

Substantial Completion (as defined in this agreement) for all stages of the Work shall be achieved on or before the following Substantial Completion date:

Under no circumstances will the time for Substantial Completion exceed this date without a written amendment to this Agreement. THE TIMES SET FORTH IN THE CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS ARE AN ESSENTIAL ELEMENT OF THE AGREEMENT. TIME LIMITS STATED IN THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS ARE OF THE ESSENCE OF THIS AGREEMENT.

- **4.3 Final Completion.** The Work shall be fully and finally completed **on or before** __TBD___; provided, however, Owner may extend said time period in the event bad weather affects the progress of the Work. Owner shall, at its sole discretion, determine when the Work has been fully and finally completed to its satisfaction.
- 4.4 Liquidated Damages. For each consecutive calendar day after the date of Substantial Completion that the Work is not Substantially Complete, the Owner may deduct the amount of ___Two Hundred dollars a day_(\$200/day)______ from any money due or that becomes due the Contractor, not as a penalty but as liquidated damages representing the parties' estimate at the time of contract execution of the damages that the Owner will sustain for late completion. The parties stipulate and agree that calculating Owner's actual damages for late completion of the Work would be impractical, unduly burdensome, and cause unnecessary delay and that the amount of daily liquidated damages set forth is reasonable.

ARTICLE 5 PAYMENT:

Contractor shall have a duty to submit to the ODR by the end of each month a statement showing the total value of the Work performed during such month. The statement shall also include the value of all sound materials delivered on the Work site and to be included in the Work and all partially completed Work, whether bid as a lump sum or a unit item, which in the opinion of the ODR is acceptable. The ODR shall examine and approve or modify and approve such statement. The Owner shall then pay the Contractor pursuant to Chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code ("Texas Prompt Payment Act"), as set forth in Article 11.1 of this Agreement, the total amount of the approved statement less all previous payments and all further sums that may by retained by the Owner under the terms of this Agreement or under the law. Statements are not considered "received" until reviewed by the ODR and an approved statement is submitted to the Williamson County Auditor's Office; therefore, Contractor must ensure timely delivery of statements for review and processing.

At any time following the completion of all Work, including all punch list items, cleanup, and the delivery of record documents, the Contractor shall submit a certified application for final payment, including all sums held as retainage if any, to the ODR for its review and approval. Contractor shall submit, prior to or with the application for final payment, final copies of all close out documents, including maintenance and operating instructions, guarantees and warranties, certificates, and all other items required by this Agreement. Contractor shall also submit consent of surety to final payment, an affidavit that all payrolls, bills for materials and equipment, subcontracted work and other indebtedness connected with the Work, except as specifically noted, have been paid or will be paid or otherwise satisfied within the period of time required by Chapter 2251, Texas Government Code. Contractor shall furnish documentation establishing payment or satisfaction of all such obligations, such as receipts, releases and waivers of claims arising out of the Agreement. Owner is entitled to rely upon this affidavit and the Contractor may not submit a claim on behalf of a subcontractor or vendor if that claim has not been noted as an exception in the affidavit.

Owner may deduct from the final payment all sums due from Contractor for any reason, Liquidated Damages and all other deductions authorized by this Agreement.

Final payment shall constitute a waiver of all claims by the Contractor except those specifically identified in writing and submitted to the ODR prior to the application for final payment. Provided, however, that the Work shall not be deemed fully performed by the Contractor and closed until the expiration of all warranty periods.

ARTICLE 6 CONTRACTOR'S GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND COVENANTS:

6.1 Contractor shall perform all services specifically allocated to it hereunder, as well as those services reasonably inferable and necessary for completion of the Work. The Contractor shall keep the Owner informed of the progress and quality of the Work. Contractor agrees and acknowledges that Owner is entering into this Agreement in reliance on Contractor's represented expertise and ability to provide the Work described in this Agreement. Contractor agrees to use its best efforts, skill, judgment, and abilities to perform its obligations in accordance with the highest standards used in the profession and to further the interests of Owner in accordance with Owner's requirements and procedures.

- 6.2 Contractor's duties as set forth herein shall at no time be in any way diminished by reason of any approval by the Owner nor shall the Contractor be released from any liability by reason of such approval by the Owner, it being understood that the Owner at all times is ultimately relying upon the Contractor's skill and knowledge in performing the services required hereunder.
- 6.3 Contractor is responsible for initiating, maintaining, and supervising all safety precautions and programs in connection with the Work. The safety program shall comply with all applicable requirements of the current federal Occupational Safety and Health Act and all other applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations.
- 6.4 Contractor shall be an independent contractor under this Agreement and shall assume all of the rights, obligations, liabilities, applicable to it as such independent contractor hereunder and any provisions in this agreement which may appear to give Owner the right to direct Contractor as to details of doing the Work herein covered or to exercise a measure of control over the Work shall be deemed to mean that Contractor shall follow the desires of Owner in the results of the Work only. Owner shall not retain or have the right to control the Contractor's means, methods or details pertaining to the Contractor's performance of the Work described herein, nor shall Owner have the power to direct the order in which Contractor's Work is performed under this agreement. Owner and Contractor hereby agree and declare that Contractor is an Independent Contractor and as such meets the qualifications of an Independent Contractor under Texas Worker's Compensation Act, Texas Labor Code, Section 406.141, that the Contractor is not an employee of Owner for purposes of this Agreement, and that the Contractor and its employees, agents and sub-subcontractors shall not be entitled to worker's compensation coverage or any other type of insurance coverage held by Owner.
- 6.5 As part of Contractor obligation to coordinate the Work, Contract shall:
 - a. cooperate with the ODR and endeavor to further the interests of the Owner and the Work;
 - b. provide an on-site, full-time superintendent for the duration of the Work;
 - c. visit the Work site and inspect the existing facilities, systems and conditions to insure an accurate understanding of the existing conditions as required;
 - d. at Owner's request, attend public meetings and hearings concerning the development of the Work:
 - e. review all drawings, specifications, and other plans as they are developed by the Owner and/or its architect and advise Owner of any error, inconsistency or omission discovered in the drawings, specifications, and other plans;
 - f. review the drawings, specifications, and other plans for compliance with all applicable laws and code requirements;
 - g. advise Owner of any tests that should be performed;
 - h. organize and maintain a competent, full-time staff at the Work site with clearly defined lines of authority and communication as necessary to coordinate construction activities, monitor and direct progress of the Work;
 - i. attend Owner's regularly scheduled Work progress meetings and fully advise the ODR of the Work status including schedule, costs, quality and changes;
 - j. assist Owner in obtaining building permits and obtain special permits for permanent improvements as required by law; and
 - k. shall coordinate, monitor and inspect the Work of subcontractors to ensure conformance with the drawings, specifications, other plans and with the terms of this Agreement.

- 6.6 Contractor shall identify every subcontractor it intends to use for the Work to the Owner in writing at least ten (10) days before entering into any subcontract. Contractor shall not use any subcontractor to which Owner has a reasonable objection. If Owner does not object to a particular subcontractor with said ten (10) days, such subcontract may be considered acceptable to Owner. Following Owner's acceptance of a subcontractor, that subcontractor shall not be changed without Owner's written consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 6.7 Contractor's designated representative, which is set forth below Contractor's signature herein below, shall be responsible for the day-to-day management of the Work on behalf of Contractor. The designated representative shall be the Owner's primary contact during the Work and shall be available as required for the benefit of the Work and the Owner. The contractor's designated representative shall be authorized to act on behalf of and bind the Contractor in all matters related to the Work including, but not limited to, execution of Change Orders.

6.8 NO ALTERATIONS OR CHANGES SHALL BE MADE, HOWEVER, EXCEPT UPON THE WRITTEN ORDER OF THE OWNER, OR THE ODR.

- 6.9 Contractor shall promptly correct any defective Work at Contractor's sole expense, unless the Owner specifically agrees, in writing, to accept the Work.
- 6.10 Contractor shall maintain and deliver the close out documents that describe changes or deviations from the original drawings, specifications and plans that occurred during construction and that reflect the actual "As Built" conditions of the completed Work.

COMMISSIONING AND WARRANTY RESPONSIBILITIES

- **6.11** Contractor shall provide commissioning, starting and check-out services for the systems installed as a part of the Work prior to completion and acceptance. Operation manuals and instructions will be provided to the Owner, the systems will be demonstrated and training provided to Williamson County's operators upon completion and prior to acceptance.
- 6.12 Contractor hereby warrants that the materials and equipment provided for the Work will be of good quality and new unless otherwise required or permitted by the Owner; that the construction will be free from faults and defects; and that the construction will conform with the requirements of the plans, specifications, drawings and the terms of this Agreement.
- 6.13 Contractor shall provide warranty services for the Work for a full 12 months (30 months for Work involving mechanical services, if any) following Final Completion and final payment. Just before the warranty period expires, Contractor shall attend an on-site meeting with the Owner to ensure that all warranty issues have been identified and properly remedied.

ARTICLE 7 OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

7.1 The Owner shall:

- a. provide the general schedule for the Work provided Owner is of the opinion such schedule is necessary. The general schedule will set forth the Owner's plan for milestone dates and completion of the Work;
- b. identify a person as its ODR who is authorized to act in the Owner's behalf with respect to the Work. The ODR shall examine the documents submitted by the Contractor and shall render decisions on behalf of the Owner to the extent allowed by Texas law;

- c. at Owner's cost, will secure the services of surveyors, soils engineers, existing facility surveys, testing and balancing, environmental surveys or other special consultants to develop such additional information as may be necessary for the design or construction of the Work;
- d. furnish required information and services and shall render approvals and decisions as expeditiously as is consistent with reasonable skill and care and the orderly progress of the Contractor's services and of the Work;
- e. shall have the right to reject any defective Work. Should Contractor refuse or neglect to correct any such Work within a reasonable time after notice, Owner may have the Work corrected and recover all expenses incurred from Contractor on demand; and
- f. Owner shall furnish to the Contractor a sufficient number of plans, drawings and specifications sets.

ARTICLE 8 INSURANCE AND INDEMNITY

- 8.1 Insurance. The Contractor shall carry insurance in the types and amounts indicated below for the duration of the Agreement, which shall include items owned by Owner in the care, custody and control of Contractor prior to and during construction. Contractor must also complete and file the declaration pages from the insurance policies with Owner whenever a previously identified policy period expires during the term of the Agreement, as proof of continuing coverage. Contractor shall update all expired policies prior to submission of any payment requests hereunder. Failure to update policies shall be reason for payment to be withheld until evidence for renewal is provided to the Owner.
 - **8.1.1** The Contractor shall provide and maintain, until the Work covered in this Agreement is completed and accepted by the Owner, the minimum insurance coverage in the minimum amounts as described below. Coverage shall be written on an occurrence basis by companies authorized and admitted to do business in the State of Texas and rated A- or better by A.M. Best Company or otherwise acceptable to Owner.

The policy shall be issued in the name of the Contractor and shall name his Subcontractors as additional insureds. The Owner shall be named as a loss payee on the policy. The builders risk policy shall have endorsements as follow:

- 1. This insurance shall be specific as to coverage and not considered as contributing insurance with any permanent insurance maintained on the present premises. If off-site storage is permitted, coverage shall include transit and storage in an amount sufficient to protect property being transported or stored.
- 2. For renovation projects and or portions of work contained within an existing structure, the Owner waives subrogation for damage by fire to existing building structure(s), if the Builder's Risk Policy has been endorsed to include coverage for existing building structure(s) in the amount described in the Special Conditions. However, Contractor shall not be required to obtain such an endorsement unless specifically required by the Special Conditions., in this Agreement. The aforementioned waiver of subrogation shall not be effective unless such endorsement is obtained.
- f. Umbrella coverage in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000.
- **8.1.2** The above insurance requirements are not intended to be compounded with the Contractor's standing insurance policies. If the Contractor already has in force insurance policies which provide the required coverage, there is no need to purchase duplicate coverage for this Work.

8.1.3 Policies must include the following clauses, as applicable.

- a. "This insurance shall not be canceled, limited in scope or coverage, or non-renewed until after thirty (30) days prior written notice, or ten (10) days for non-payment of premium, has been given to Williamson County."
- b. "It is agreed that the Contractor's insurance shall be deemed primary with respect to any insurance or self insurance carried by Williamson County for liability arising out of operations under the Agreement with Williamson County."
- c. "Williamson County, it officials, directors, employees, representatives, and volunteers are added as additional insured as respects operations and activities of, or on behalf of the named insured performed under Agreement with the Owner." This is not applicable to the workers' compensation policy.
- d. "The workers' compensation and employers' liability policy will provide a waiver of subrogation in favor of Williamson County."

8.1.4 Workers' Compensation Insurance Coverage:

In the event that Contractor employs any individual to perform any portion of the Work, Contractor shall comply with Texas Labor Code, §406.096, which requires workers' compensation insurance coverage for all employees providing services on a building or construction project for a governmental entity.

a. Definitions:

- (1) Certificate of Coverage ("certificate") A copy of a certificate of insurance, a certificate of authority to self-insure issued by the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission, or a coverage agreement (TWCC-81, TWCC-82, TWCC-83, or TWCC-84), showing statutory workers' compensation insurance coverage for the person's or entity's employees providing services on a project, for the Duration of the Work.
- (2) Duration of the Work includes the time from the beginning of the Work until the Work has been completed and accepted by the Owner.
- (3) Coverage Workers' compensation insurance meeting the statutory requirements of the Texas Labor Code, §401.011(44).
- (4) Persons providing services relating to the Work ("subcontractor") includes all persons or entities performing all or part of the services the Contractor has undertaken to perform the Work, regardless of whether that person contracted directly with the Contractor and regardless of whether that person has employees. This includes, without limitation, independent contractors, subcontractors, leasing companies, motor carriers, owner-operators, employees of any such entity, or employees of any entity which furnishes persons to provide services in relation to the Work. "Services" include, without limitation, providing, hauling, or delivering equipment or materials, or providing labor, transportation, or other service related to a project. "Services" does not include activities unrelated to the Work, such as food/beverage vendors, office supply deliveries, and delivery of portable toilets.
- b. The Contractor shall provide Coverage, based on proper reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts and filing of any Coverage agreements, which meets the statutory requirements of Texas labor Code, §401.011(44) for all employees of the Contractor providing services in relation to the Work, for the Duration of the Work.
- c. The Contractor must provide a Certificate of Coverage to the Owner prior to or contemporaneously with the execution of this Agreement.

- d. If the Coverage period shown on the Contractor's current Certificate of Coverage ends during the Duration of the Work, the Contractor must, prior to the end of the Coverage period, file a new Certificate of Coverage with the Owner showing that Coverage has been extended.
- e. The Contractor shall obtain from each person providing services in relation to the Work, and provide to the Owner:
 - (1) a Certificate of Coverage, prior to that person beginning any of the Work, so the Owner will have on file Certificates of Coverage showing Coverage for all persons providing services in relation to the Work; and
 - (2) no later than seven days after receipt by the Contractor, a new Certificate of Coverage showing extension of Coverage, if the Coverage period shown on the current Certificate of Coverage ends during the Duration of the Work.
- f. The Contractor shall retain all required Certificates of Coverage for the Duration of the Work and for one year thereafter.
- g. The Contractor shall notify the Owner in writing by certified mail or personal delivery, within 10 days after the Contractor knew or should have known, of any change that materially affects the provision of Coverage of any person providing services in relation to the Work.
- h. The Contractor shall post on the Work site a notice, in the text, form and manner prescribed by the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission, informing all persons providing services in relation to the Work that they are required to be covered, and stating how a person may verify Coverage and report lack of Coverage.
- i. By signing this Agreement or providing or causing to be provided a Certificate of Coverage, the Contractor is representing to the Owner that all employees of the Contractor who will provide services in relation to the Work and all persons providing services in relation to the Work will be covered by workers' compensation coverage for the Duration of the Work, that the coverage will be based on proper reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts, and that all coverage agreements will be filed with the appropriate insurance carrier or, in the case of a self-insured, with the commission's Division of Self-Insurance Regulation. Providing false or misleading information may subject the Contractor to administrative penalties, criminal penalties, civil penalties, or other civil actions.
- j. The Contractor's failure to comply with any of these provisions is a breach of Agreement by the Contractor which entitles the Owner to declare the Agreement void if the Contractor does not remedy the breach within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of breach from the Owner.
- 8.1.5 The furnishing of the above listed insurance coverage must be tendered prior to execution of the Agreement, and in no event later than ten (10) calendar days from Notice of Award. Failure to provide the insurance in a timely fashion may result in loss of Contractor's bid bond.
- **8.1.6** The Contractor shall not cause or allow any of its required insurance to be canceled, nor permit any insurance to lapse during the term of the Agreement or as required in the Agreement. If the Contractor fails to obtain, maintain or renew any insurance required by this Agreement, the Owner may, among other remedies available hereunder or at law, obtain insurance coverage directly and recover the cost of that insurance from the Contractor or declare this Agreement void if the Contractor does not remedy the breach within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of breach from the Owner.

- **8.1.7** The Owner reserves the right to review the insurance requirements set forth in this Article during the effective period of the Agreement and to make reasonable adjustments to the insurance coverage and their limits when deemed necessary and prudent by the Owner based upon changes in statutory law, court decisions, or the claims history of the industry as well as the Contractor.
- **8.1.8** The Owner shall be entitled, upon request, and without expense, to receive complete copies of the policies with all endorsements and may make any reasonable requests for deletion, or revision or modification of particular policy terms, conditions, limitations, or exclusions, except where policy provisions are established by law or regulation binding upon the Parties or the underwriter of any of such polices. Damages caused by the Contractor and not covered by insurance shall be paid by the Contractor.
- 8.1.9 Contractor shall be responsible for payment of premiums for all of the insurance coverages required under this Agreement. Contractor further agrees that for each claim, suit or action made against insurance provided hereunder, with respect to all matters for which the Contractor is responsible hereunder, Contractor shall be solely responsible for all deductibles and self-insured retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions over \$50,000 in the Contractor's insurance must be declared and approved in writing by Owner in advance.
- 8.1.10 The Contractor shall contractually require each person or entity with whom it contracts to provide services in relation to the Work, to comply with each and every insurance requirement that Contractor must comply with hereunder. More specifically, each person or entity with whom Contractor contracts to provide services on the in relation to the Work must comply with each insurance requirement under this Article 8 just as if such person or entity was the Contractor. Thus, every reference to Contractor under each insurance requirement of this Article 8 shall mean and include each person or entity with whom Contractor contracts to provide services in relation to the Work. If any such person or entity with whom Contractor contracts to provide services in relation to the Work fails to obtain, maintain or renew any insurance required by this Agreement, the Owner may, among other remedies available hereunder or at law, obtain insurance coverage directly and recover the cost of that insurance from the Contractor or declare this Agreement void if the Contractor does not remedy the breach within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of breach from the Owner.

8.2 INDEMNITY.

- 8.2.1 INDEMNIFICATION - EMPLOYEE PERSONAL INJURY CLAIMS. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND (WITH COUNSEL OF OWNER'S CHOOSING), AND HOLD HARMLESS OWNER, AND OWNER'S EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES, PARTNERS, OFFICERS, AND DIRECTORS (COLLECTIVELY, THE "INDEMNITEES") AND SHALL ASSUME ENTIRE RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY (OTHER THAN AS A RESULT OF INDEMNITEES' GROSS NEGLIGENCE) FOR ANY CLAIM OR ACTION BASED ON OR ARISING OUT OF THE PERSONAL INJURY, OR DEATH, OF ANY EMPLOYEE OF THE CONTRACTOR, OR OF ANY SUBCONTRACTOR, OR OF ANY OTHER ENTITY FOR WHOSE ACTS THEY MAY BE LIABLE, WHICH OCCURRED OR WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE OCCURRED ON THE WORK SITE OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF THE WORK. CONTRACTOR HEREBY INDEMNIFIES THE INDEMNITEES EVEN TO THE EXTENT THAT SUCH PERSONAL INJURY WAS CAUSED OR ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY THE SOLE, COMPARATIVE OR CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE OF THE STRICT LIABILITY OF ANY INDEMNIFIED PARTY. THIS INDEMNIFICATION SHALL NOT BE LIMITED TO DAMAGES, COMPENSATION, OR BENEFITS PAYABLE UNDER INSURANCE POLICIES, WORKERS COMPENSATION ACTS, DISABILITY BENEFITS ACTS, OR OTHER EMPLOYEES BENEFIT ACTS.
- 8.2.2 INDEMNIFICATION OTHER THAN EMPLOYEE PERSONAL INJURY CLAIMS. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, CONTRACTOR SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND (WITH COUNSEL OF OWNER'S CHOOSING), AND HOLD HARMLESS OWNER, AND OWNER'S EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES, PARTNERS, OFFICERS, AND DIRECTORS (COLLECTIVELY, THE "INDEMNITEES") FROM AND AGAINST CLAIMS, DAMAGES, LOSSES AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ATTORNEYS' FEES, ARISING OUT OF OR ALLEGED TO BE RESULTING FROM THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT OR THE WORK DESCRIBED HEREIN, TO THE EXTENT CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE, ACTS, ERRORS, OR OMISSIONS OF CONTRACTOR OR ITS SUBCONTRACTORS, ANYONE EMPLOYED BY THEM OR ANYONE FOR WHOSE ACTS THEY MAY BE LIABLE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER OR NOT SUCH CLAIM, DAMAGE, LOSS OR EXPENSE IS CAUSED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY A PARTY INDEMNIFIED HEREUNDER.
- 8.3 Except for the obligation of Owner to pay Contractor the Contract Price pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, and to perform certain other obligations pursuant to the terms and conditions explicitly set forth herein, Owner shall have no liability to Contractor or to anyone claiming through or under Contractor by reason of the execution or performance of this Agreement. Notwithstanding any obligation or liability of Owner to Contractor, no present or future partner or affiliate of Owner or any agent, officer, director, or employee of Owner, Williamson County, or of the various departments comprising Williamson County, or anyone claiming under Owner has or shall have any personal liability to Contractor or to anyone claiming through or under Contractor by reason of the execution or performance of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 9 BONDS

9.1 Performance Bond. Upon execution of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide a Performance Bond in the amount of 100% of the Contract Price. The surety for a Performance Bond shall meet the requirements of Texas law.

