THIS PAST YEAR

In 2025 alone, we cared for **46 children** in our under 18 home and supported **10 young adults** stepping into independence through Grace365.

Yearly figures count each young person in every year they were in our care, so they total more than the five year individual counts above. Grace365 began in 2021. 2025 reflects January through November.

Why this matters to Williamson County

Nearly **300** Williamson County children are in foster care each year, and most are young, with about three out of four under the age of 13. These are the county's own children, and what they need most is a place that stays. Central Texas Table of Grace is that place. From our home in Williamson County, we serve foster youth from across Central Texas, keeping them safe and steady while their futures are decided.

One less move in a childhood of moves

For years we operated as an emergency shelter, where it was intended for a child to stay only up to 30 days before being moved again. Today we are a licensed General Residential Operation, which means a child can stay with us as long as they need. In a system where stability is scarce, that change removes one of the disruptions that harm children most.

Today's foster youth are Williamson County's future.

With the comprehensive campus, we will be able to care for more than double the number of young people we serve now.
