PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, childhood cancer is the number one disease killer and second leading cause of death (exceeded only by accidents) of children; and

WHEREAS, on any given school day, 46 young people or two classrooms of students are diagnosed with cancer; and

WHEREAS, every year more than 15,000 children are diagnosed with cancer; and

WHEREAS, one in every 285 persons in the United States will develop cancer before their 20th birthday; and

WHEREAS, every year over 3,000 children under the age of 20 lose their lives to cancer; and

WHEREAS, our children are our most precious resource and are truly golden in our hearts; and

WHEREAS, "Go Gold" is an initiative to started to raise awareness of National Childhood Cancer month by encouraging residents to hang a gold ribbon in their yard and/or place of work or by changing their front door light bulb to gold/yellow during the month of September; now, therefore be it

PROCLAIMED, that the Williamson County Commissioners Court declares the month of September 2016, as

National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

in Williamson County, Texas and ask residents to join us as we "Go Gold" by lighting the dome of the historic courthouse with a golden light for the month of September 2016.