- 9.2 Payment Bond. Upon execution of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide a Payment Bond in the amount of 100% of the Contract Price, as security for the true and faithful payment in full of all subcontractors and persons performing labor, services, materials, machinery, and fixtures in connection with the Work. The surety for a Payment Bond shall meet the requirements of Texas law.
- 9.3 Warranty Bond. Upon execution of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide a Warranty Bond in the amount of 20% of the Contract Price, as security for the true and faithful performance of all warranties set forth in Bid Documents and this Agreement.

ARTICLE 10 TERMINATION

- 10.1 Termination for Cause. If either party commits an Event of Breach (a breach of any of the covenants, terms and/or conditions of this Agreement), the non-breaching party shall deliver written notice of such Event of Breach to the breaching party. Such notice must specify the nature of the Event of Breach and inform the breaching party that unless the Event of Breach is cured within three (3) business days of receipt of the notice, additional steps may be taken to terminate this Agreement. If the breaching party begins a good faith attempt to cure the Event of Breach within three (3) business days, then and in that instance, the three (3) business day period may be extended by the non-breaching party, so long as the breaching party continues to prosecute a cure diligently to completion and continues to make a good faith attempt to cure the Event of Breach. If, in the opinion of the non-breaching party, the breaching party does not cure the breach within three (3) business days or otherwise fails to make any diligent attempt to correct the Event of Breach, the breaching party shall be deemed to be in breach and the non-breaching party may, in addition to seeking the remedies available hereunder and under the law, terminate this Agreement.
- 10.2 Termination for Convenience. The Owner may terminate this Agreement for convenience and without cause or further liability upon thirty (30) days written notice to Contractor. In the event of such termination, it is understood and agreed that only the amounts due to Contractor for goods, commodities and/or services provided and expenses incurred to and including the date of termination, will be due and payable. No penalty will be assessed for Owner's termination of this Agreement for convenience.

ARTICLE 11 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

11.1 Interest and Late Payments. Except as otherwise specifically set forth herein, Owner's payment for goods and services shall be governed by Chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code. Interest charges for any overdue payments shall be paid by Owner in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 2251.025. More specifically, the rate of interest that shall accrue on a late payment is the rate in effect on September 1 of Owner's fiscal year in which the payment becomes due. The said rate in effect on September 1 shall be equal to the sum of one percent (1%); and (2) the prime rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first day of July of the preceding fiscal year that does not fall on a Saturday or Sunday.

In the event that an error appears in an invoice/application for payment submitted by Contractor, Owner shall notify Contractor of the error not later than the twenty first (21st) day after the date Owner receives the invoice/application for payment. If the error is resolved in favor of Contractor, Contractor shall be entitled to receive interest on the unpaid balance of the invoice/application for payment submitted by Contractor beginning on the date that the payment for the invoice/application for payment became overdue. If the error is resolved in favor of the Owner, Contractor shall submit a corrected invoice/application for payment that must be paid in accordance within the time set forth above. The unpaid balance accrues interest as provided by Chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code if the corrected invoice/application for payment is not paid by the appropriate date.

- 11.2 Assignment; Successors and Assigns. This Agreement is a personal service contract for the services of Contractor, and Contractor's interest in this Agreement, duties hereunder and/or fees due hereunder may not be assigned or delegated to a third party. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.
- 11.3 Captions. The captions of paragraphs in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be considered or referred to in resolving questions of interpretation or construction.
- 11.4 Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement and all of the rights and obligations of the parties and all of the terms and conditions shall be construed, interpreted and applied in accordance with and governed by and enforced under the laws of the State of Texas without reference to its conflicts of law provisions. Williamson County where the Work site is located shall be the sole place of venue for any legal action arising from or related to this Agreement or the project in which the Owner is a party.
- 11.5 Waivers. No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right or power arising from non-compliance or failure of performance by the other party with any of the provisions of this Agreement shall impair or constitute a waiver of any such right or power. A waiver by either party of any covenant or condition of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach of that or of any other covenant or condition of the Agreement.
- 11.6 Interpretation. In the event of any dispute over the meaning or application of any provision of the Contract Documents, the Contract Documents shall be interpreted fairly and reasonably, and neither more strongly for or against any party, regardless of the actual drafter of the Contract Documents.
- 11.7 Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective permitted assigns and successors.
- 11.8 Appointment. Owner hereby expressly reserves the right from time to time to designate by notice to Contractor a representative(s) to act partially or wholly for Owner in connection with the performance of Owner's obligations. Contractor shall act only upon instructions from the designated representative(s) unless otherwise specifically notified to the contrary.
- 11.9 Audits. Contractor agrees that Owner or its duly authorized representatives shall, until the expiration of three (3) years after final payment under this Agreement, have access to and the right to examine and photocopy any and all books, documents, papers and records of Contractor which are directly pertinent to the services to be performed under this Agreement for the purposes of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions. Contractor agrees that Owner shall have access during normal working hours to all necessary Contractor facilities and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space in order to conduct audits in compliance with the provisions of this section. Owner shall give Contractor reasonable advance notice of intended audits.
- 11.10 Severability. Should any term or provision of this Agreement be held invalid or unenforceable in any respect, the remaining terms and provisions shall not be affected and this Agreement shall be construed as if the invalid or unenforceable term or provision had never been included.
- 11.11 No Waiver of Immunities. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, modify or amend any legal defense available at law or in equity to Owner, its past or present officers, employees, or agents, nor to create any legal rights or claim on behalf of any third party. Owner does not waive, modify, or alter to any extent whatsoever the availability of the defense of governmental immunity under the laws of the State of Texas and of the United States.

- 11.12 Current Revenues. Under Texas law, a contract with a governmental entity that contains a claim against future revenues is void; therefore, each party paying for the performance of governmental functions or services must make those payments from current revenues available to the paying party.
- 11.13 Compliance with Laws. Contractor shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations, and the orders and decrees of any courts or administrative bodies or tribunals in any matter affecting the performance of this Agreement, including, without limitation, Worker's Compensation laws, minimum and maximum salary and wage statutes and regulations, licensing laws and regulations. When required, Contractor shall furnish the County with certification of compliance with said laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, orders, and decrees above specified.
- 11.14 Sales and Use Tax Exemption. Owner is a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas and claims exemption from sales and use taxes under Texas Tax Code Ann. § 151.309, as amended.
- 11.15 Texas Public Information Act. To the extent, if any, that any provision in this Agreement is in conflict with Tex. Gov't Code 552.001 et seq., as amended (the "Public Information Act"), the same shall be of no force or effect. Furthermore, it is expressly understood and agreed that Owner, its officers and employees may request advice, decisions and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas in regard to the application of the Public Information Act to any information or data furnished to Owner whether or not the same are available to the public. It is further understood that Owner, its officers and employees shall have the right to rely on the advice, decisions and opinions of the Attorney General, and that Owner, its officers and employees shall have no liability or obligation to Contractor for the disclosure to the public, or to any person or persons, of any software or a part thereof, or other items or data furnished to Owner by Contractor in reliance of any advice, decision or opinion of the Attorney General of the State of Texas.
- 11.16 Force Majeure. If the party obligated to perform is prevented from performance by an act of war, order of legal authority, act of God, or other unavoidable cause not attributable to the fault or negligence of said party, the other party shall grant such party relief from the performance of this Agreement. The burden of proof for the need of such relief shall rest upon the party obligated to perform. To obtain release based on force majeure, the party obligated to perform shall file a written request with the other party.
- 11.17 Equal Opportunity in Employment. The parties to this Agreement agree that during the performance of the services under this Agreement they will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. The parties to this Agreement will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

- 11.18 Reports of Accidents. Within 24 hours after Contractor becomes aware of the occurrence of any accident or other event which results in, or might result in, injury to the person or property of any third person (other than an employee of the Contractor), whether or not it results from or involves any action or failure to act by the Contractor or any employee or agent of the Contractor and which arises in any manner from the performance of this Agreement, the Contractor shall send a written report of such accident or other event to the County, setting forth a full and concise statement of the facts pertaining thereto. The Contractor shall also immediately send the County a copy of any summons, subpoena, notice, or other documents served upon the Contractor, its agents, employees, or representatives, or received by it or them, in connection with any matter before any court arising in any manner from the Contractor's performance of work under this Agreement.
- **11.19 Relationship of the Parties.** Each party to this Agreement, in the performance of this Agreement, shall act in an individual capacity and not as agents, employees, partners, joint ventures or associates of one another. The employees or agents of one party shall not be deemed or construed to be the employees or agents of the other party for any purposes whatsoever.
- 11.20 Appropriation of Funds by Owner. Owner believes it has sufficient funds currently available and authorized for expenditure to finance the costs of this Agreement. Contractor understands and agrees that the Owner's payment of amounts under this Agreement is contingent on the Owner receiving appropriations or other expenditure authority sufficient to allow the Owner, in the exercise of reasonable administrative discretion, to continue to make payments under this Agreement.
- 11.21 Execution in Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which, when executed and delivered, shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same document.
- 11.22 Entire Agreement. This Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either oral or written. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by each party to this Agreement. NO OFFICIAL, EMPLOYEE, AGENT, OR REPRESENTATIVE OF THE OWNER HAS ANY AUTHORITY, EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, TO AMEND THIS AGREEMENT, EXCEPT PURSUANT TO SUCH EXPRESS AUTHORITY AS MAY BE GRANTED BY THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT.

