Please show historical data points or performance measures, statistics, services provided, etc. or any/all updates for re-application	Since the DDCP was established in 2006, the Court has continued to address the number of DWI and drug arrests in the community to help reduce recidivism for those offenders who are identified as High Risk/High Need, Low Risk/High Need, and who are placed on community supervision for DWI/ drug offenses. Williamson County is one of the fastest growing counties in Texas, with a 10.2% increase in population growth since the 2020 Census. In 2023, the Williamson County arrest records show 2,625 arrests for misdemeanor DWI or Drug offenses. Data from the 2023 Department of Transportation crash records include a reported 389 alcohol related crashes for the year with injuries occurring in Williamson County. Thus, a broader scope of treatment options for offenders and their families is needed. The new treatment services would follow Key Component #4 of Adult Drug Courts in providing access to a continuum of alcohol, drug, mental health, and other related treatment services.  The DDCP currently has 20 active participant and 22 pending applicants who are in the process of being assessed and screened for potential entrance into the program.
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
