RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009, S.T.O.P. VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT PROGRAM GRANT APPLICATION TO THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE DIVISION OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE FOR A VICTIMS' ASSISTANT FOR THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY JUDGE TO ACT AS THE COUNTY'S EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE IN ALL MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE COUNTY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE DIVISION GRANT.

WHEREAS, the District Attorney's Office of Williamson County desires to develop a Parole Protest Training and Assistance Project to educate and assist adult female victims of crime and law enforcement agencies on how, when and why to protest parole; and

WHEREAS, certain inmates exist who represent a threat to the safety of the citizens of Williamson County if released early; and

WHEREAS, Williamson County agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Criminal Justice Division funds, Williamson County assures that the funds will be returned to the Criminal Justice Division in full; and


WHEREAS, Williamson County designates the County Judge as the grantee's authorized official and is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of Williamson County to apply for funding under the 2009 ARRA STOP Violence Against Women Act Program Recovery Grant:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS:

1. That a grant application for the 2009 ARRA STOP Violence Against Women Act Program Recovery Grant is hereby authorized to be filed on behalf of the County and the Governor's Office.
2. That the application be submitted for grant funds to carry out the Parole Protest Training and Assistance Project.
3. That the County directs and designates the County Judge as the County's Chief Executive Officer and Authorized Representative to act in all matters in connection with this application and the County's participation in the 2009 ARRA STOP Violence Against Women Act Program Recovery Grant.