Please allow this letter to set out my understanding regarding our Agreement for the acquisition and replacement of certain subdivision improvements owned by LS Estates Homeowners Association, Inc. ("Owner") and required to be removed as part of Williamson County's ("County") proposed Southeast Loop/Corridor A-1 roadway improvements and related appurtenances and utility adjustments ("Project").

By execution of this letter the parties agree as follows:

- 1. County shall pay Owner the sum of \$173,295.26 in good funds in return for Owner's delivery to County of a fully executed and acknowledged Bill of Sale ("BOS") in the form as set out in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for conveyance of subdivision improvements, and as any additional compensation for the curative replacement of any acquired improvements.
- 2. County shall fund and deliver the payment as agreed herein within fourteen (14) days after full execution of this Agreement and delivery of executed W-9 form by Owner, or at other date and time agreed to between the parties.
- 3. This Agreement is being made, and the BOS is being delivered, in lieu of condemnation.
- 4. As additional compensation for this transaction, within thirty (30) days following delivery of the BOS as set out herein, Owner and County shall execute and deliver a License Agreement ("License") in the form as set out in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein for use of the Parcel 8 and Parcel 17 proposed landscape

bed areas identified in Exhibit "A" to the BOS. The fully executed License shall be recorded by County in the Official Records of Williamson County. In addition, Owner and County shall continue to negotiate further easement or fee conveyance alternatives for the property area subject to the License as County makes additional determinations regarding the use of the License and interests of the adjacent property landowners.

If this meets with your understanding please execute this letter where indicated below and return it to me, and we will have this approved and signed by the County and process this for payment as quickly as possible.

EXHIBIT "A" IMPROVEMENT LOCATION AND PROPOSED ROW LIMITS

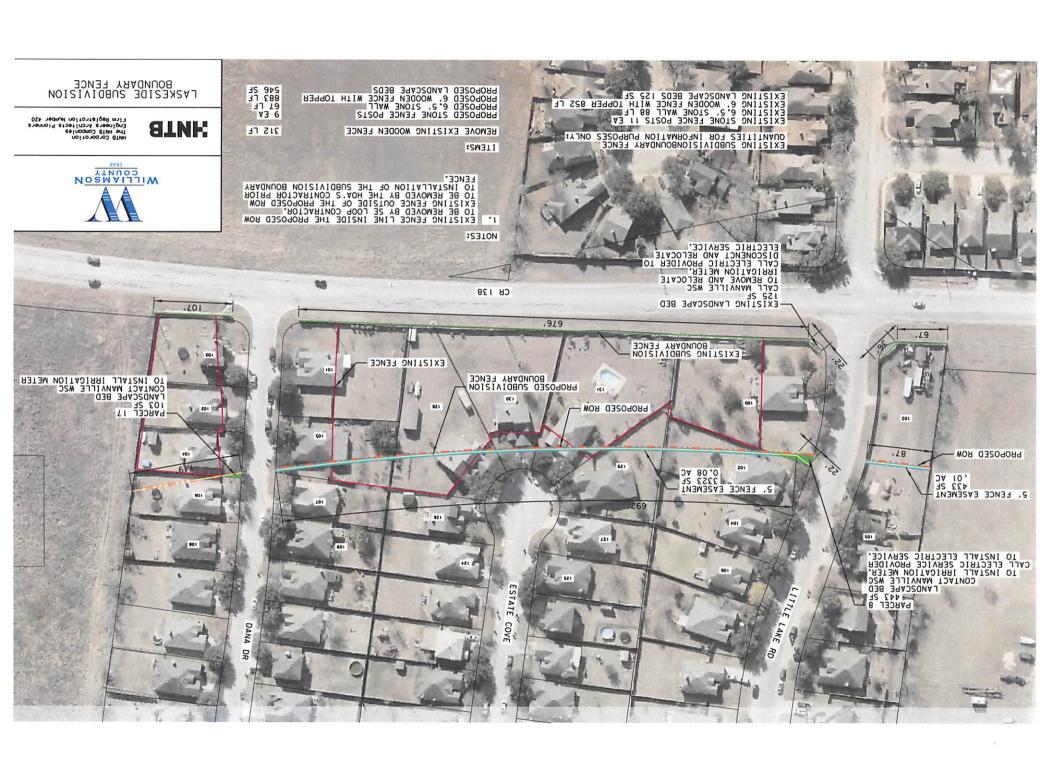

EXHIBIT "B" FORM OF LICENSE AGREEMENT FOLLOWS

WILLIAMSON COUNTY LICENSE AGREEMENT

WILLIAMSON COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "County"), and LS ESTATES HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC. (the "Association" or "Licensee"), enter into this LICENSE AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") upon the terms and conditions set forth below.

I. PURPOSE AND GRANT OF LICENSE AGREEMENT

Licensee has requested permission from County to install and maintain additions, including, but not limited to landscaping, lighting, fencing, signage, and irrigation (collectively referred to herein as the "Licensee's Improvements"), in portions of the County's right-of-way or property. The County grants to Licensee permission to install and maintain Licensee's Improvements in the areas of the County's right-of-way described in the attached Exhibit "A" (the "Licensed Property").

The County makes this grant solely to the extent of its right, title, and interest in the Licensed Property, without any express or implied warranties.

Licensee agrees that all construction and maintenance permitted by this Agreement will be done in compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and all applicable County, State, and/or Federal police, traffic, building, health, and safety ordinances, laws, and regulations existing at the time said construction and maintenance is performed.

II. ANNUAL FEE

The County, its governing body, and its respective successors and assigns agree that no annual fee will be assessed for the license and permission herein granted to Licensee. Licensee agrees that the County's permission and grant of a license hereunder and Licensee's ability to construct and obligation to thereafter maintain Licensee's Improvements on the Licensed Property serve as consideration to support this Agreement.

III. COUNTY'S RIGHTS TO LICENSED PROPERTY

This Agreement is expressly subject and subordinate to the present and future rights of the County, its successors, assigns, lessees, grantees and licensees, to construct, install, establish, maintain, use, operate, and renew any public utilities facilities, franchised public utilities, roadways, or streets on, beneath, or above the surface of the Licensed Property.

Nothing in this Agreement will be construed to limit, in any way, the power of the County to widen, alter, or improve the Licensed Property pursuant to official action by the governing body of the County or its successors. The County does, however, agree to give Licensee at least thirty (30) days' written notice of such action and will cooperate with Licensee to effect the relocation and/or removal of Licensee's Improvements, at Licensee's sole cost, in the event of such widening, altering, or improvement of the Licensed Property, and further, to cooperate with Licensee wherever possible, to effect such widening, altering, or improving of the Licensed Property so that Licensee's Improvements and operations on the Licensed Property will not be materially affected thereby.

Notwithstanding any provision in this Agreement to the contrary, the County retains the right to enter upon the Licensed Property at any time without notice to Licensee, assuming no obligation to Licensee, and remove, without liability to County, any of the Licensee's Improvements whenever such removal is deemed necessary for: (a) exercising the County's rights or duties with respect to the Licensed Property; (b) protecting persons or property; or (c) protecting the public health or safety with respect to the Licensed Property.

IV. INSURANCE

Licensee will, at its sole expense, obtain and maintain during the term of this Agreement a commercial general liability insurance policy, written by a company acceptable to the County and licensed to do business in Texas, with a combined single limit of not less than Five Hundred Thousand and No/loo Dollars (\$500,000.00), which coverage may be provided in the form of a rider and/or endorsement to a previously existing insurance policy. Such insurance coverage must specifically name the County as an additional insured and cover all perils arising from the activities of Licensee, its officers, directors, employees, agents, or contractors relative to this Agreement. Licensee will be responsible for any deductibles stated in the policy. A true copy of each instrument effecting such coverage must be delivered to the County on or before the Effective Date defined on the initial signature page hereto.

So long as Licensee is using the Licensed Property, Licensee will not cause such insurance to be canceled nor permit such insurance to lapse. All insurance certificates must include a clause to the effect that the policy will not be canceled, reduced, restricted, or otherwise limited until thirty (30) days after the County has received written notice as evidenced by a return receipt of registered or certified mail.

V. INDEMNIFICATION

INDEMNIFICATION - EMPLOYEE PERSONAL INJURY CLAIMS. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, LICENSEE WILL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND (WITH COUNSEL OF COUNTY'S CHOOSING), AND HOLD HARMLESS THE COUNTY, AND THE COUNTY'S EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES, PARTNERS, OFFICERS, AND DIRECTORS (COLLECTIVELY, THE "INDEMNITEES") AND WILL ASSUME ENTIRE RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY (OTHER THAN AS A RESULT OF THE COUNTY'S GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT) FOR ANY CLAIM OR ACTION BASED ON OR ARISING OUT OF THE PERSONAL INJURY, OR DEATH, OF ANY EMPLOYEE OF LICENSEE, OR OF ANY SUBCONTRACTOR, OR OF ANY OTHER ENTITY FOR WHOSE ACTS THEY MAY BE LIABLE, WHICH OCCURRED OR WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE OCCURRED ON THE LICENSED PROPERTY OR IN CONNECTION WITH LICENSEE'S IMPROVEMENTS. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, LICENSEE HEREBY INDEMNIFIES THE INDEMNITEES EVEN TO THE EXTENT THAT SUCH PERSONAL INJURY WAS CAUSED OR ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY THE SOLE, COMPARATIVE OR CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE OF THE STRICT LIABILITY OF ANY INDEMNITEE. THIS INDEMNIFICATION WILL NOT BE LIMITED TO DAMAGES, COMPENSATION, OR BENEFITS PAYABLE UNDER INSURANCE POLICIES, WORKERS COMPENSATION ACTS, DISABILITY BENEFITS ACTS, OR OTHER EMPLOYEES BENEFIT ACTS.

INDEMNIFICATION - OTHER THAN EMPLOYEE PERSONAL INJURY CLAIMS. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, LICENSEE WILL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND (WITH COUNSEL OF COUNTY'S CHOOSING), AND HOLD HARMLESS THE INDEMNITEES FROM AND AGAINST CLAIMS, DAMAGES, LOSSES AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ATTORNEYS' FEES, ARISING OUT OF OR ALLEGED TO BE RESULTING FROM THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT OR THE WORK DESCRIBED HEREIN, TO THE EXTENT CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE, ACTS, ERRORS, OR OMISSIONS OF LICENSEE OR ITS

SUBCONTRACTORS, ANYONE EMPLOYED BY THEM, OR ANYONE FOR WHOSE ACTS THEY MAY BE LIABLE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER OR NOT SUCH CLAIM, DAMAGE, LOSS OR EXPENSE IS CAUSED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY AN INDEMNITEE HEREUNDER.

