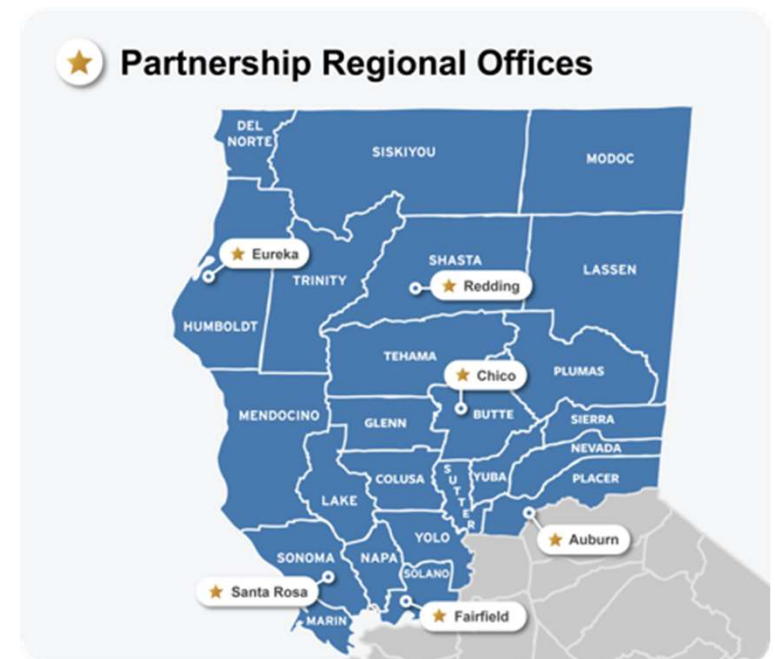

Local Governance

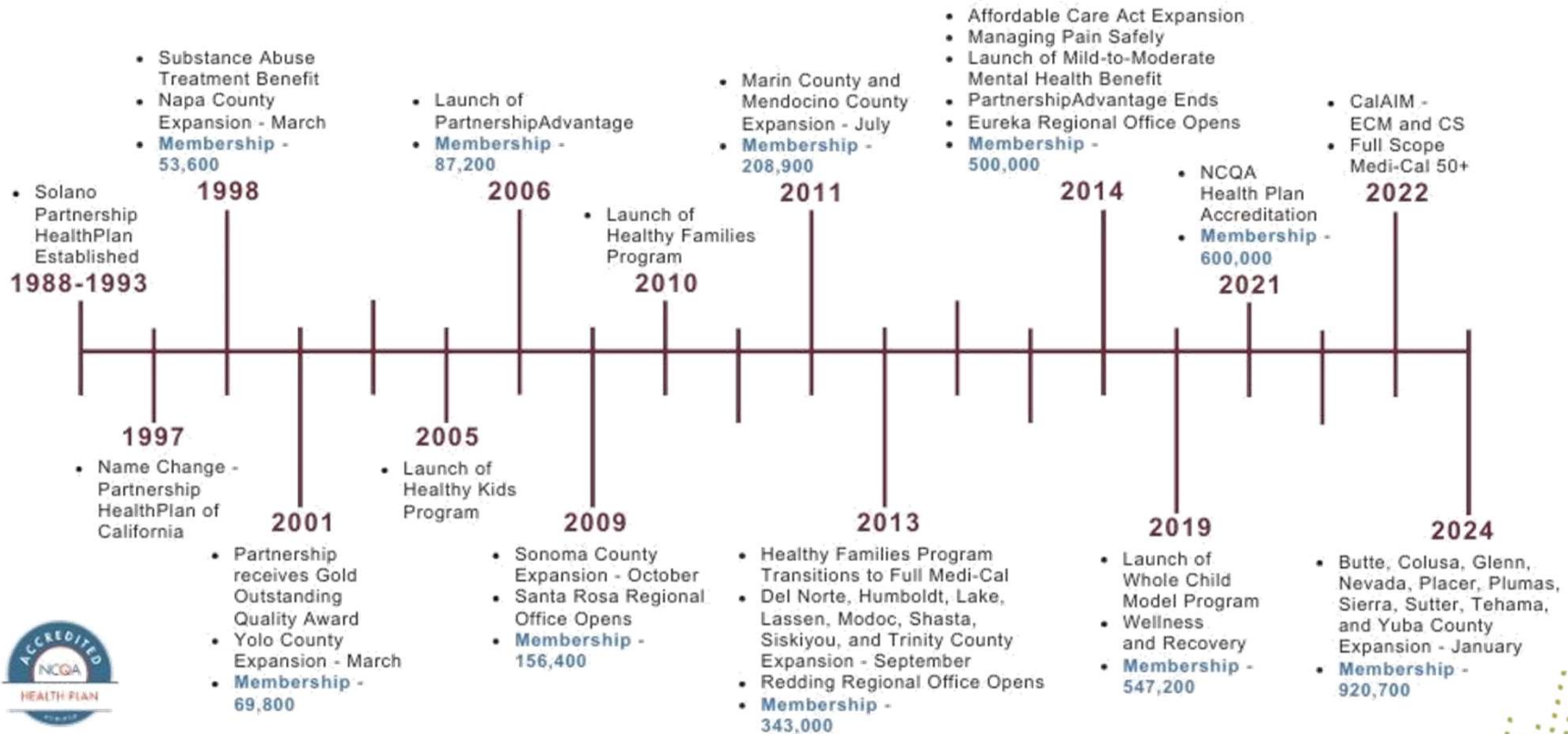
- A local governance that is sensitive and responsive to the area's healthcare needs

