

YOLO COUNTY GRAND JURY
CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This document and the attached Appendices, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the Yolo County Grand Jury.

Individuals holding designated positions shall file their statements of economic interests with the Grand Jury's filing official, which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction in accordance with state law. (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.) For purposes of this code, the geographical jurisdiction of the Grand Jury includes all of Yolo County, including its incorporated and unincorporated areas.

Appendix B
GRAND JURY
CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE
DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES FOR DESIGNATED
POSITIONS

CATEGORY 1: Investments and business positions in business entities, interests in real property and sources of income or gifts from any sources which are subject to the investigative (“watchdog”) authority of the Grand Jury. Such sources include the County, cities within the County, special districts within the County, joint power agencies located within the County, redevelopment successor agencies located within the County, the Yolo Housing Authority, the Yolo Local Agency Formation Commission, and nonprofit corporations established by or operated on behalf of a local public entity within the County.

Note: This category is based on Category 4 in the Appendix of Disclosure Categories attached to the Yolo County Conflict of Interest Code. It has been adapted here for application to the Grand Jury. Nothing in this Conflict of Interest Code is intended to require the disclosure of exempt matters, such as the address of a juror’s personal residence, on a Form 700.
