Resolution Recognizing Michael Martinez for his Service to Yolo County

WHEREAS, Michael Martinez began his employment with the County of Yolo as a Geographic Information Specialist I in November 1995 serving until March 2007; and

WHEREAS, Michael Martinez returned to the County of Yolo in November 2014 as an Information Technology Manager and promoted to Projects Division Manager in September 2022; and

WHEREAS, Michael Martinez has accepted an opportunity to be the County of Mono's Director of Information Technology after serving the County of Yolo for more than twenty years; and

WHEREAS, Michael Martinez is recognized from the California State Association of Counties' Institute for Excellence as a Credentialed California County Technology Executive and from the Project Management Institute as a certified Project Management Professional; and

WHEREAS, during Michael Martinez's twenty years at the County his contributions to information technology are that he singlehandedly digitized all 10,000 plus assessor parcel maps into one GIS layer; revitalized the County's GIS program, was instrumental in developing the first data sharing agreement for the Yolo Area GIS Cooperative, led the conversion of the County's GIS platform to industry standard; was an instrumental part of the 2000 Board District Realignment project; and oversaw the development of an eDiscovery solution for the District Attorney's Office and Public Defender Department.

WHEREAS, Michael Martinez diligently served the County during the COVID-19 pandemic as one of three Emergency Operations Center's Operations Section Chief; and

WHEREAS, during Michael Martinez's time as a Projects Division Manager, he developed a new capital projects program managing over 90 facilities and infrastructure projects, most notably the Yolo Branch Library, the siting and installation of several electric vehicle charging stations, the replacement of seven roofs as part of first round of the countywide roofing replacement efforts; the construction of the Tuli Mem Park Shade Structure, the reuse of Pacifico housing, the facility redesign for Crisis Now, and the Board Chambers redesign.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors expresses their sincere appreciation and gratitude to Michael Martinez for his years of service to the County of Yolo and wishes him the best of luck in his future endeavors.
