- WHEREAS, there were 120,069 reports of abuse older adults and people with disabilities in Texas in 2023; and
- WHEREAS, abuse against older adults and people with disabilities is grossly underreported because of social stigma, embarrassment, and fear; and
- WHEREAS, suspected abuse, neglect, and/or financial exploitation should be reported to the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services hotline at 1-800-252-5400 or online at www.txabusehotline.org; and
- WHEREAS, adult abuse effects men and women of all income and ability levels, all cultural and ethnic backgrounds, and in all communities; and
- WHEREAS, elder abuse should be everyone's business, and it's important to strengthen our efforts to prevent, report and address elder abuse.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Williamson County Commissioners Court in recognition thereof, do hereby proclaim the month of June 2024 to be:

"Elder Abuse Awareness Month"
