Dear Chairman Villegas and Honorable Members of the Yolo County Board of Supervisors

I am asking the Yolo County Board of Supervisors to provide Oversight to the Colusa Basin Drainage District. It is my understanding based on a two-year interaction with the Yolo County Counsel's office and helpful information from the Clerk's Office that there is not current Oversight by the Yolo County Board of Supervisors for this Public Agency even though the Yolo County Board of Supervisors has appointed and reappointed the Chair and Vice-Chair for over two decades. I do not have information about what Oversight may have occurred in the past, but it does seem clear that Yolo County has essentially given control of this Agency to two serial Yolo County Board of Supervisor's appointees with no current Oversight. I have attached the Yolo County Board of Supervisor's Assignments which does not include any Board Assignment for the Colusa Basin Drainage District among the over 200 current Board Assignments (as attached).

The Colusa Basin Drainage District ("CBDD") is a regional governmental public agency formed in 1987 by the California State Legislature pursuant to the Colusa Basin Drainage Act with a primary purpose of managing floodwaters, improving drainage, and preventing subsidence.

- Section 21 of the Colusa Basin Drainage Act states: The problems of flooding and winter drainage, irrigation drainage, and subsidence which are occurring within the Colusa Basin are multicounty in scope but are unique to the Colusa Basin and are not general or statewide. A special act to address these problems is, therefore, necessary.
- The CBDD encompasses 1,036,000 acres in the Colusa Basin Watershed across Yolo, Colusa and Glenn Counties and includes **18,171** parcels who have been paying assessments since District formation.
- There are 1275 assessed Parcels in Yolo County, 11,107 assessed Parcels in Colusa County and 5789 assessed Parcels in Glenn County. Homeowners from Dunnigan to Willows have been paying an assessment from this District under the control of Yolo County appointees for 27 years. Every homeowner located in the CBDD 1,1030,000 jurisdiction pay at least \$ 5 to the CBDD and in Colusa County pay \$6 since the County collects a \$ 1 fee
- The Yolo County Board of Supervisors have appointed an ex- Yolo County Supervisor Lynell Pollack since her Term as Supervisor ended and Ms. Pollack had been Chair of the CBDD for at **least 24 years** until Mr. Tibbitts became Chair in 2023. Mr. Tibbitts has been a Director since 2002. Ms Pollack is now Vice Chair of the CBDD.
- District III for which Ms. Pollack has been appointed for the last 24 years not only includes all of the District area in Yolo County but also **the Disadvantaged Communities of Grimes, College City and** Arbuckle located in Colusa County (see attached CBDD Election Map). Ms. Pollack has been Chair of a Public Agency in a District that has been assessing

Disadvantaged Community homeowners in Colusa County for 27 years.

- There has not been any Oversight for this District by the Yolo County Board of Supervisors for the CBBB at least since the Term of Supervisor Barajas began to the best of my understanding.

During the 27-year Existence of the CBBB as a Public Agency it does not appear to me that there has been any public benefit generally and definitely no public benefit to justify the 27 years of assessments collected by homeowners in the District. What does appear to have happened is mismanagement of public assets, lack of transparency and an attempted violation of the California Public Contract Law which has led to a California Government Code 1090 Inquiry.

- Under Chair Pollack's leadership transparency has been severely restricted. **There was not a website for the District until mid-2022.**
- Under Chair Pollack's leadership the CBBB **has purchased a 2942-acre cattle ranch in Glenn County.** At first the purchased was supposed to be a flood water storage and recharge site but in recent years the property has been mismanaged. Public funds are being used to make installment payments of principal and interest on the debt used to purchase the property while a luxury house which was occupied by the seller has fallen in disrepair and currently has acorns in its walls and mosquitos in the swimming pool. Another house on the property has been rented to a local rancher for the same \$ 525 per month with no rent adjustment for at least 12 years. The ranch has significant indigenous cultural significance – there are indigenous stone etchings on a rock formation which appears to be a washing site and at least two bodies were moved in anticipation of the failed project.
- Under Chair Pollack's leadership the wife of then Director Bill Vanderwaal was selected as new General Manager of the District while he was still Director. As part of the Services to be provided Mr. Vanderwaal was designated as a paid Consultant to his wife. CBBB Counsel has confirmed that a 1090 inquiry was initiated and consequently a new RFP process was initiated whereby Ms. Vanderwaal was again selected at General Manager but Mr. Vanderwaal is no longer a paid consultant to his wife. At the time of the first Contract relating to the 1090 inquiry Mr. Vanderwaal was General Manager of the Dunnigan Irrigation District and Deputy Manager of RD108.

It is time to provide Oversight for the Colusa Basin Drainage District by the Yolo County Board of Supervisors and demand that the CBBB operates under the principals of good government and transparency that are the hallmark of the **YOLO WAY** directives.

