

RESOLUTION NO. _____

(Resolution Establishing an Appropriations Limit for the
County of Yolo for the 2021-22 Fiscal Year)

WHEREAS, Article XIII-B of the California Constitution and Division 9 of Title I of the Government Code (commencing with Section 7900) require that an appropriations limit be established for each local agency and provide that each local agency's total annual appropriations which are subject to that limit shall not exceed the limit; and

WHEREAS, Article XIII-B provides that the annual appropriations limit for each fiscal year shall be based upon the appropriations limit for the prior fiscal year adjusted for the change in the cost of living and the change in population, as defined; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer, in the role as the Auditor-Controller of this County, has made computations of the appropriations limits of the County in accordance with the method prescribed by law and has recommended adoption of those appropriations limits; and

WHEREAS, the documentation used in the determination of the appropriations limits set herein has been available to the public for a period of not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the adoption of this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desires to set the appropriations limit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo, as follows:

1. Each of the foregoing recitals is true and correct.
2. This resolution is adopted at a regularly scheduled meeting of this Board of Supervisors.
3. This Board of Supervisors determines that the County of Yolo appropriations limit for the 2021-22 fiscal year is \$3,764,172,934.


