
### Warrant Attempts by Fiscal Year

- FY2012 1033
- FY2013 1107
- FY2014 913
- FY2015 322
- FY2016 248
- FY2017 266\* (projection based on monthly averages)

These numbers show an approx. **75% decline in warrant attempts** since FY2012





#### Justice of the Peace 1 Warrants

- JP 1 currently has <u>1802</u> active warrants
- At an average of \$250-300 per warrant this has the potential of generating \$450,000-540,000 for the county.



# Civil Process service by Fiscal Year

- FY2016-3578
- FY2017-3500+\* (projection based on monthly averages)

Keep in mind these numbers reflect "received" process. Most process takes between 3-4 attempts to serve

#### Increased responsibilities

- As of 2017 we have partnered with the County Attorney's office to act as the enforcement arm of the new "Cite & Release" program which requires us to track down and arrest those offenders that fail to appear for court dates.
- Also in 2017 we have absorbed the responsibility of <a href="Hot Check">Hot Check</a>
  <a href="enforcement for the Tax Assessor/Collector's office">Hot Check</a>
  <a href="mailto:to:collect-funds">to:collect funds</a>, or seize license plates of those who have issued checks with insufficient funds to the county for vehicle registration.
- Both of the above programs require county wide enforcement



# Summary

- Civil process is <u>UP</u> approx. <u>16+%</u>
- Warrant attempts are <u>DOWN</u> <u>75%</u> due to staffing
- Adding an additional deputy will only increase our man power by 12%
