The United States Congress officially recognized the end of World War I when it passed a concurrent resolution on June 4, 1926, with these words:

Whereas the legislatures of twenty-seven of our States have already declared November 11 to be a legal holiday: Therefore be it Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), that the President of the United States is requested to issue a proclamation calling upon the officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on November 11 and inviting the people of the United States to observe the day in schools and churches, or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies of friendly relations with all other peoples, AND

Whereas Williamson County Commissioners Court hereby wishes to thank the Veteran's Services Department employees for their service to the Veterans' of Williamson County, and wishes to thank all veterans within the County for their service to this great Country,

BE IT NOW KNOWN, that the Williamson County Commissioner's Court hereby declares the week of November 7-13, 2010 as

Veteran Service Officer Recognition Week

And that all citizens to recognize these officers for their services and to thank each Veteran for their service.
