

2022 Legislative Update & 2023 Legislative Advocacy Policy, Priorities, and Budget Requests



2022 Update

- County took positions on 13 bills in the 2022 legislative session (Att. A)
- Received \$11.5m in state budget appropriations
 - \$6.5m for the Capay Valley Health and Community Center
 - \$5m for the Knight's Landing Park, Viz Fazio Wildlife Area, Yolo Crisis Nursery expansion, and the Underserved Farmer's Cooperative
 - Anticipate receiving funds in March-April 2023
- 2022 Water Resources Development Act Authorizations
 - \$6m in environmental infrastructure funding for Madison
 - \$50m for water and wastewater infrastructure in the Delta
 - Still require a Congressional appropriation
 - FY 2024 appropriations would not begin to flow until October 2023 at the earliest

2023 Advocacy Policy, Priorities, and Budget Requests

- Proposed updates to Advocacy Policy (Att. B)
- 2023 Proposed Legislative Priorities:
 - Monitor funding programs and allocations included within the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and the Inflation Reduction Act to receive its fair share of funding to address critical infrastructure and public service needs, particularly in disadvantaged communities
 - In conjunction with CSAC and other partners, advocate to ensure a long-term sustainable funding source for forthcoming CARE Court service mandates
- Opportunity for state budget appropriations less likely than prior years, potential asks include:
 - Historic Courthouse 3rd floor renovations
 - Adult Day Health Center project
 - I-505 Overcrossing
 - Road 32A Separated Grade Crossing