VI. CONDITIONS

- A. <u>Licensee's Responsibilities</u>. Licensee will be responsible for any damage to and/or for the relocation of Licensee's Improvements on the Licensed Property. Further, Licensee will reimburse the County for all costs of replacing or repairing any property of the County or of others which is damaged or destroyed as a result of activities authorized under this Agreement by, or on behalf of, Licensee.
- B. <u>Maintenance and Utility service</u>. Licensee will maintain the Licensed Property and Licensee's Improvements by keeping the area free of debris and litter. Removal of dead or dying plants will also be handled by Licensee at its expense, as required by the County. Such removal of dead or dying plants must be completed within thirty (30) days following receipt of a written request by the County to do so. If Licensee abandons or fails to maintain the Licensed Property, and the County receives no substantive response within thirty (30) days following written notification to Licensee, then the County may remove and/or replace all of Licensee's Improvements. Any electric, water or other public or private utility service required for Licensee's use of the Licensed Property shall be the sole responsibility of Licensee to obtain, install, maintain, and pay for any required service account or useage.
- C. <u>Removal or Modification</u>. Licensee agrees that removal or modification of any improvements now existing or to be later replaced on the Licensed Property will be at Licensee's sole expense. Said removal or modification will be at Licensee's sole discretion, except where otherwise provided by this Agreement.
- D. <u>Default</u>. In the event that Licensee fails to maintain the Licensed Property or otherwise comply with the terms or conditions as set forth herein, then the County will give Licensee written notice thereof, by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the addresses set forth below. Licensee will have thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of such notice to take action to remedy the failure complained of and, if Licensee does not remedy the same to the County's complete satisfaction within the 30-day period, the County may, in addition to other remedies available herein or by law to County, (1) perform the work, (2) contract for the completion of the work, or (3) terminate this Agreement. Licensee agrees to pay, within thirty (30) days of written demand by the County, all costs and expenses incurred by the County in completing the work or contracting for the work to be completed.

VII. <u>COMMENCEMENT: TERMINATION BY ABANDONMENT</u>

This Agreement will begin on the Effective Date set forth above the signature of the parties herein below, and continue thereafter for so long as the Licensed Property is used for the purposes set forth herein or until this Agreement is terminated according to the terms hereof. If Licensee abandons the use of all or any part of the Licensed Property for such purposes set forth in this Agreement, then this Agreement, as to such portion or portions abandoned, will expire and terminate following thirty (30) days' written notice to Licensee. If such abandonment has not been remedied by Licensee within such period, the County will thereafter have the same complete title to the Licensed Property so abandoned as though this Agreement had never been made and will have the right to enter on the Licensed Property so abandoned and terminate the rights of

Licensee, its successors and assigns hereunder, with respect to the abandoned Licensed Property. All installations of Licensee's Improvements on Licensed Property abandoned by Licensee that are not removed prior to the County's termination of the license as to such Licensed Property will be deemed the property of the County as of the effective date of the County's termination.

VIII. TERMINATION

- A. <u>Termination by Licensee</u>. This Agreement may be terminated by Licensee as to all or any portion of the Licensed Property by delivering written notice of termination to the County not later than thirty (30) days before the effective date of termination. If Licensee so terminates, then Licensee will, within the 30-day notice period, remove from the portion of the Licensed Property as to which this Agreement is being terminated, installations of Licensee's Improvements. Any of Licensee's Improvements within the portion of the Licensed Property as to which this Agreement is being terminated that are not removed within said period will become the property of the County. Licensee hereby agrees and acknowledges that Licensee will be liable to the County for any damages caused to the Licensed Property by the removal of Licensee's Improvements.
- B. <u>Termination by County</u>. This Agreement may be revoked and terminated in whole or in part at any time by resolution of the Williamson County Commissioners Court if such revocation and termination is reasonably required by the public interest (as hereinafter set forth), after providing thirty (30) days' written notice to the Licensee.

Subject to prior written notification to Licensee or its successors-in-interest, this Agreement is revocable by the County and deemed to be required by the public interest if:

- 1. the Licensee's Improvements, or a portion of them, interfere with the County's right-of-way;
 - 2. use of the Licensed Property becomes necessary for a public purpose;
- 3. the Licensee's Improvements, or a portion of them, constitute a danger to the public which the County deems, in its sole discretion, not to be remediable by alteration or maintenance of such improvements;
- 4. despite thirty (30) days' written notice to Licensee, maintenance or alteration necessary to alleviate a danger to the public has not been made; or
- 5. Licensee fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement including, but not limited to, any insurance requirements specified herein.

IX. LICENSEE AS LICENSEE

Notwithstanding any contrary provision herein, in the event that the Licensee ceases to exist or fails to comply with the terms, conditions, and obligations of this Agreement, the County will provide written notice to the Licensee noncompliance with this Agreement. Within thirty (30) days after the Licensee's receipt of such notice, the Licensee will remedy the default and secure the insurance required pursuant to <u>Article IV</u> above or notify the County that the Licensee desires to terminate this Agreement effective as of the end of such 30-day period.

X. <u>MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS</u>

- A. <u>Venue and Governing Law</u>. Each party to this Agreement hereby agrees and acknowledges that venue and jurisdiction of any suit, right, or cause of action arising out of or in connection with this Agreement will lie exclusively in Williamson County, Texas. Furthermore, this Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, excluding, however, its choice of law rules.
- B. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement are held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding will not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof, but rather this entire Agreement will be construed as if not containing the particular invalid or unenforceable provision or provisions, and the rights and obligation of the parties will be construed and enforced in accordance therewith. The parties acknowledge that if any provision of this Agreement is determined to be invalid or unenforceable, it is the desire and intention of each that such provision be reformed and construed in such a manner that it will, to the maximum extent practicable, give effect to the intent of this Agreement and be deemed to be validated and enforceable.
- C. <u>Covenant Running With Land; Waiver of Default</u>. This Agreement and all of the covenants herein will run with the land; therefore, the conditions set forth herein will inure to and bind each party's successors and assigns. Any party may waive any default of another at any time, without affecting or impairing any right arising from any subsequent or other default.
- D. <u>Assignment</u>. Licensee will not assign, sublet, or transfer its interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the County, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld. In the event that the County agrees to Licensee's assignment of its interest in this Agreement and subject to the assignee's compliance with the insurance requirements set forth herein, Licensee will furnish to the County a copy of any such assignment or transfer of any of Licensee's rights in this Agreement, including the name, date, address, and contact person.
- E. <u>Notices</u>. All notices, demands, and requests for delivery of documents or information hereunder must be in writing and will be deemed to have been properly delivered and received as of the time of delivery if personally delivered, as of the time deposited in the mail system if sent by United States certified mail, return receipt requested, and postage prepaid, or as of the time of delivery to Federal Express (or comparable express delivery system) if sent by such method with all costs prepaid. All notices, demands, and requests hereunder will be addressed as follows or to such other addresses which a party may so designate by sending notice as aforesaid:

- F. <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. This Agreement is for the sole and exclusive benefit of the parties hereto, and nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended to confer or will be construed as conferring upon any other person any rights, remedies or any other type or types of benefits.
- G. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. Each party to this Agreement will comply with all federal, state, and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations and the orders and decrees of any courts or administrative bodies or tribunals in any matter affecting the performance of this Agreement
- H. <u>Gender, Number and Headings</u>. Words of any gender used in this Agreement will be held and construed to include any other gender, and words in the singular number will be held to include the plural, unless the context otherwise requires. The headings and section numbers are for convenience only and will not be considered in interpreting or construing this Agreement.
- I. <u>Construction</u>. Each party to this Agreement acknowledges that it and its counsel have reviewed this Agreement and that the normal rules of construction are not applicable and there will be no presumption that any ambiguities will be resolved against the drafting party in the interpretation of this Agreement.
- J. <u>No Waiver of Immunities</u>. Nothing in this Agreement will be deemed to waive, modify, or amend any legal defense available at law or in equity to the County or the Licensee, or their respective past or present officers, employees, or agents, nor to create any legal rights or claim on behalf of any third party. Neither the County nor the Licensee waives, modifies, or alters to any extent whatsoever the availability of the defense of governmental immunity under the laws of the State of Texas and of the United States.
- K. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either oral or written. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by each party to this Agreement. NO OFFICIAL, EMPLOYEE, AGENT, OR

REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COUNTY HAS ANY AUTHORITY, EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, TO AMEND THIS AGREEMENT, EXCEPT PURSUANT TO SUCH EXPRESS AUTHORITY AS MAY BE GRANTED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT.

L. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original and all of which together will constitute a single instrument.

By this Contract, Seller sells and agrees to convey, and Purchaser purchases and agrees to pay for, the tract(s) of land described as follows:

All of that certain 1.937 acre (84,377 sq. ft.) tract of land out of the J.H. DILLARD SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 179, Williamson County, Texas; said tract more particularly described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "A" to be attached. (Parcel 22);

together with all and singular the rights and appurtenances pertaining to the property, including any right, title and interest of Seller in and to adjacent streets, alleys or rights-of-way (all of such real property, rights, and appurtenances being referred to in this Contract as the "Property"), and any improvements situated on and attached to the Property described in Exhibits "A" not otherwise agreed herein to be retained by Seller, for the consideration and upon and subject to the terms, provisions, and conditions set forth below.

ARTICLE II PURCHASE PRICE

Purchase Price

ARTICLE IV REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES OF SELLER

Seller hereby represents and warrants to Purchaser as follows, which representations and warranties shall be deemed made by Seller to Purchaser also as of the Closing Date, to the best of Seller's current actual knowledge:

- (1) There are no parties in possession of any portion of the Property as lessees, tenants at sufferance, or trespassers, other than as previously disclosed to Purchaser;
- (2) Seller has complied with all applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, statutes, rules and restrictions relating to the Property, or any part thereof.

ARTICLE V CLOSING

Closing Date

5.01. The Closing shall be held at the office of Independence Title Company on or before August 15, 2021, or at such time, date, and place as Seller and Purchaser may agree upon, or within 10 days after the completion of any title curative matters if necessary for items as shown on the Title Commitment or in the contract (which date is herein referred to as the "Closing Date").

