


Jim McMullin West Plainfield Fire Protection District President:





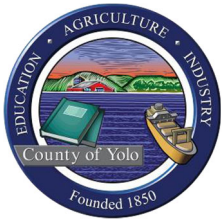
