Amendment # 2

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT is made this First day of July, 2023 by and between the County of Yolo (“COUNTY”) and First 5 Yolo Child & Family Commission, (“SUBRECIPIENT”), who agree as follows:

AMENDED TERMS

1. The Subaward Project Period is amended to extend the Project Period by one year and update the End Date to October 31, 2024.
2. The maximum reimbursements for costs incurred under this Subaward is amended to add an additional three-hundred thousand (\$300,00) for a total maximum amount of two-million three-hundred thousand dollars (\$2,300,000) in accordance with the Yolo County Board of Supervisors action on April 12, 2022.
3. Attachment 4A - ARP Performance Measures Template is amended to align Performance Measures with updated program protocols. Activities attached hereto as Exhibit A shall replace Attachment 4A - ARP Performance Measures in the Original Agreement and any subsequent Amendments in its entirety.
4. Attachment 5, Statement of Work is amended to clarify program activities in consideration of the extended Project Period. Activities attached hereto as Exhibit B shall replace Attachment 5- Statement of Work in the Original Agreement and any subsequent Amendments in its entirety.
5. Attachment 6 is revised to modify the budget to increase funds to include a minimum level of dedicated FTE to ensure program goals are achieved, as follows:

**ATTACHMENT 5 – STATEMENT OF WORK**

1. Subrecipient shall perform the deliverables, services, and tasks as specified in the statement of work  Below; or  Attached - X pages

The objective is for First 5 Yolo to mitigate toxic stress from the COVID-19 pandemic for vulnerable families by implementing Welcome Baby, a broad-based nurse and community health worker home visiting programs for all babies born in Yolo County on Medi-Cal or no insurance.

The activities to be completed under scope of work include:

- A) Completed by qualified contractors, consultants and/or direct service agencies under supervision of First 5 Yolo:
- i. Offer and enroll all families in Welcome Baby after birth if on Medi-Cal or no insurance
  - ii. In collaboration with First 5 Yolo, coordinate with local hospitals and medical systems to support identification of eligible families and establish referral pathways into Welcome Baby
  - iii. Identify, hire, and train Welcome Baby personnel
  - iv. Provide staff training in Baby Basics (or similar), Trauma-Informed Care, and other culturally sensitive and family-centered material
  - v. Provide one registered nurse/medical personnel home visit within two weeks of hospital discharge that includes maternal and child health check, lactation support, depression and general risk screen, direct connection to COVID-19 vaccinations if needed, and connection to community resources
  - vi. Provide up to two community healthcare worker visits in the following weeks that provide an in-depth risk screen and connection to community resources
  - vii. Enroll high-risk families into more intensive home visiting services through The CHILD Project: Road to Resilience (R2R)
  - viii. Expand home visiting capacity within R2R to increase case load capacity within the program and provide home visits up to one year
  - ix. Evaluate data from Welcome Baby to assess programmatic and community impact
- B) Completed by First 5 Yolo:
- i. Co-fund the project up to \$125,000 over two years
  - ii. Provide program design, high-level and comprehensive program management and oversight of Welcome Baby
  - iii. In collaboration with direct service agencies, identify and coordinate with local hospitals and medical systems to support identification of eligible families and establish referral pathways into Welcome Baby
  - iv. Collaborate with home visiting programs and early childhood agencies to strengthen partnerships and coordination across the County
  - v. Collaborate with data evaluation partners to ensure accurate data collection

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- vi. Develop compatible intake and risk screening tools
- vii. Along with partners, build engagement and capacity of home visiting services by supporting a coordinated entry point (i.e., Welcome Baby)
- viii. Provide First 5 New Parent Kits, Baby Basics (or similar) health literacy materials, and other concrete supports to all participating families
- ix. Strengthen connections between home visiting programs and the healthcare system by aligning common metrics
- x. Inform and engage the partners and the public about current trends in maternal and child health and develop a shared understanding of COVID-19 effects on young children and families from Welcome Baby data

Target Unique Families Served across three years: 1,690

Target Unique Individuals Served (mother and baby): 3,380

Program Design Assumptions:

- 50-70% of all Medi-Cal births (mother/child) accept and receive 1 nurse home visit within 1-2 weeks postpartum (note: all Medi-Cal births will be offered a nurse home visit)
- ~90% of those receiving a nurse home visit will be eligible to receive and offered a first Community Health Worker visit
- ~80% of those receiving a nurse home visit will be eligible and offered a second Community Health Worker Visit
