


from Jan 2000 to Apr 2009**




### Total Number of Cases Filed Yearly in the District Clerk's Office from 1999 to 2009




Note: These figures include Civil, Family, Show Cause (family), Adoptions, Tax, Criminal and Juvenile cases filed with the District Clerk.




### Criminal, Tax and Civil Court Clerks Comparison between 1999 and 2009




These 3 Court Clerks are responsible for the Disposition of Criminal, Tax and Civil cases. Each of them spends about 30 hours per week physically sitting in the courtroom. When in the courtroom, they have limited access to a computer, and have limited ability to do data entry due to the obvious constraints of the courtroom atmosphere. They each have about 10 hours remaining in a week to complete their work on case files in the District Clerk's office. This time consists of pulling dockets for court, data entry on each case, and preparing each folder for court. It also involves scanning, checking and filing all the necessary paperwork for each case. They prepare each defendant's "PenPack" (the information that accompanies the defendant when they are incarcerated). They receive frequent phone calls and visits from law enforcement agencies, attorneys and others needing information on cases.




District Clerk Civil and Family Yearly Court Costs Collected
