**Resolution No. 24-74**

***Recognizing June as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer  
(LGBTQ+) Pride Month in Yolo County***

**WHEREAS**, Pride Month is celebrated yearly in June to commemorate the June 1969 Stonewall Riots which took place in New York City, during which Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and/or Questioning (LGBTQ+) individuals engaged in civil disobedience to combat discrimination and demand protections and rights for their identities, an event which would become a cornerstone for the LGBTQ+ movement; and

**WHEREAS**, although there has been remarkable progress towards acceptance and equality in recent years, the rights of LGBTQ+ Americans remain under attack with anti-LGBTQ+ legislation passed in states across the country, particularly targeting transgender children and their parents; and

**WHEREAS**, we unequivocally condemn the rise in LGBTQ+ hate across the United States and in Yolo County and call upon everyone to provide a safe space for LGBTQ+ individuals to coexist within our society free from harassment and bullying; and

**WHEREAS**, while California state law addresses discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying towards LGBTQ+ individuals, there is a need to focus on localized efforts that support the LGBTQ+ community with resources that focus on positive behavioral interactions and support among our service delivery systems, schools, families and business community; and

**WHEREAS**, Pride Month offers the community an opportunity to join in the national reflection of the strides and work still left to do to bring true equality to the LGBTQ+ community and recommit to celebrating and embracing the work of individuals and organizations who have continuously fought to create equality for all.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims June as Pride Month in the County of Yolo and affirms our support for our LGBTQ+ residents and stands with them to protect their civil rights and ability to live openly without fear and protect their human rights.
