**Note:** The screening column provides guidelines for earned income. It only takes into account 1 employed person and doesn't include deductions for Medicaid eligible persons or child care costs. Income must always be budgeted to know correct outcome!

Countable resources (after allowable deductions, such as for a homestead, etc.) are taken into account. Countable resources, after allowable deductions, must not exceed \$2,000. (\$3,000 if a person who is aged or disabled and meets relationship requirements lives in the home)
