Program Purpose	To provide residential treatment services for eligible Seriously Mentally Ill (SMI) adults referred by Yolo County Health & Human Services, to reduce psychiatric hospital stays, reduce Institute for Mental Disease (IMD) placements, and reduce risk of homelessness for those served. Goal #1: Reduction in utilization of higher levels of care after graduating the program Goal #2: Reduction in severity of psychiatric symptom presentation	
Program Information	Long-term residential (typically 1 – 2 years) treatment program in a rural setting, offering cooperative living and working skill development opportunities, assisting individuals to transition from highly structured treatment environments to less structured independent living situations.

1.1	# individuals served, annually Goal: 10 unique individuals served	
PM2: How well did we do it?		
2.1	80% of clients referred into the program will graduate within 18 months	
2.2	85% of those served will report lower severity of symptoms on their six-month survey	
PM3: Is anyone better off?		
3.1	80% of clients served will not suffer incarceration, emergency department visits, or psychiatric hospital use of at least one year from discharge.	
3.2	85% of clients served will experience reduced higher level of care events during their Farmhouse stay and for at least one year from discharge.