Seller's Obligations at Closing

5.02. At the Closing Seller shall:

- (1) Deliver to Purchaser a duly executed and acknowledged Deed conveying good and indefeasible title to Williamson County, Texas in fee simple to all of the Property described in Exhibit "A", free and clear of any and all monetary liens and restrictions, except for the following:
 - (a) General real estate taxes for the year of closing and subsequent years not yet due and payable;
 - (b) Any exceptions approved by Purchaser pursuant to Article III hereof; and
 - (c) Any exceptions approved by Purchaser in writing.
- (2) The Deed shall be in the form as shown in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- (3) Provide reasonable assistance as requested to cause Title Company to deliver to Purchaser a Texas Owner's Title Policy at Purchaser's sole expense, issued by Title Company, in Grantee's favor in the full amount of the purchase price, insuring Purchaser's contracted interests in and to the Property subject only to those title exceptions listed herein, such other exceptions as may be approved in writing by Purchaser, and the standard printed exceptions contained in the usual form of Texas Owner's Title Policy, provided, however:
 - (a) The boundary and survey exceptions shall be deleted;

ARTICLE VI BREACH BY SELLER

In the event Seller shall fail to fully and timely perform any of its obligations hereunder or shall fail to consummate the sale of the Property for any reason, except Purchaser's default, Purchaser may: (1) enforce specific performance of this Contract; or (2) request that the Escrow Deposit, if any, shall be forthwith returned by the title company to Purchaser.

ARTICLE VII BREACH BY PURCHASER

In the event Purchaser should fail to consummate the purchase of the Property, the conditions to Purchaser's obligations set forth in Article III having been satisfied and Purchaser being in default and Seller not being in default hereunder, Seller shall have the right to receive the Escrow Deposit, if any, from the title company, the sum being agreed on as liquidated damages for the failure of Purchaser to perform the duties, liabilities, and obligations imposed upon it by the terms and provisions of this Contract, and Seller agrees to accept and take this cash payment as its total damages and relief and as Seller's sole remedy hereunder in such event. If no Escrow Deposit has been made then Seller shall receive the amount of \$500 as liquidated damages for any failure by Purchaser.

ARTICLE VIII MISCELLANEOUS

Notice

8.01. Any notice required or permitted to be delivered hereunder shall be deemed received when sent by United States mail, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to Seller or Purchaser, as the case may be, at the address set forth opposite the signature of the party.

Texas Law to Apply

8.02. This Contract shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Williamson County, Texas.

Parties Bound

8.03. This Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns where permitted by this Contract.

Legal Construction

8.04. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Contract shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, this invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this Contract shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

Prior Agreements Superseded

8.05. This Contract constitutes the sole and only agreement of the parties and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties respecting the within subject matter.

Time of Essence

8.06. Time is of the essence in this Contract.

Gender

8.07. Words of any gender used in this Contract shall be held and construed to include any other gender, and words in the singular number shall be held to include the plural, and vice versa, unless the context requires otherwise.

Memorandum of Contract

8.08. Upon request of either party, the parties shall promptly execute a memorandum of this Contract suitable for filing of record.

Compliance

8.09. In accordance with the requirements of Section 20 of the Texas Real Estate License Act, Purchaser is hereby advised that it should be furnished with or obtain a policy of title insurance or Purchaser should have the abstract covering the Property examined by an attorney of Purchaser's own selection.

Effective Date

8.10. This Contract shall be effective as of the date it is approved by Williamson County, Texas which date is indicated beneath the County Judge's signature below.

Counterparts

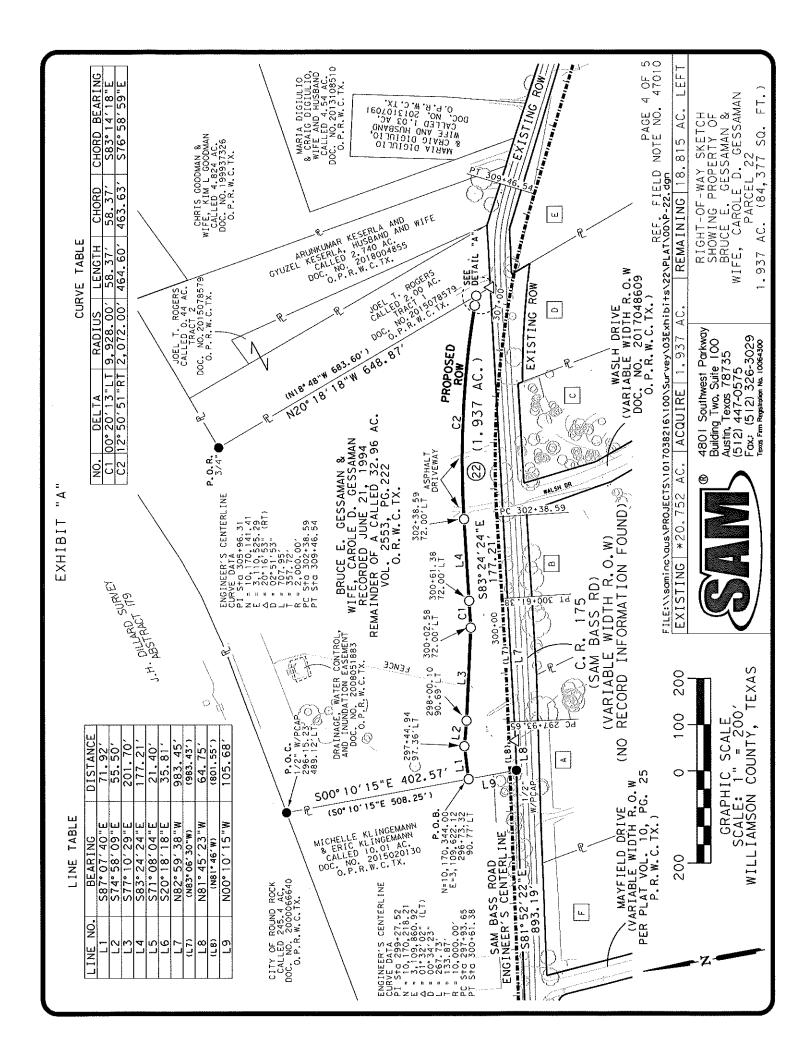

This deed is being delivered in lieu of condemnation.

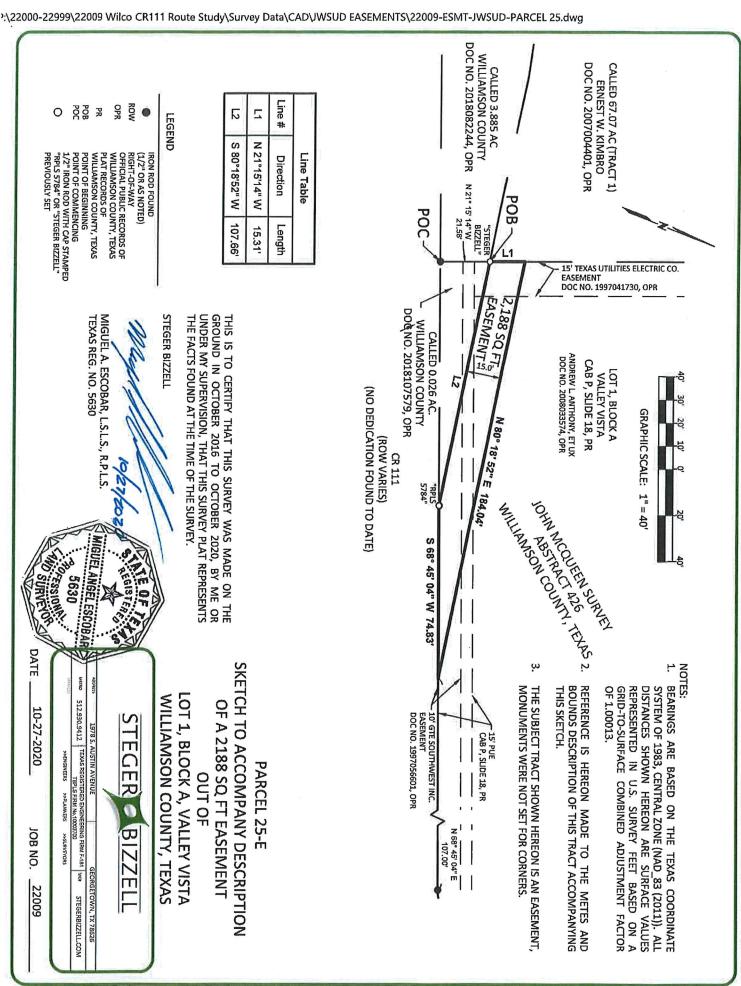

ESCROW AGREEMENT (Westinghouse Road)

THIS ESCROW AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made and entered into to be effective as of ______, 2021, by and between 600 Westinghouse Investments, LLC, a Nevada limited liability company ("Developer"), Williamson County, Texas, ("County") and Georgetown Title Company ("Escrow Agent"), with reference to the following facts:

- A. Developer is developing approximately 128 acres (the "Property") located near the southeast corner of CR 110 and CR 111.
- B. Developer's predecessor in title, the Madison Westinghouse Co-tenancy ("Madison") entered into a Development Agreement (the "Agreement") with the County regarding the Property dated March 31, 2020 and recorded in Doc. # 202051914 of the Official Public Records of Williamson County, Texas, for the purpose of providing for the orderly and expeditious design, engineering and construction of an extension of a portion of Westinghouse Road running from CR 111 to CR 110. together with the construction of all required related construction and drainage and detention improvements to be constructed in accordance with the Plans and Specs (as defined in the Agreement) (the "Project").
- C. The Agreement requires the Developer, as successor to Madison, to dedicate approximately 7.345 acres in fee simple to the County for the construction of Westinghouse Road ("Westinghouse ROW") and to deposit into escrow an amount equal to one-third of the Project Estimate (as defined in the Agreement) with an escrow agent acceptable to both parties.
- D. Developer and County wish to engage the services of Georgetown Title Company to act as the escrow holder with regard to the Escrow Deposit for the limited purposes set forth below, and Escrow Agent has agreed to serve as such escrow holder under the terms and conditions provided in this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, and the mutual obligations of the parties, the receipt and sufficiency of which consideration are hereby acknowledged and confessed, the parties agree as follows:

 Developer shall deposit with the Escrow Agent the Escrow Deposit via wire transfer the amount of Three Hundred Thirty-Six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-Eight and 11/100 Dollars (\$336,688.11) (the "Escrow Deposit"), to be held by Escrow Agent in an escrow account and to be disbursed only as provided in this Agreement.

