 - repairing storm damage and erosion sites

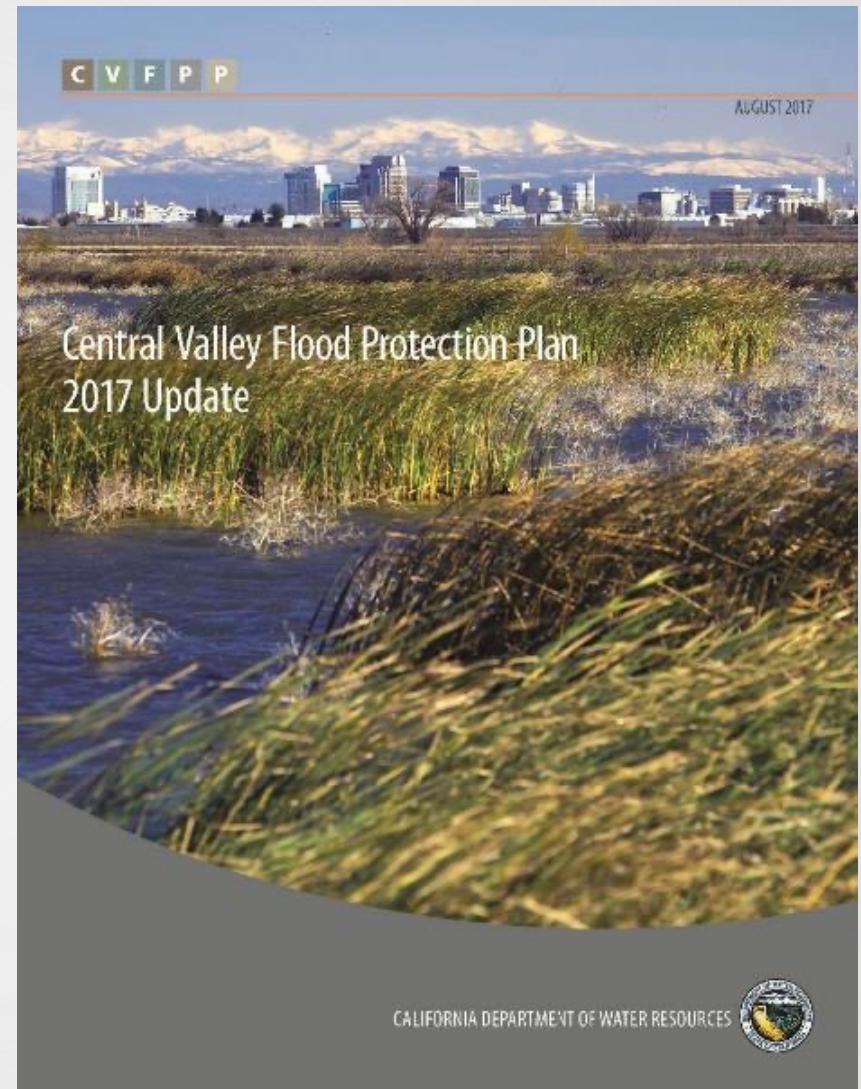


The Central Valley Flood Protection Plan (CVFPP) is

- Descriptive, not decisional
- Not a funding or permitting decision for specific projects
- Prioritizes the State's investment in flood management over the next three decades
- Promotes multi-benefit projects
- Integrates and improves ecosystem functions associated with flood risk reduction projects

2022 CVFPP Update

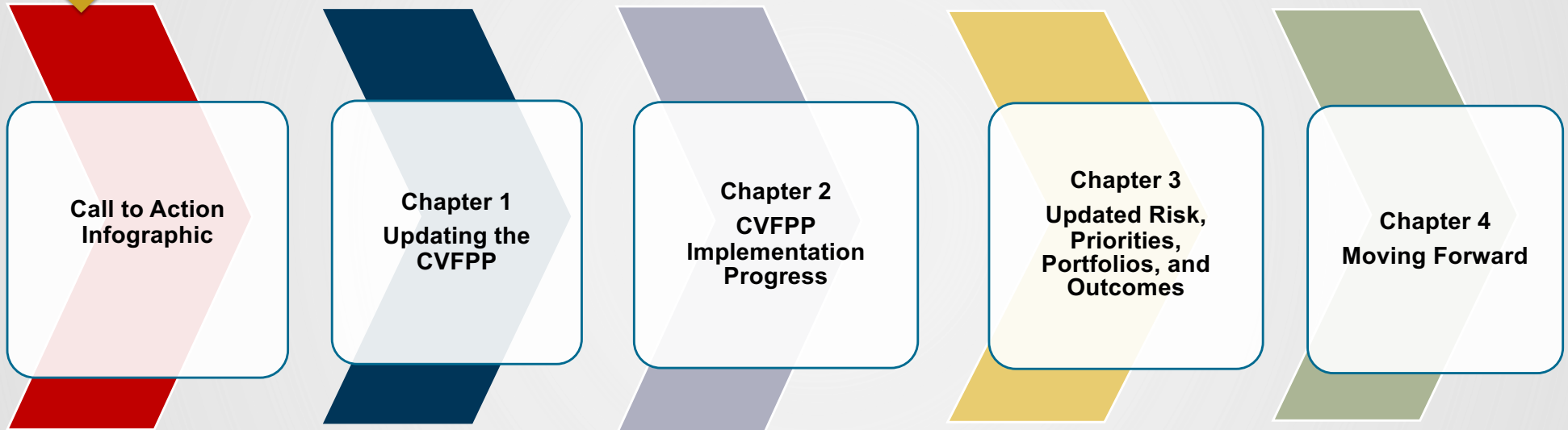


- Builds on the 2017 CVFPP Update, informed by new information
- Assesses progress and effectiveness of investments from the previous cycle
- Identifies updated investments and recommendations for continued implementation over the next 30 years
- SSIA is adapting with the planning process and as variables are better understood (such as climate change, performance tracking, and policies)
