

The primary care safety net for Williamson County



- Started as one clinic in 2002
- Secured FQHC status in December 2004
- Today, 9 clinic locations in Williamson County
 - Primary medical care for children, adults, and seniors
 - Adult and Child & Adolescent psychiatry and Behavioral Health
 - OB/GYN-prenatal, labor & delivery, post-partum
 - Dentistry




- Co-management of patient care between primary care providers and behavioral health providers ensures patient's physical and mental health needs are met
- Currently employees 8 behavioral health professionals
 - 4 Psychiatrists (2.6 clinical FTE)
 - 1 Child Psychologist (PhD)
 - 2 Licensed Social Workers (LCSW)
 - 1 Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC)
- **10%** of our total projected patient visits in 2009 will be for mental health patients

LSCC - Psychiatry and Behavioral Medicine

LSCC Mental Health Visits




- 2006: Dr. Ripley (psychiatrist) hired in May; joined 1 LPC who resigned due to illness, which explains the decrease from 2006 to 2007
- 2007: Dr. Engel (child psychologist) hired in August; Sandra Grisales (LMSW) hired in October
- 2008: Joan Maus (LMSW) hired in April; Dr. Asamoah (part-time child psychiatrist) hired in May; Roxane Royalty (adult LPC) hired August; Dr. Prenzlauer (psychiatrist) hired in September; Dr. Scott (part-time child psychiatrist) hired in December




- 77% of all LSCC behavioral health patients live in Williamson County
- From October to December 2008, LSCC has facilitated 1,332 mental health patient visits for 513 Williamson County residents
 - LSCC has expended \$225,108 of our \$320,000 grant from Williamson County
 - By the end of FY 2009 period (10/1/08 through 9/30/09) LSCC will provide more than \$1M of qualified mental health encounters to Williamson County residents
- 57% of patients are female, and 43% are male