- Developer will also deliver to the Escrow Agent a fully-executed Donation Special Warranty Deed in the form required in the Agreement to be recorded in Real Property Records.
- 3. Escrow Agent's obligation to perform under this Agreement will be contingent on Developer depositing the Escrow Deposit as provided herein.
- 4. If Developer elects to construct the Project as permitted in Section E.1 of the Agreement, Developer will provide written notice to Escrow Agent and the County. Thereafter, the Escrow Deposit will be disbursed as follows: as draws are paid to the contractor by Developer for the construction of the Project, Developer will provide a copy of the contractor's Draw Request (the "Draw Request") and evidence of payment of the Draw Request by Developer ("Payment Evidence") to the County and Escrow Agent. Within thirty (30) days after receipt of the a copy of the Draw Request and Payment Evidence by Escrow Agent, Escrow Agent authorized and directed to disburse to Developer from the Escrow Deposit the sum of one-third of the amount paid by Developer reflected on the Payment Evidence. When the final Draw Request on the Project has been paid by Developer, Developer will note such on the Draw Request and Payment Evidence provided to Escrow Agent and the County. Within thirty (30) days after receipt of the copy of the final Draw Request and final Payment Evidence, Escrow Agent is authorized and directed to disburse to the then remaining balance of the Escrow Deposit to Developer. If the final Draw Request and Payment Evidence is not provided to Escrow Agent and the County within 30 months after the initiation of construction by the Developer, subject to force majeure conditions, and the County gives Developer and Escrow Agent written notice that the County has elected to complete the construction of the Project as permitted by the Agreement, then on the earlier to occur of (i) the date County gives Escrow Agent and Developer written notice that Developer has commenced on-the-ground development of the Property or (ii) March 31, 2030, the Escrow Agent is authorized and directed to disburse the then remaining balance of the Escrow Deposit to (a) the County, if the County has previously paid the Orenda Costs (as defined in the Agreement) to Developer, or (b) up to \$137,716.25 of the then remaining balance of the Escrow Deposit to Developer and the balance of the Escrow Deposit, if any, to the County, if the County has not previously paid the Orenda Costs to Developer.
- 5. If the County elects to construct the Project as permitted in Section E.1 of the Agreement, the County will provide written notice to Escrow Agent and Developer. Thereafter, the County will be entitled to disbursements of the Escrow Deposit as follows: the County will provide Developer and Escrow Agent notice of completion of construction of the Project and within thirty (30) days of the notice from the County of the completion of the Project, the Escrow Agent is authorized and directed to disburse the Escrow Deposit as follows: (a)

- \$198,971.86 (being the amount of the Escrow Deposit less the Orenda Costs) will be disbursed to the County and (b) \$137,716.25 will be disbursed to Developer.
- 6. This Escrow Agreement is specifically for the benefit of Williamson County and Developer and may not be revised, supplemented, waived or withdrawn without the prior written consent of the County's authorized representative and Developer.
- 7. County shall pay all banking fees incurred in connection with Escrow Agent's obligations under this Agreement.
- 8. This Agreement shall terminate when all of the Escrow Deposit has been disbursed by Escrow Agent in accordance with this Agreement or as otherwise directed in writing by the County and Developer.
- 9. Escrow Agent shall not be under any duty to give the Escrow Deposit held by it hereunder any greater degree of care than it gives its own similar property and shall not be required to invest the Escrow Deposit held hereunder except as directed in this Agreement.
- 10. Escrow Agent shall not be liable for actions or omissions hereunder, except for its own gross negligence or willful misconduct and, except with respect to claims based upon such gross negligence or willful misconduct that are successfully asserted against Escrow Agent, the other parties hereto shall jointly and severally Indemnify and hold harmless Escrow Agent (and any successor Escrow Agent) from and against any and all losses, liabilities, claims, actions, damages and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements, arising out of and in connection with this Agreement. Without limiting the foregoing, Escrow Agent shall in no event be liable in connection with its investment or reinvestment of any cash held by it hereunder in good faith, in accordance with the terms hereof, including, without limitation, any liability for any delays (not resulting from its gross negligence or willful misconduct) in the investment or reinvestment of the Escrow Fund or any loss of interest incident to any such delays. IN NO EVENT SHALL THE ESCROW AGENT BE LIABLE, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, FOR ANY SPECIAL, INDIRECT OR CONSEQUENTIAL LOSSES OR DAMAGES OF ANY KIND WHATSOEVER (INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION LOST PROFITS), EVEN IF THE ESCROW AGENT HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH LOSSES OR DAMAGES AND REGARDLESS OF THE FORM OF ACTION. This Section shall survive notwithstanding any termination of this Agreement or the resignation of Escrow Agent,

- 11. Escrow Agent shall be entitled to rely upon any order, judgment, certification, demand, notice, instrument or other writing delivered to it hereunder without being required to determine the authenticity or the correctness of any fact stated therein or the propriety or validity of the service thereof. Escrow Agent may act in reliance upon any instrument or signature believed by it to be genuine and may assume that the person purporting to give receipt or advice or make any statement or execute any document in connection with the provisions hereof has been duly authorized to do so. Escrow Agent may conclusively presume that the undersigned representative of any party hereto which is an entity other than a natural person has full power and authority to instruct Escrow Agent on behalf of that party unless written notice to the contrary is delivered to Escrow Agent.
- 12. Escrow Agent may act pursuant to the advice of counsel with respect to any matter relating to this Agreement and shall not be liable for any action taken or omitted by it in good faith in accordance with such advice.
- 13. Escrow Agent does not have any interest in the Escrow Deposit deposited hereunder but is serving as escrow holder only and has only possession thereof. Any payments of income from the Escrow Deposit shall be subject to withholding regulations then in force with respect to United States taxes. The parties hereto will provide Escrow Agent with appropriate Internal Revenue Service Forms W-9 for tax identification number certification, or nonresident alien certifications. This Section shall survive notwithstanding any termination of this Agreement or the resignation of Escrow Agent.
- 14. Escrow Agent makes no representation as to the validity, value, genuineness or collectability of any security or other document or instrument held by or delivered to it.
- 15. Escrow Agent shall not be called upon to advise any party as to the wisdom in selling or retaining or taking or refraining from any action with respect to any securities or other property deposited hereunder.
- 16. Escrow Agent (and any successor Escrow Agent) may at any time resign as such by delivering the Escrow Deposit to any successor Escrow Agent jointly designated by the other parties hereto in writing, or to any court of competent jurisdiction, whereupon Escrow Agent shall be discharged of and from any and all further obligations arising in connection with this Agreement. The resignation of Escrow Agent will take effect on the earlier of (i) the appointment of a successor (including by a court of competent jurisdiction) or (ii) the day which is thirty (30) days after the date of delivery of its written notice of resignation to the other parties hereto. If, at that time, Escrow Agent has not received a designation of a successor Escrow Agent, Escrow Agent's sole responsibility after that time

shall be to retain and safeguard the Escrow Deposit until receipt of a designation of successor Escrow Agent or a joint written disposition instruction by the other parties hereto or a final, nonappealable order of a court of competent jurisdiction.

- 17. In the event of any disagreement resulting in adverse claims or demands being made in connection with the Escrow Deposit or in the event that Escrow Agent is in doubt as to what action it should take hereunder, Escrow Agent shall be entitled to retain the Escrow Deposit until Escrow Agent shall have received (i) a final, nonappealable order of a court of competent jurisdiction directing delivery of the Escrow Deposit or (ii) a written agreement executed by the parties hereto directing delivery of the Escrow Deposit, in which event Escrow Agent shall disburse the Escrow Deposit in accordance with such order or agreement. 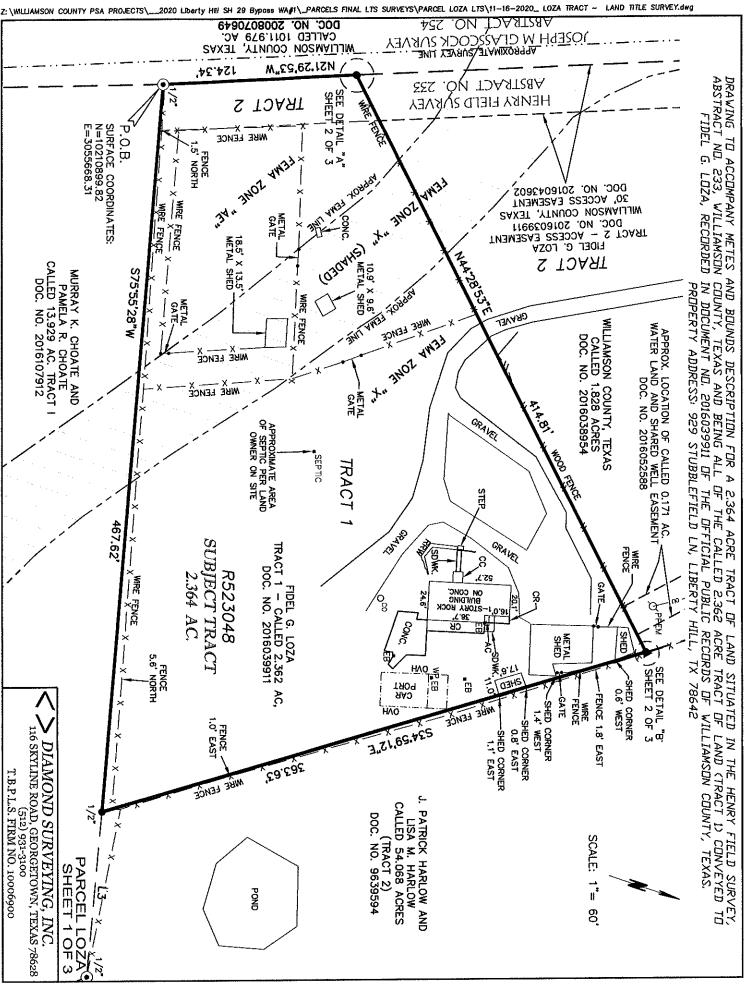

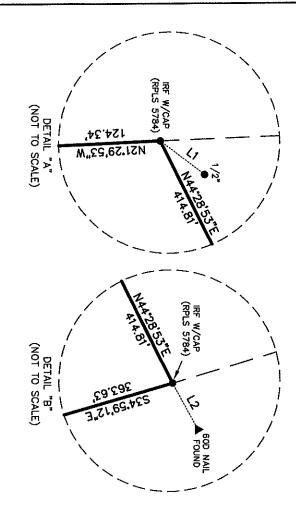

POSSESSION AND USE AGREEMENT FOR TRANSPORTATION PURPOSES

This Possession and Use Agreement For Transportation Purposes (the "Agreement") between WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS ("County"), and WILLIAM A. ROGERS, JR., AS THE TRUSTEE OF THE TIFFANY TANKERSLEY WOLFE 1997 CHILDREN'S TRUST and STEVEN J. WOLFE (collectively, the "Grantor" whether one or more), grants to the County, their contractors, agents and all others deemed necessary by the County, an irrevocable right to possession and use of the Grantor's property for the purpose of constructing a portion of SE Loop/Corridor A1 and related appurtenances and utility relocations (the "Roadway Construction Project"). The property subject to this Agreement is described more fully in field notes, plat map, or other description attached as "Exhibit A" and made a part of this Agreement by reference (the "Property").

