I was happy to run into Lucas at Picnic Day, and share my news that I am departing from my current job Health Access this summer to become the Executive Director of Families USA, our national counterpart as the health care consumer advocacy voice in Congress and the Administration in Washington, DC. Alas, this means that I will need to resign from the Yolo County Library Advisory Board this summer. I am seeing if I can make the June meeting, but afterwards I won't be able to make the meetings since I will be moving to DC. (FYI, I won't be a stranger: I will be keeping my home in Davis, for family holidays and for my wife's field seasons: she is a US Forest Service scientist, and while she works remotely and can and will move with me, her trees can't, so she'll have a home base for when she's visiting various field sites. So I'll be happy to visit Davis and Yolo County often.)

It's been a privilege to be on the Library Advisory Board over the last decade, including being chair for several years. I'm particularly proud of helping the Library through the transitions of County Librarians from Patty to Mark to Diana, serving on the interview committee that hired Mark, and serving on the Facilities Master Plan. It's been great to see the items of the Master Plan checked off in this last decade, from the replacement and reopening of the Yolo Branch library, to the improvements to the Archives and other branches, to the bookmobile to better serve the rural areas and migrant

camps. I'm especially happy about the progress of the South Davis branch, given my son attended Spanish immersion elementary at Montgomery and our affection for that community.

Thanks again for your continuing commitment to libraries, and for the opportunity. Let me know what I can do to assist the transition. Thank you!
