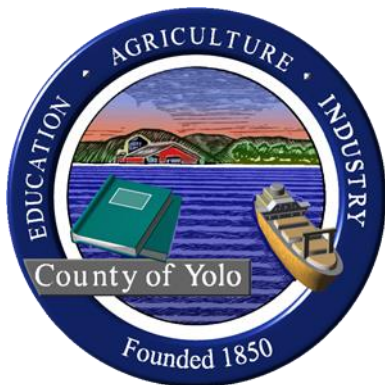

California Food and Agriculture Code mandates Crop Report

2023 Highlights

- The gross value of Yolo County's agricultural production for 2023 was **\$901,862,000**
- This represents an increase of \$205,853,000 or approximately **23%** above 2022's value of \$696,009,000
- **Processing Tomatoes** value remained strong in 2023. With a value of \$236,717,000, tomatoes hold the top spot for a second year in a row.
- **Almonds** follow tomatoes, with a value of \$120,922,000. Growers harvested typical yields in 2023 which resulted in a significant increase in tonnage in comparison to 2022.

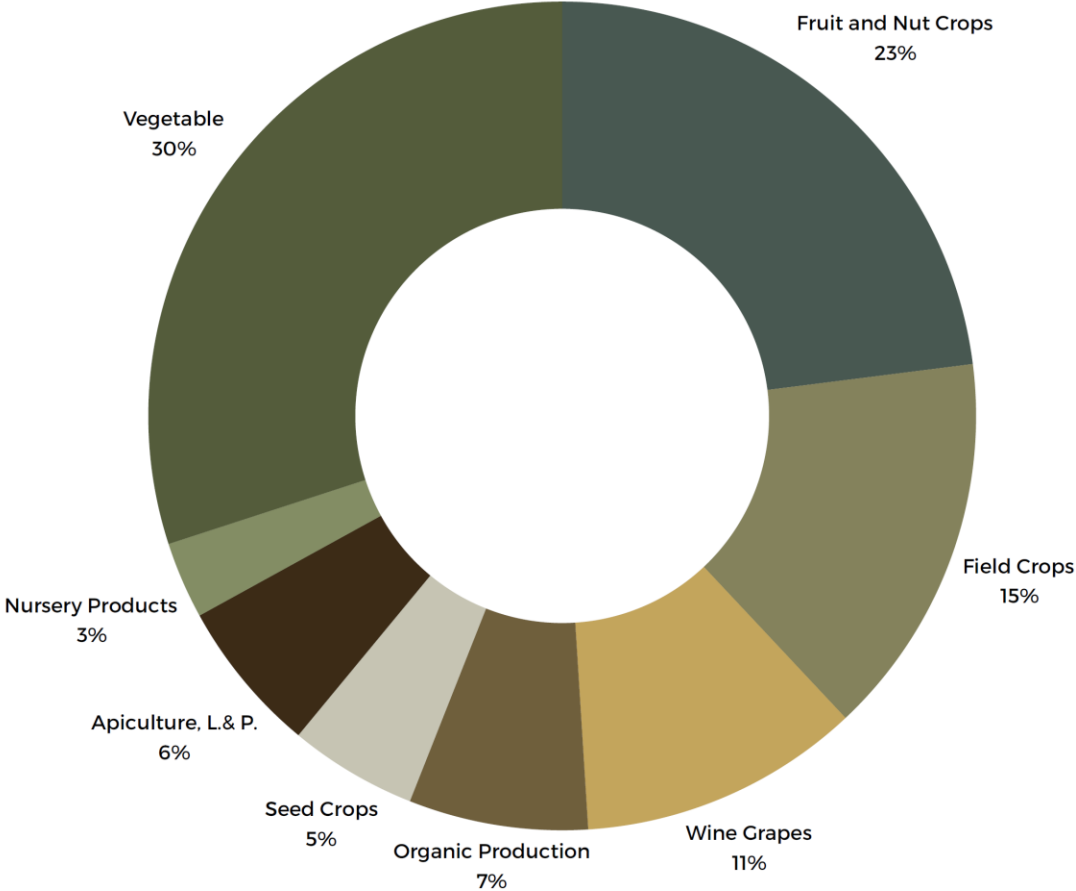
