Williamson County Operations

- <u>Round Rock</u> (Precinct 1): All Services Clinic and Administration Campus located at 1009 N. Georgetown Street – Providing Mental Health First Aid to Round Rock ISD
- <u>Cedar Park</u> (Precinct 2): Partnering with Cedar Park Medical Center, our all services clinic is located on the 3rd Floor of Medical Office Building II Partnering with Leander ISD to provide counseling services
- <u>Georgetown</u> (Precinct 3): Our most intensive level of care, the Extended Observation Unit, is embedded within our partner, Georgetown Behavioral Health Institute. Our 14-bed Crisis Respite Unit is located at the San Gabriel Crisis Center.
- <u>Hutto</u> (Precinct 4): In partnership with Hutto ISD, we are located next to the front entrance of Hutto High School, providing medical and counseling services
- <u>Taylor</u> (Precinct 4): A full service outpatient clinic renovated with funding through the St. David's Foundation - Partnering with Taylor ISD to provide counseling services






