WHEREAS, public health departments play a vital role in preventing disease, promoting health, protecting against environmental hazards, preparing for and responding to emergencies, and ensuring that all people have the opportunity to achieve optimal health; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County and Cities Health District has provided essential public health services to Williamson County since 1943, and serves as the trusted voice to prevent disease, respond to emergencies, and promote and protect equitable health, safety, and well-being for all who live, work, and play in Williamson County; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County and Cities Health District is accredited by the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB), demonstrating its commitment to meeting national standards for quality, performance, and continuous improvement in public health practice; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County and Cities Health District works collaboratively with community partners to assess the health of the community through the Community Health Assessment and develop and implement the Community Health Improvement Plan to address health priorities; and

WHEREAS, the District upholds the values of accountability, quality, respect, collaboration, and responsiveness in service to the residents of Williamson County; and

WHEREAS, National Public Health Week provides an opportunity to recognize the dedication of public health professionals and community partners who work every day to strengthen the health and resilience of our community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Williamson County Commissioners Court hereby proclaims “*National Public Health Week*” in Williamson County, Texas, and encourage all residents to recognize the important contributions of public health and to participate in activities that promote a healthier community for all.
