**A RESOLUTION OF THE YOLO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
RATIFYING THE PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY  
DUE TO THE 2022-23 WINTER STORMS**

**WHEREAS**, starting December 27, 2022, ongoing rain and high winds from multiple continuing storm events impacted Yolo County and projected storms threaten to worsen these impacts; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Yolo County Code section 2-2.3106, the County Administrator is authorized to act as the Director of Emergency Services and to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not in session; and

**WHEREAS**, acting pursuant to this authority, on January 4, 2023, the Director of Emergency Services issued a "Resolution Proclaiming Existence of a Local Emergency Within the County of Yolo" (the "Proclamation"), a copy of which is attached hereto, due to the storm events described above; and

**WHEREAS**, to remain in effect for a period in excess of seven (7) days, the Proclamation must be ratified by the Board of Supervisors; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section §8630 of the California Government Code, the Board of Supervisors must review, at least every sixty (60) days, the need for continuing the local emergency; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies the Proclamation signed by the Director of Emergency Services on January 4, 2023, and extends the Proclamation for the next sixty (60) days, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors shall review, at least every sixty (60) days until such emergency is terminated, the need for continuing the local emergency; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that, commencing with the effective date of this Resolution, the Director of Emergency Services or designee is directed to return to the Board of Supervisors, at least every sixty (60) days until the emergency is terminated, with a report and recommendation if there is need to continue the local emergency.

# ATTACHMENT

**RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY  
WITHIN THE COUNTY OF YOLO**

WHEREAS, Government Code § 8630 and Yolo County Code §2-2.3106 authorize the County Administrator to act as the Director of Emergency Services and to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the County of Yolo is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the Yolo County Director of Emergency Services does hereby find as follows:

- (1) Conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within Yolo County as a result of a series of major storm events with substantial rain and high winds that impacted Yolo County starting December 27, 2022;
- (2) These conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of any single local government or the combined resources of government agencies within Yolo County; and
- (3) The Yolo County Board of Supervisors is not in session and cannot be immediately called into session.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors will be requested to ratify this Proclamation within seven days of its execution by the Director of Emergency Services, as required by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct, and a local emergency now exists throughout the County of Yolo.
2. During the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the County and its Office of Emergency Services shall be those prescribed by state law and by local ordinances, resolutions, and plans.
