Dear Vivian:

We are pleased to welcome your First Assistant, Kathy Kohutek, as a member of the 2008 County Investment Officer Class. As you know, it is approximately 40 hours of sessions with difficult subject matter. I am including an agenda from last year. The topics never change but are updated every year. The teachers may change from year to year.

In order for the class registrants to receive their CIO designation, they must take the exam on Saturday morning. It is an open book exam which they have 4 hours to complete. The passing grade is 75%. The successful candidates must continue their education yearly to maintain their certification.

I have a room block at the Holiday Inn Austin on Town Lake. During the evenings at the hotel, the students usually find a few classmates and make up study groups. A great deal of learning is entailed to understand the subject matter, since an extensive amount of material is covered. The study groups are very beneficial to the students. On Wednesday, the teachers distribute a mid week test to be completed by the class that evening and they dismiss the class early. The following morning, the test is reviewed and the class has an opportunity to get extra help for any question they missed. We keep the classes small so extra help is available, if needed.

Several classes are designed so that the registrants fully understand the Texas Public Funds Investment Act and what duties this legislation requires of the investment officer. It is a seven day course, starting on Sunday, October 5, 2008 and ends after the exam on October 11.

I will be sending a letter to Kathy and the rest of the class, very soon. Please make sure Kathy calls the hotel and asks for the Texas Association of Counties' room block. Their reservation number is 1-888-615-0509. The hotel has a van to provide transportation to and from the hotel and the Event Center on the 4th floor of the Texas Association of Counties facility, if the students do not have a car. We will provide a light breakfast and lunch for the registrants each day.
