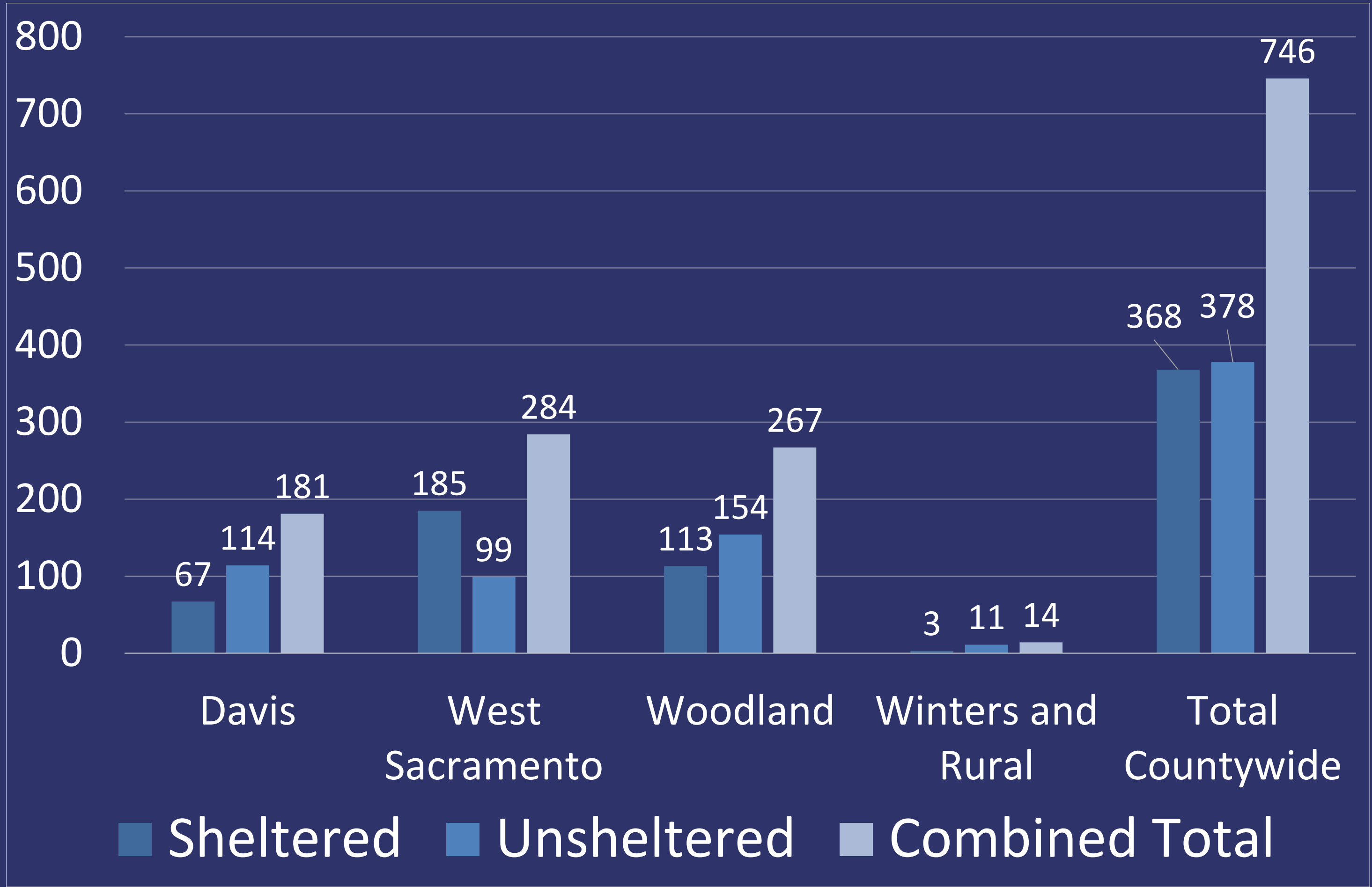

Commission to Address Homelessness

Mission :

- Achieve Functional Homelessness in Yolo County

Purpose:

- Collaborate on regional policy and implementation strategies, affordable housing development, and systemic change to promote an effective response to homelessness

Function:

- Ensure the implementation of the goals and strategies that address and achieve functional homelessness in the County
- Promote coordination and integration of resources to improve the countywide response to homelessness

Yolo County

Commission to Address Homelessness

Funding decisions:

- SB2 – \$136,610
- HHAP – \$104,045
- HHAP round 2 – \$326,778
- HHAP round 3 – \$785,208
- Upcoming: HHIP \$6,303,760

Continuum of Care HPAC

- Homeless Poverty Action Coalition (HPAC) – a county-wide planning body that coordinates housing and services funding for homeless families and individuals
- Federal (HUD) funds and State allocated (CoC) funds
- As of March 2021, HPAC is now a private, nonprofit public benefit corporation with 501c(3) status
- 15 Member Board:
 - 5 seats for new organizations – including one for a person with lived experience
 - 5 seats for legacy organizations
 - 5 Ex officio seats – County, Woodland, W Sac, Davis, YCH
- As of September 2022, the Executive Director position is filled

Project RoomKey Outcomes



As of 11/3 a total of 1051 individuals assisted with over 100,349 nights of shelter provided



36 individuals currently provided shelter via Project Roomkey



94 individuals permanently housed during Project Roomkey
45 individuals permanently housed during Project Homekey



Multiple COVID-19 onsite tests when clients appeared symptomatic and overflow beds available and used for shelter outbreaks



Yolo County Strategic Plan



Goal: Thriving Residents

- Support social, economic, and physical environments which promote good health and protect vulnerable populations so that community members and future generations have the opportunity to learn and grow to their full potential.

Outcome:

- Achieve “functional zero” in homelessness with a demonstrated reduction in people experiencing homelessness countywide.

Metrics:

- # of permanent supportive housing units available in Yolo County, minus the # of people experiencing homelessness
- # of people experiencing homelessness on any given night in Yolo County

Current and Upcoming Projects



- 217 current permanent supportive housing units
- Upcoming Projects:
 - Paul's Place – 18 PSH units



- 102 current permanent supportive housing units
- Upcoming Projects
 - West Gateway Place Phase II – 6 PSH units



- 138 current permanent supportive housing units
- Upcoming Projects:
 - Family Interim Housing Program

- Ongoing COVID-19 mitigation needs/concerns
- Governor's budget for asset acquisition
- American Rescue Plan funding
- Finalizing 2023-26 Plan to Address Homelessness
