Subject: Put on agenda and vote on ceasefire resolution

We as your constituents (many personally affected) have now passed 100 nightmarish days of Israel killing over 10,000 (I repeat, over 10,000!) children (we're talking about infants and toddlers) with our highest elected official's political and financial backing using our tax dollars.