With multi-year state investments in Medi-Cal, Partnership and other managed care plans are adding new covered services to support the health of our members

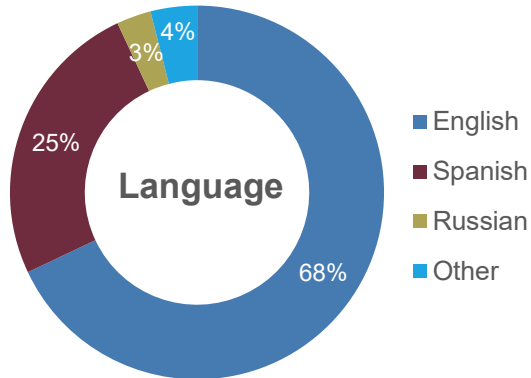

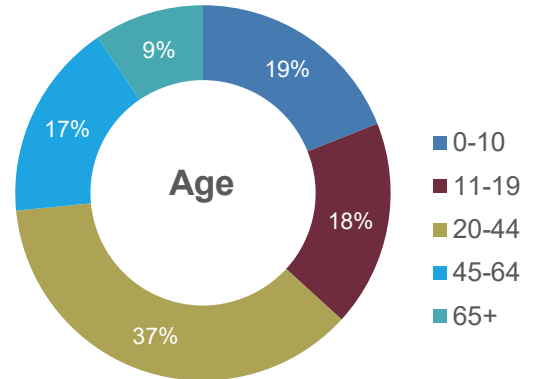
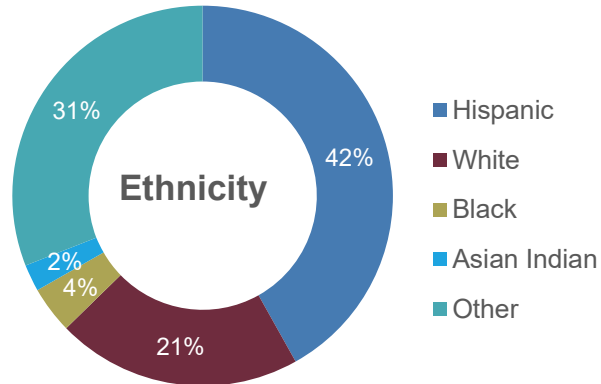
Yolo County – Membership and Provider Network