- A Public Agency with a focus on flood management and drainage should not be in the business of purchasing a cattle ranch and managing rentals for no public purpose. This asset is most likely worth over \$ 3 million dollars which is what farmers and homeowners have paid in assessments for over 27 years. This asset is a valuable mitigation asset and can be sold. **CBBB Taxpayers deserve their money back because otherwise the asset will be sold in the future and proceeds will be misused.**
- The Yolo County Board of Supervisors should make appointments to the CBBB in consultation with residents of the Colusa County Disadvantaged Communities in District

III. The directive given to Yolo County Board of Supervisor appointees should be consistent with the values of Yolo County today and not of what may have been nearly 3 decades ago. **The CBBB should be about Multi-Benefit projects that help farmers, taxpayers, the environment and reflect the hopes and aspirations of the residents of the Colusa County Disadvantaged Communities within District III.**

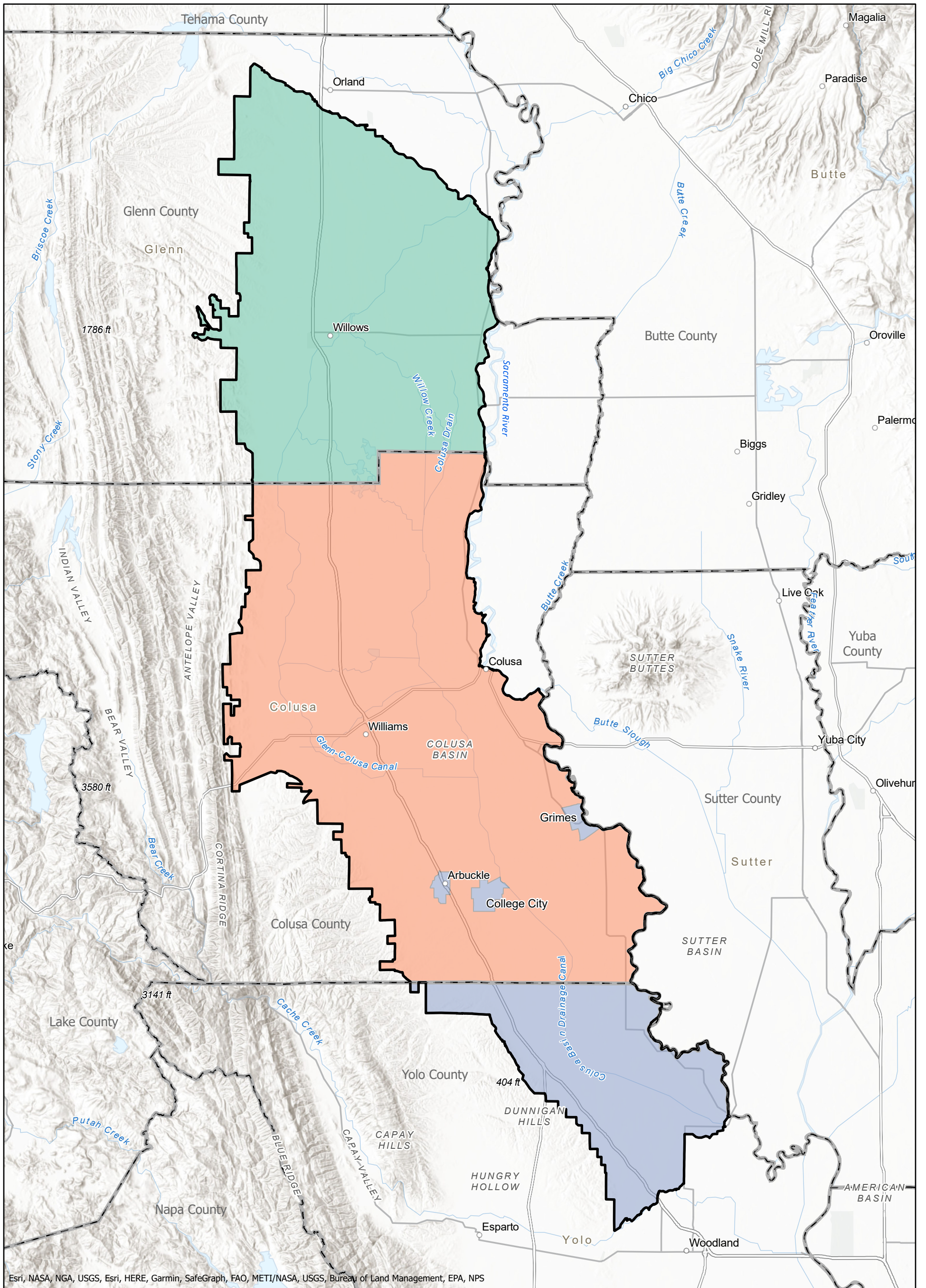
- The Yolo County Board of Supervisor's should discuss the 1090 inquiry with Yolo County Counsel's office and report out on this inquiry in the interest of good government and transparency. I have had correspondence with Mr. Pogledich over the last two years, but it is not clear if any remedial action has been taken regarding the 1090 inquiry of the leadership at the CBBB.

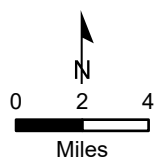

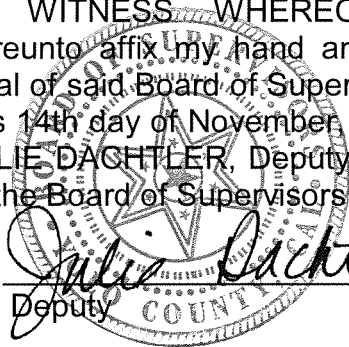

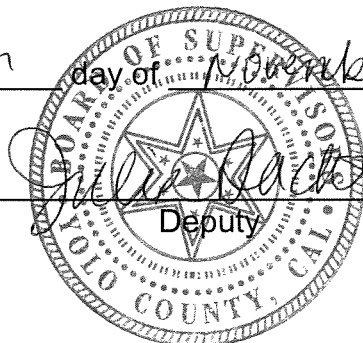
