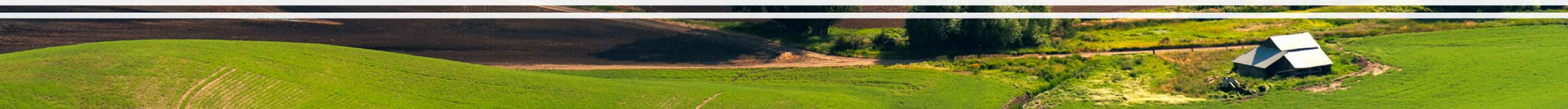

MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT FOR OPIOID USE DISORDER STANDARD OF CARE

The American Medical Association and the American Society of Addiction Medicine define addiction as a chronic and treatable brain disease- Under this definition Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) is considered a chronic condition

Providers are expected to provide treatment for chronic conditions consistent with community standards of care

Section 1262 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 removes the “X-waiver” requirement- specifically to increase access and reduce mortality

High numbers of acute substance withdrawal when initially incarcerated along with risks of overdose and death- this number is on the rise with the presence of fentanyl

MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT)

MAT is basic healthcare for individuals with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD)

MAT is the standard of care for treating people with OUD

Three medications are FDA-approved: methadone, buprenorphine, and naltrexone

25% of the prison and jail population in the US has OUD

MAT reduces the risk of death from any cause by 85%, and the risk of death from an overdose by 75% in the weeks following release.

The risk of overdose upon release from jail is enormous when incarcerated people with OUD are not treated with MAT

MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT

The risk of overdose, suicide, and other preventable causes was 87% lower for incarcerated people on MAT compared to incarcerated people with OUD not on MAT.

MAT is a medication that enables people to live healthy and productive lives in the face of disease that has altered their brain chemistry.

Ensure MAT is available to everyone for whom it is clinically indicated.

MAT should be made available both to people who were already on MAT in the community and to people who need MAT induction.

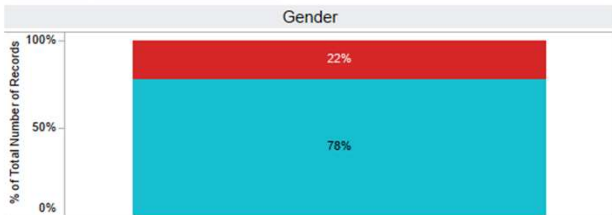
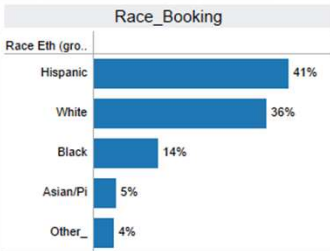

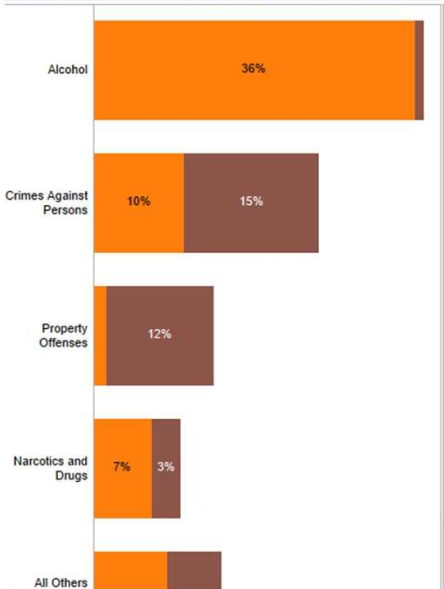


New Crimes Bookings

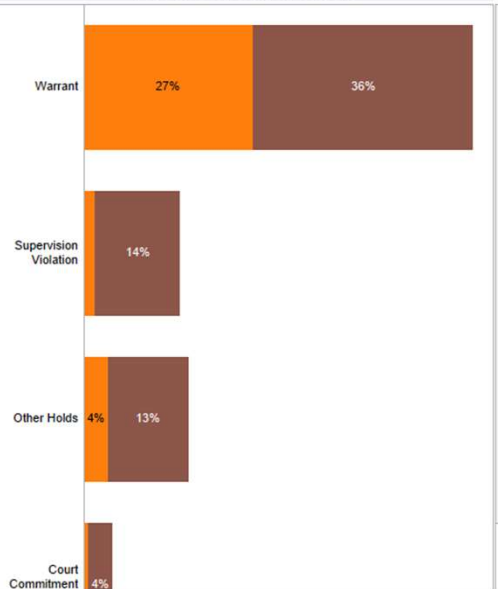
Non-New Crimes Bookings

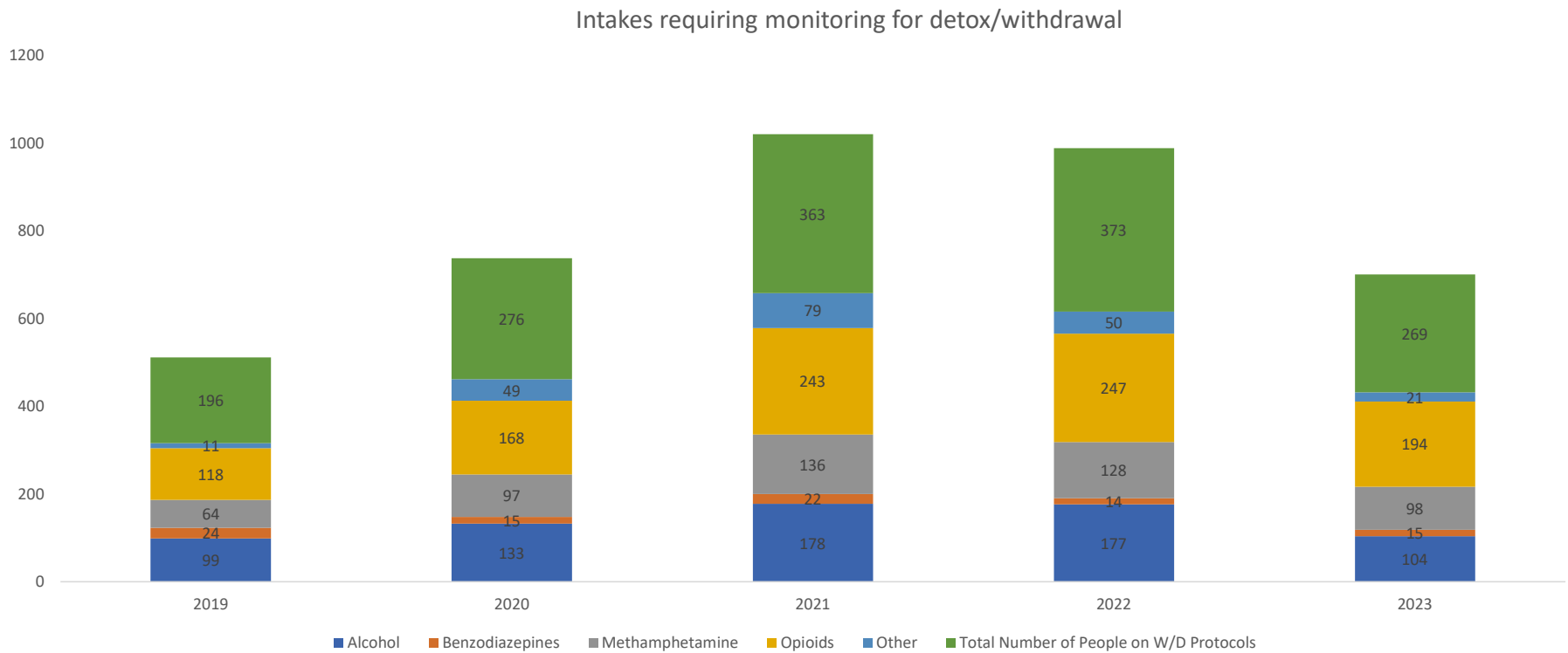
Percent of New Crime Bookings, by Crime Severity



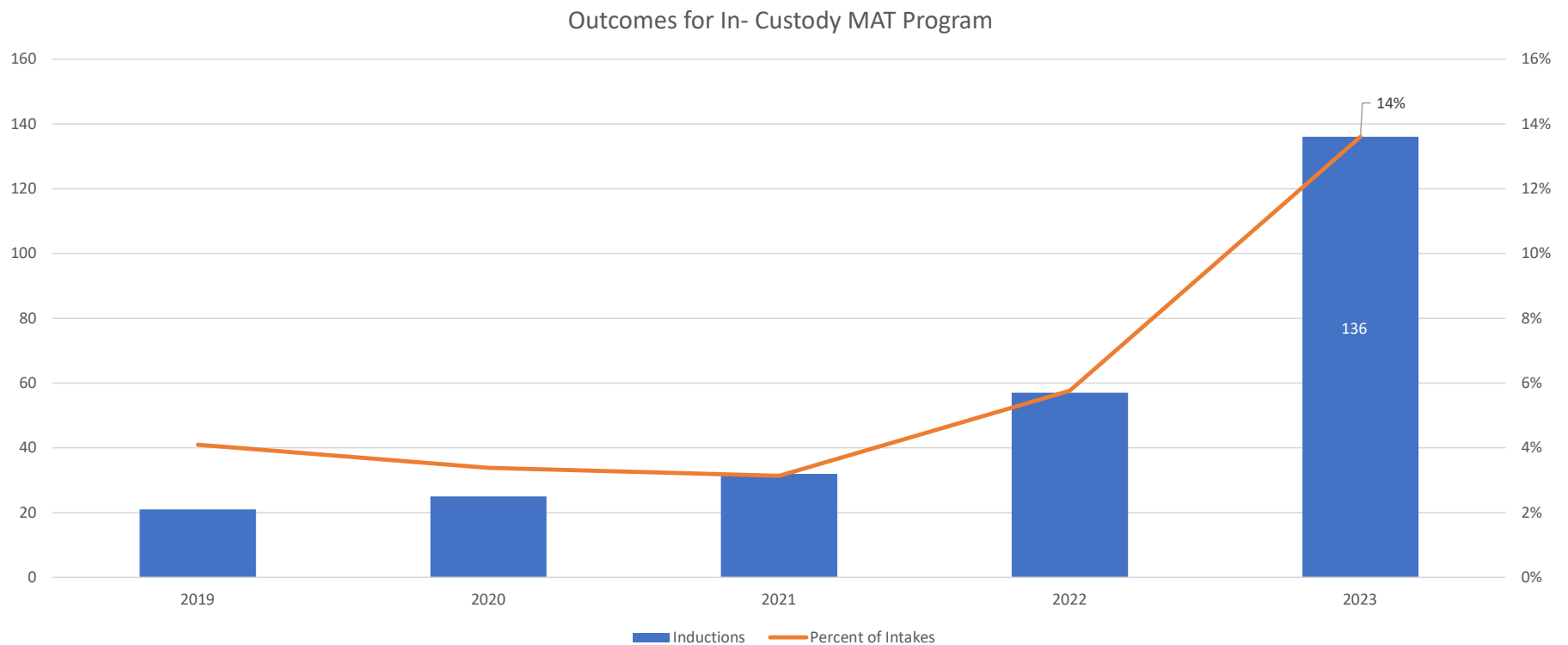
Percent of Non New Crimes
