Proclamation

WHEREAS 2015 marks the 42nd anniversary of National Agriculture Day observances in an effort to raise awareness of the positive contribution agriculture makes in providing necessary food, fixel and fiber of everyday life:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Williamson County Commissioner's Court recognizes the preeminent role that agriculture plays in the daily lives of every American, and acknowledges the future progress and prosperity of the country's economy, and appreciates farmers and reachers in Williamson County and proclaims March 24th, 2015 as:
