During the pandemic shut-down Yolo Farm to Fork staff, volunteers and interns partnered with these programs countywide to deliver over six tons of fresh healthy produce for kitchen staff to include in children's meals. In that process we found the biggest barrier to including healthy local</i></p>

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	<p><i>crops in children’s regular meals was a serious lack of kitchen equipment needed to wash, store and prepare fresh food for those meals.</i></p>
