Thank you for reaching out about the 100 acre grow + greenhouse.

- 1) Although I do understand that Yolo Co. will make income from permits, it should not be at the expense of law abiding citizens, and rural farming and food production.

- 2) As far as the federal govt. is concerned, it is still not legal.
- 3) This 'grow site' will consume huge amounts of water and electricity.
- 4) It creates an influx of crime (just view all the 'NO POT' signs on farms along the coasts of Marin and Solano counties (or ask about this even in San Francisco where security plans and security officers are mandated). Yolo Co. should also weigh the cost of more policing.

5) Whenever the board meets in Yolo Co. regarding the Williamson Act they all say how "Yolo Co. has a long history of food crops and is a rural agricultural growing Co. which they want to continue."

6) The designation of rural farming land use in this area should then require a change.

7) Wildlife is affected negatively by the overwhelming smell.

My grandparents bought the land next door (120 acres) in the 1800s. They actively lived & worked there. Today I keep it for rural production of true agricultural use. I charge little rent to assure this continues.
