SB 1383 Update

- Uniform Lid Color Requirements
- Commercial Enforcement of Organics and Recycling
- Residential Waste Audits to Reduce Contamination
- Procurement of 2,051 tons of Compost
- Textile Reuse/Recycling Program



Edible Food Recovery

- 66 lbs. collected in first month of program
- Signed agreement between EVM and ECCC
- Signed agreement between Yolo County and ECCC
- 195 People Served last month with recovered food
- County/City draft funding agreement for regional projects



Illegal Dumping

- Farm & Ranch Grant Camera Install on Babel Slough Road (24/7 monitoring)
- Started 6 Month Long Ed/Outreach Campaign at YCCL
- FY 22-23 IWM Budget (WM & Recology Funding) to provide:
 - 2 Dumpsters / District
 - Labor crew for waste cleanup
 - IWM certified staff for hazardous waste, appliance, tire and electronic waste collection and disposal
