WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 1251 and 1471, Texas Government Code, as amended; Chapter 331, Texas Local Government Code, as amended; the Texas Election Code and other related statutes, the Commissioners Court of Williamson County, Texas (the "County") is authorized to call an election in order to submit to the voters of the County two propositions regarding the issuance of bonds for road and park and recreational purposes with such bonds payable and secured by an annual ad valorem tax imposed by the Commissioners Court; and

WHEREAS, the placement of items on the ballot for the County's November 7, 2023 election shall be in accordance with the Texas Election Code (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Order was adopted was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given, all as required by the Texas Government Code, Chapter 551; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court deems it advisable to call a bond election for the propositions hereinafter stated.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

1. A bond election shall be held within the County on November 7, 2023, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M., at such polling places established and designated by the County as set forth on Exhibit "A" to this Order, which exhibit is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part hereof for all intents and purposes. Such Exhibit "A" shall be revised, as necessary, to comply with Texas law, including the addition of, or revision to, Election Day polling places as designated by the Williamson County Election Administrator as applicable and appropriate. In all respects, the election shall be conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code and the Federal Help America Vote Act. The Williamson County Elections Administrator may also utilize a central counting station as provided by Section 127.000 et seq., as amended, Texas Election Code. Section 61.012, Texas Election Code, requires that at least one accessible voting station must be provided in each polling place used in a Texas election. Such system must comply with state and federal laws setting the requirements for voting systems that (i) fully comply with applicable laws relating to accessible voting systems which make voting accessible for disabled voters; and (ii) provide a practical and effective means for voters with physical disabilities to cast

a secret ballot. The Williamson County Elections Administrator is currently using election systems and software certified by the Texas Secretary of State.

- 2. The Commissioners Court shall appoint the Presiding Election Judges, Alternate Judges, Early Voting Clerks and other election officials in accordance with the Code. Unless otherwise directed by the County, the Presiding Judge may employ other personnel necessary for the proper administration of the Election, including such part-time help as is necessary to prepare for the Election, to ensure the timely delivery of supplies during early voting and on Election Day, and for the efficient tabulation of ballots. Oral assistance in Spanish shall be made available to all persons requiring such assistance. Any person requiring oral assistance in Spanish should contact the Presiding Election Judge or the Early Voting Clerk.
- 3. Early voting shall be administered by the County and conducted for all voters by personal appearance and mail at the designated early voting polling place or places and during the dates and hours set forth herein.
- 4. Early voting in the election by personal appearance shall be conducted at the times, dates and polling places as determined by the County, and such polling places are hereby established and designated as set forth collectively in Exhibit "B" to this Order which exhibit is incorporated by reference and made a part hereof for all intents and purposes. Such Exhibit "B" shall be revised, as necessary, to comply with Texas law, including the addition of, or revision to, early voting polling places as directed by the Williamson County Elections Administrator as applicable and appropriate. Christopher J. Davis is the Early Voting Clerk. Applications for ballots by mail for voters in Williamson County should be sent to the Williamson County Clerk Elections Division, 301 SE Inner Loop, Suite 104, Georgetown, Texas 78626. Additional contact information for the Early Voting Clerk is provided below for purposes of compliance with Section 83.010 of the Code:

- 5. Early voting ballot boards are hereby created to process absentee voting results, and the Presiding Judge of the boards will be appointed by the Williamson County Elections Administrator. The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two (2) resident qualified electors to serve as members of the Early Voting Ballot Boards.
- 6. All resident, qualified electors of Williamson County, Texas shall be entitled to vote at the election.
- 7. The Williamson County Elections Administrator shall serve as the custodian of voted ballots and all other election records.
- 8. At the Election the following measures, setting forth the purpose for which the bonds shall be authorized, shall be submitted in accordance with law:

WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS SPECIAL ELECTION MEASURE A

Shall the Commissioners Court of Williamson County, Texas be authorized to issue and sell one or more series of bonds of the County in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$825,000,000 (which amount of bonds does not exceed one-fourth (1/4) of the assessed valuation of the real property in the County) for the purpose of the construction, acquisition by purchase, maintenance, and operation of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or in aid thereof to construct, improve, extend, expand, upgrade and/or develop roads, bridges and state highways including any land and right-of-way acquisitions, utility relocation, signage, pedestrian and bicycle facilities, traffic safety and operational improvements, design costs, related drainage and other costs all related to some or all of the foregoing with respect to the following projects¹:

the bonds of each series to mature serially or otherwise not more than twenty-five (25) years from their date; and any issue or series of bonds to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined within the discretion of the Commissioners Court, provided that such rate of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any series of the bonds; and shall the Commissioners Court of the County be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the County sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?

WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS SPECIAL ELECTION **MEASURE B**

Shall the Commissioners Court of Williamson County, Texas be authorized to issue and sell one or more series of bonds of the County in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$59,000,000 for the purpose of the construction, improvement, renovation, equipment, acquisition of lands and interests therein, buildings and facilities for park and recreational purposes, open space/preserve land, trail acquisition and pedestrian and bike trail improvements including design costs, utility relocation, related drainage and other costs to include, but not limited to:

Trail extension from Cedar Park Lakeline Trail extension south and eastward along Park to Twin Lakes Park

Brushy Creek near Sam Bass Road

Regional Park trail extension southward towards Brushy Creek Regional Trail

Williamson County Expo Center improvements including cover on west arena with restrooms and showers

Trail extension from Berry Springs Park and Preserve north and westward towards Georgetown Westside Park along Berry Creek

the bonds of each series to mature serially or otherwise not more than twenty-five (25) years from their date; and any series of bonds to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined within the discretion of the Commissioners Court, provided that such rate of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any series of the bonds; and shall the Commissioners Court of the County be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the County sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?

9. The official ballots for the election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITIONS with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITIONS to be expressed substantially as follows:

WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS SPECIAL ELECTION PROPOSITION B

- FOR) THE ISSUANCE OF \$59,000,000 OF BONDS FOR PARK AND RECREATIONAL PURPOSES AND THE LEVY OF TAXES AGAINST) SUFFICIENT TO PAY PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS.
- 10. Solely for purposes of compliance with Section 3.009(b) of the Texas Election Code, set forth in Exhibit "C" attached hereto is the information required in a bond election order. Such Exhibit "C" is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part hereof for all intents and purposes.
- 11. The Elections Administrator is authorized to give or cause to be given notices required for the election, and to take such other and further action as is required to conduct the election in the manner and for the time periods required by law.

In accordance with provisions of the Code, the forms of voter information documents pertaining to the PROPOSITIONS to be voted on at the Election are attached hereto as Exhibit "D" (collectively, the "Voter Information Document"). A substantial copy of this Order and the Voter Information Document (each as may be modified without further Commissioners Court action in a manner that is consistent with the calling of the Election and the election notice requirements of the Code applicable to the Election, including any proclamations by the Governor) shall serve as proper notice of the election and the voter information document required by Section 1251.052(b), Texas Government Code, respectively. The Elections Administrator is authorized to give or cause to be given the following to be posted and published in accordance with law:

- (a) A notice of the election, shall be published in the *Williamson County Sun*, a newspaper of general circulation in the County, on the same day in each of two successive weeks with the first publication occurring not earlier than the thirtieth (30th) day or later than the fourteenth (14th) day prior to the day of the Election;
- (b) This Order and the Voter Information Document shall be posted not later than the 21st day prior to the date set for the Election (i) on the bulletin board used for posting notices of meetings of the Commissioners Court (and also at the County Courthouse if such bulletin board is located elsewhere) and (ii) at three other places in the County;

- (c) This Order and the Voter Information Document shall be posted on election day and during early voting by personal appearance, in a prominent location at each polling place; and
- (d) This Order, the Voter Information Document and any sample ballot prepared for the Election shall be posted during the 21 days before the election, prominently on the County's Internet website.

Each of the notice of election, this Order and the Voter Information Document shall be published and/or posted, as provided above and as required by the Code, in both English and Spanish translations. All notices provided as required by this Order shall be modified as necessary to take into account any future proclamations issued by the Governor impacting the Election.

- 12. The provisions of this Order are severable; and in case any one or more of the provisions of this Order or the application thereof to any person or circumstance should be held to be invalid, unconstitutional, or ineffective as to any person or circumstance, the remainder of this Order nevertheless shall be valid, and the application of any such invalid provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby
- 13. The Williamson County Elections Administrator shall conduct an unofficial tabulation of results after the closing of the polls on November 7, 2023. The official canvass and tabulation of the results of the Bond Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code.

- (1) The proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Sections 8 and 9 hereof.
 - (2) The purpose for which the bonds are to be authorized is set forth in Section 8 hereof.
- (3) The principal amount of the debt obligations to be authorized is set forth in Sections 8 and 9 hereof.
- (4) As set forth in Sections 8 and 9 hereof, if the bonds are approved by the voters, the County will be authorized to levy annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the County, sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds as set forth therein.
- (5) Based upon the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 5.00% as calculated in accordance with applicable law. Such estimate takes into account a number of factors, including the issuance schedule, maturity schedule and the expected bond ratings of the proposed bonds. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information, but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds, or any series thereof, may be sold.
- (6) As set forth in Section 8 hereof, if the bonds are approved, they may be issued in one or more series, to mature serially, over a period not to exceed 25 years.
- (7) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the County's debt obligations (all of which are secured by a tax levied for debt service purposes) as of the date of this Order is \$1,152,310,000.00.
- (8) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest of the County's debt obligations (all of which are secured by an ad valorem tax levied for debt service purposes) as of the date of this Order is \$286,909,432.98.
- (9) The ad valorem debt service tax rate for the County as of the date of this Order is \$0.1339 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation.
