Hi Jeff,

I wanted to speak with you about the proposed cannabis indoor project taking place behind my property. I have several comments to make regarding you or the county's decision to allow this to happen.

How can it be that if someone grows more than six plants they will be arrested, children taken and put through criminal courts, face jail time or probation and fines. During the pandemic cannabis was deemed essential for the public good, yet court cases are based upon public safety. The counties current stance is that anyone cultivating more than six plants is a criminal. So how can it be that a few exceptions are made for a very small group of people? What makes them more special or superior to any other citizen in this county? The constitution states all men are created equal, our 14th amendment also states all should be treated equally under the law. The obvious injustice is blatant and disturbing.