32% of members are best-served in a language other than English

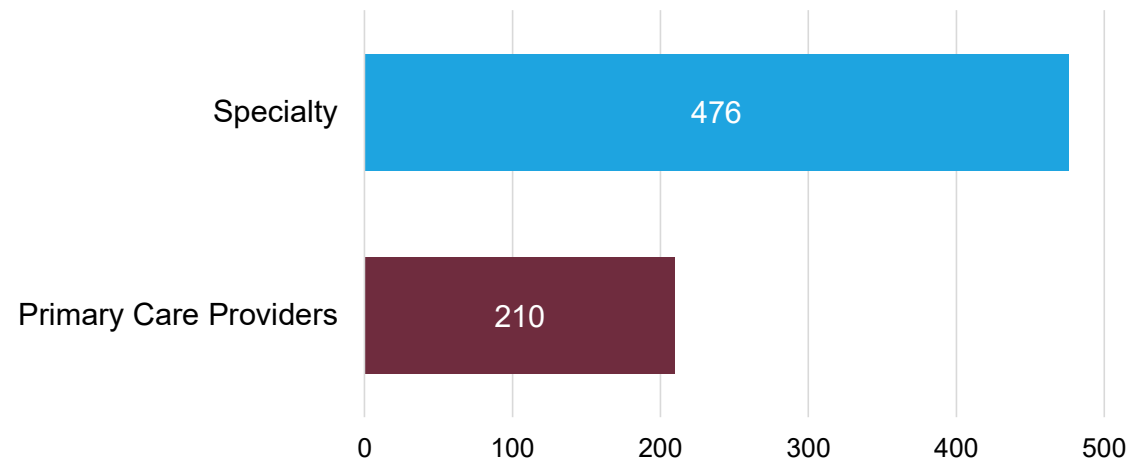


74% of members are under age 44

Programs and Community Investments

CalAIM: Transformation of Medi-Cal

CalAIM is a multi-year, multi-initiative framework implemented by the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) starting in 2022 and continuing over 5 years. The overarching goal is to **standardize, simplify, and streamline** how members access care.

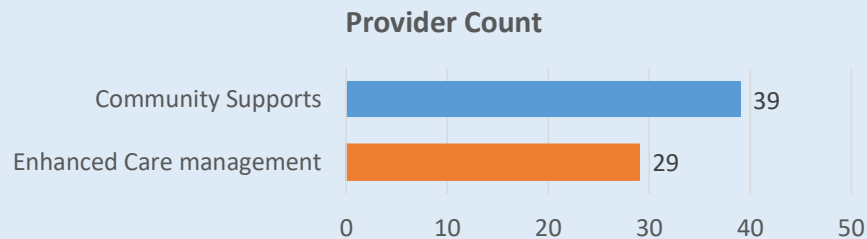
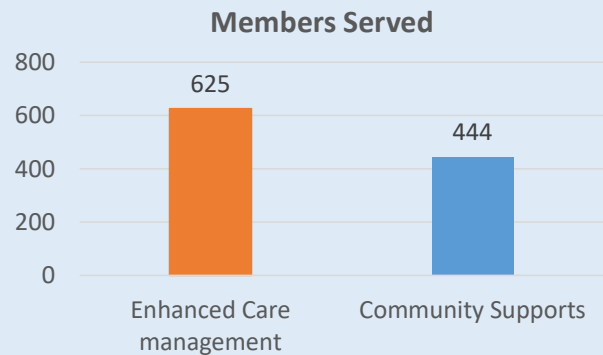

ECM and Community Supports provide extra support and care management to members with high-needs including SUD, mental health, and housing.

Yolo County Program Snapshot: 2022-Present



We are working to grow and strengthen our network of CalAIM services by:

- Offering local information sessions to interested providers
- Partnering with state and local organizations to offer technical assistance
- Hosting office-hours three times monthly for organizations new to Medi-Cal

Provider Recruitment and Retention Programs

Since 2014 Partnership's Provider Recruitment Program (PRP) has awarded bonus payments to organizations to recruit doctors, behavioral health providers and advanced practice clinicians. **Since inception 61 providers have been awarded in Yolo County.**

In January 2024 Partnership launched a Provider Retention Initiative Pilot to award long-practicing providers who lead and mentor others at organizations.

2024/2025 PRP includes:

- \$100,000 for physicians (FM, IM, Peds, OB, Psych)
- \$120,000 for medical residents training in the region
- \$50,000 for NP/PAs, Certified Nurse Midwives
- \$20,000 Licensed behavioral health professionals
- Up to \$5,000 for Cert. Substance Use Counselors
- Up to \$5,000 moving and \$1,000 site visit reimbursement to help offset recruitment costs

Bonus payments made over multiple years based on clinician type.

Since January 2024:

- 14 providers approved for \$460,500 in recruitment awards
- 3 providers approved for \$105,000 in retention awards

Community Investments - Yolo County 2024

Each year, Partnership reinvests funds to our providers to support our network in delivering high-quality, comprehensive care.



\$2.3M to county and community groups to prevent and reduce homelessness



\$565,500 funds approved to healthcare organizations for recruitment and retention of healthcare providers within Yolo County



\$5.3M in funds to develop and support a network of CalAIM providers in Yolo County



\$3.9M for healthcare providers through the Quality Incentive Program. Providers earn dollars for meeting measures on screening and management of disease
