Resolution No. 22-138

Recognizing Sheryl Hardy-Salgado upon her retirement

WHEREAS, Sheryl Hardy-Salgado has served the County of Yolo for twenty-two years from 2000 to 2022 starting as an Accounting Technician in the elected Auditor-Controller's Office and rapidly rose through the ranks experiencing several promotions to a Senior Accounting Technician, Accountant Auditor, Accountant, and then Senior Accountant by 2004; and

WHEREAS, when the elected Auditor-Controller's Office transitioned to the appointed Department of Financial Services in 2015, Sheryl's position was adjusted to Property Tax Supervisor to reflect the complex and technical nature of her work; and

WHEREAS, during Sheryl's time with the County of Yolo, she performed the statutory duties of the Auditor-Controller in relationship to the property tax system which extends the tax roll, maintains tax rates, enrolls direct charges, and distributes property tax proceeds to taxing agencies including the county, cities, school districts, special districts, among others; and

WHEREAS, Sheryl maintained productive and harmonious relationships with her counterparts in the Assessor and Tax Collector offices to ensure timely and efficient assessment, collection, and distribution of over 63,000 tax bills totaling approximately \$442 million annually; and

WHEREAS, Sheryl was instrumental in improving and creating efficiencies in the property tax administration in Yolo County through the creation of the Property Tax Administrative Group (PTAG), undertaking cleanup of the Tax Rate Areas with the Board of Equalization and LAFCO, and educating numerous Special Districts on the interworking as to the processes of property taxes and direct charges processes; and

WHEREAS, in addition to her regular duties, Sheryl has been an active member as part of the Professional and Supervisor Association since 2008 holding the roles of Board Member, Treasurer, and President and has worked to vigorously represent the needs of employees while also working fairly with the County on numerous matters improving the health and welfare of the workforce; and

WHEREAS, through her service Sheryl has ensured the County and local agencies have the funding needed to operate and has enhanced the lives of the people of Yolo County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors commends and thanks Sheryl Hardy-Salgado for her many years of dedicated service to the citizens of the County of Yolo and wishes her a long, happy, and healthy retirement.
