Dear Gary,

Per your request SWCA Environmental Consultants (SWCA) has prepared a cost estimate for a response to the possible listing of the above-referenced species in Williamson County, Texas. The following is a breakdown of the expected consulting budget for the effort to participate and provide comments on behalf of the County in the listing process. In addition to SWCA's services we have included projected fees for Texas Perspectives to provide an initial assessment of the economic impact of the listing and for Prime Strategies to coordinate governmental interaction in Washington, D.C., as well as preparation of the economic analysis. We understand that Smith-Robertson will provide necessary legal service under a separate contract with the Williamson County Conservation Foundation.

SWCA proposes to develop extensive comments on the status of the species occurring in Williamson County for the upcoming public comment period. Based on elements of the listing petition, subsequent settlement agreements and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) 2010 species assessment and listing priority form, our comments will focus on existing conservation actions, status of threats to the salamanders and opportunities to implement conservation measures similar to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Optional Enhanced Water Quality Measures and the potential economic impact of listing. Preparation of these comments would commence immediately with initial comments completed in mid-December 2011 and final comments completed for submittal to the USFWS by December 31, 2011.

Detailed components of this effort will include the following:

- Review all available data on water quality and Eurycea sp. salamanders
- Review all available data on the status of the northern segment of the Edwards Aquifer



- Review water quality best management practices including the TCEQ Optional Enhanced Water Quality Measures and others with emphasis on methods to reduce threats listed in the USFWS 2010 status review
- Develop current baseline status including rapid assessment of up to 20 known and potential sites for the Georgetown salamander. Characterize threats or lack thereof on a site specific basis including water quality sampling, habitat assessment, presence/absence survey, and springshed analysis

Total SWCA cost estimate is \$75,000.00

The Texas Perspectives budget estimate is as follows:

• \$45,000 for economic impact analysis to be completed by December 15th

Total Texas Perspectives cost estimate is \$45,000.00

The Prime Strategies budget estimate is as follows:

• \$25,000 during the development of the economic analysis and coordination with government officials

Total Prime Strategies cost estimate is \$25,000.00

Total Work Authorization cost estimate is \$145,000.00

EXHIBIT C - WORK SCHEDULE

SWCA, Prime Strategies, and Texas Perspectives will begin work immediately upon receipt of a signed work authorization from Williamson County. A written response from the County will be provided to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service by December 31, 2011. Some aspects of this work authorization may continue into the first quarter of 2012.