- 1. For the consideration paid by the County which is set forth in Paragraph 2 below, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the Grantor grants, bargains, sells, and conveys to the County the right of entry and exclusive possession and use of the Property for the purpose of constructing a roadway, utility adjustments, and appurtenances thereto and the right to remove any improvements. Authorized activities include surveying, inspection, environmental studies, archeological studies, clearing, demolition, construction of permanent improvements, relocating, replacing, and improving existing utility facilities, locating new utility facilities, and other work required to be performed in connection with the Roadway Construction Project. This Possession and Use Agreement will extend to the County, its contractors and assigns, owners of any existing utilities on the Property and those which may be lawfully permitted on the Property by the County in the future, and all others deemed necessary by the County for the purpose of the Roadway Construction Project. This grant will allow the construction, relocation, replacement, repair, improvement, operation, and maintenance of utilities on the Property.
- 2. In full consideration for this irrevocable grant of possession and use and other Grantor covenants, warranties, and obligations under this Agreement, the County will tender to the Grantor the sum of ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,530,268.00). The Grantor agrees that this sum represents adequate and full compensation for the possession and use of the Property. The County will be entitled to take possession and use of the Property upon tender of payment as set out herein, subject to the conditions in paragraph 14 below, if any.

The parties agree that the sum tendered represents 100% of the County's approved value, which assumes no adverse environmental conditions affecting the value of the Property. The approved value is the County's determination of the just compensation owed to the Grantor for the real property interest to be acquired by the County in the Property, encumbered with the improvements thereon, if any, and damages to the remainder, if any, save and except all oil, gas, and sulphur. The parties agree that the sum tendered to Grantor will be deducted from any final settlement amount, Special Commissioners' award or court judgment. In the event the amount of the final settlement or judgment for acquisition of the Property is less than the amount the County has paid for the possession and use

of the Property, then the Grantor agrees that the original amount tendered represents an overpayment for the difference and, upon written notice from the County, the Grantor will promptly refund the overpayment to the County.

- 3. The effective date of this Agreement will be the date on which payment pursuant to Paragraph 2 above was tendered to the Grantor by the County, or disbursed to the Grantor by a title company acting as escrow agent for the transaction, (the "Effective Date").
- 4. The Grantor warrants and represents that the title to the Property is free and clear of all liens and encumbrances according to that certain title commitment numbered 2006661-KFO, issued May 6, 2021 by Title Resources Guaranty Company/Independence Title (and any subsequent updates prior to the Effective Date) by Independence Title, and that proper releases, if any, will be executed for the Property prior to funds being disbursed under this Agreement. The Grantor further warrants that no other person or entity (other than persons named as Grantor and, through the Trust, the beneficiaries of the Trust named as one of the persons comprising Grantor) owns an interest in the fee title to the Property and further agrees to indemnify the County from all unreleased or undisclosed liens, claims or encumbrances affecting the Property.

The above made warranties are made by Grantor and accepted by County subject the following:

- A. Visible and apparent easements not appearing of record;
- B. Any discrepancies, conflicts or shortages in area or boundary lines or any encroachments or any overlapping of improvements which a current survey would show; and,
- C. Easements, restrictions, reservations, covenants, conditions, oil and gas leases, mineral severances and encumbrances for taxes and assessments (other than liens and conveyances) presently of record in the Official Public Records of Williamson County, Texas, that affect the Property, but only to the extent that said items are still valid and in force and effect at this time.
- 5. The parties agree that the valuation date for determining the amount of just compensation for the real property interest proposed to be acquired by the County in the Property, for negotiation or eminent domain proceeding purposes, will be the earlier of (a) the date of deposit into the registry of the court of any Special Commissioners' Award in a condemnation suit to acquire the Property, or (b) August 15, 2021. Should the Special Commissioners' Award be greater than the amount paid in paragraph two (2) above, Grantee shall tender the difference to the registry of the court within (45) days following the filing of the award.
- 6. This Agreement is made with the understanding that the County will continue to proceed with acquisition of a real property interest in the Property. The Grantor reserves all rights of compensation for the title and other interest in and to the Property which the Grantor holds as of the time immediately prior to the Effective Date of this Agreement. This Agreement shall in no way prejudice the Grantor's rights to receive full and just compensation as allowed by law for all of the Grantor's interests in and to the Property to be acquired by the County, encumbered with the improvements thereon, if any, and damages, if any, to the remainder of the Grantor's interest in any larger tract of which the Property is a part (the "Remainder"), all as the Property exists on the Effective Date of this Agreement. The County's removal or construction of improvements on the Property shall in no way affect the fair

market value of the Property in determining compensation due to the Grantor in the eminent domain proceedings. No beneficial project influence will impact the appraised value of the Property to be acquired. This grant will not prejudice the Grantor's rights to any relocation benefits for which Grantor may be eligible.

- 7. In the event the County institutes or has instituted eminent domain proceedings, the County will not be liable to the Grantor for interest upon any award or judgment as a result of such proceedings for any period of time prior to the date of the award. Any interest accrual penalties will be deferred by the County until 90 days after entry of judgment.
- 8. The purpose of this Agreement is to allow the County to proceed with its Roadway Construction Project without delay and to allow the Grantor to have the use at this time of a percentage of the estimated compensation for the County's acquisition of a real property interest in the Property. The Grantor expressly acknowledges that the proposed Roadway Construction Project is for a valid public use and voluntarily waives any right the Grantor has or may have, known or unknown, to contest the jurisdiction of the court in any condemnation proceeding for acquisition of the Property related to the Roadway Construction Project, based upon claims that the condemning authority has no authority to acquire the Property through eminent domain, has no valid public use for the Property, or that acquisition of the Property is not necessary for the public use.
- 9. The Grantor reserves all of the oil, gas, and sulphur in and under the land herein conveyed but waives all right of ingress and egress to the surface for the purpose of exploring, developing, mining or drilling. The extraction of oil, gas, and minerals may not affect the geological stability of the surface. Nothing in this reservation will affect the title and rights of the County to take and use all other minerals and materials thereon, and thereunder.
- 10. The undersigned Grantor agrees to pay as they become due, all ad valorem property taxes and special assessments assessed against Property until the Effective Date, including prorated taxes until the Effective Date for the year in which the County takes title to the Property.
- 11. Notwithstanding the acquisition of right of possession to the Property by the County in a condemnation proceeding by depositing the Special Commissioners' award into the registry of the court within forty-five (45) days after filing of said Award, less any amounts tendered to the Grantor pursuant to Paragraph 2 above, this Agreement shall continue to remain in effect until the County acquires title to the Property either by negotiation, settlement, or final court judgment.
- 12. This Agreement will also extend to and bind the heirs, devisees, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors in interest and assigns of the parties.
- 13. It is agreed the County will record this document.

14. Other conditions:

(a) Prior to the beginning of construction of the roadway facilities and appurtenance phase of the Roadway Construction Project upon the Property, County shall at its sole expense cause replacement boundary fencing and gates to be constructed in the locations and in compliance with the design specifications as shown on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein. Said fencing shall match

existing fencing on the property, specifically 6' x 6' wire mesh fencing with 2 strands at top; timber pull posts every 50', steel posts every 10', and Timber H bracing every 150'.

During periods of initial construction activity for the roadway facilities and appurtenances of the Roadway Construction Project, a temporary fence will be placed across the lake along the north side of the right of way. This temporary fence will consist of a water gap type fence that includes a cable that will extend from one side of the lake to the other. The cable will be connected to steel posts. Cattle panels will be placed on the cable that will drape into the water to the required depth to provide security and prevent cattle crossing the right of way boundary. The temporary water gap fence will remain in place until all roadway construction is complete and fencing across the right of way to each bridge abutment can be installed per Exhibit B. County agrees to provide 48 hours advance notice to property owner to access roadway right of way for the purposes of allowing the County's Contractor representatives to perform surveying and survey layout for the roadway construction. Upon completion of survey County may have meeting on site with WCID representatives to review existing condition of lake and discuss proposed construction.

- (b) As part of the construction of the Roadway Construction Project upon the Property, County shall at its sole expense, create a cattle crossing described as a "Cattle Trail" and located as shown on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein. Said crossing shall allow for cattle to pass under bridges within the project from one portion of Grantor's property to the other during and following construction. The right to movement of cattle in such locations shall not be blocked or otherwise prohibited by the County, other than during such periods as may reasonably be necessary for the construction of the roadway. During construction, Grantor shall coordinate with County for agreed timing for any cattle crossing of the construction zone upon the Property, and at the request of County shall occur only when a County observer or representative is present upon the Property in order to protect from possible construction hazards.
- (c) As part of the construction of the Roadway Construction Project upon the Property, County shall at its sole expense cause the installation of four (4) steel utility sleeve casings 24" (twenty-four inches) in diameter in the locations and in compliance with the design specifications as shown on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein. Utilities may only be installed in the sleeves upon the receipt of a permit from the appropriate utility company.
- (d) County agrees that Grantor shall be entitled to cross the Property and the County's Roadway Construction Project with utilities, including but not limited to within the sleeves provided for in Paragraph 14(c) herein, provided such crossings shall occur at a 45 degree angle or greater.
- (e) The parties agree that there are three potential access points available according to TxDOT guidelines in the areas shown on Exhibit B, with the amount of potential access drives as shown on Exhibit B, but all access points must be approved by the applicable approving authority at the time of application.
- (f) Each of the foregoing agreements stated in this Paragraph 14 are additional forms of consideration for the conveyance of the Property to the County under the threat of eminent domain. The provisions of this Paragraph 14 shall survive any conveyance of the Property to the County (either by deed or by judgment in an eminent domain proceeding), and shall be incorporated into any such conveyance to the County.

15. By its authorized signature below the following Tenants which have a leasehold interest in the Property hereby consent in all things to Grantee taking exclusive and sole possession of the Property pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, and to Grantor receiving the consideration recited herein:

Tenants: NONE

At no time during the possession of the Property by County for the purposes described herein shall Grantor be denied reasonable access and/or ingress to or egress from the remainder of Grantor's land for its current uses, unless otherwise agreed to in writing in advance.

To have and to hold the Agreement herein described and conveyed, together with all the rights and appurtenances belonging to the County and its assigns forever, for the purposes and subject to the limitations set forth above.
