03/01	<p>Executive Order: Immediate Expansion of American Timber Production</p>	<p>Within 30 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture, through the Director of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the Chief of the United States Forest Service (USFS), respectively, shall each issue new or updated guidance regarding tools to facilitate increased timber production and sound forest management, reduce time to deliver timber, and decrease timber supply uncertainty.</p> <p>Within 180 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture shall consider adopting categorical exclusions administratively established by other agencies to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act and reduce unnecessarily lengthy processes and associated costs related to administrative approvals for timber production, forest management, and wildfire risk reduction treatments.</p>	<p>Per the Strategic Plan County Goals, Yolo County has interest in providing support for fire service sustainability to prevent wildfire risk.</p> <p>Updated guidance regarding tools for sound forest management and streamlining processes related to wildfire risk reduction treatments could be a benefit in pursuit of the County’s goals for effective fire mitigation.</p>
02/26	<p>Executive Order: The President’s “Department of Government Efficiency Cost Efficiency Initiative”</p>	<p>This order commences a transformation in Federal spending on contracts, grants, and loans to ensure Government spending is transparent and Government employees are accountable to the American public.</p> <p><i>Contract and Grant Justification.</i> Each Agency Head shall, with assistance as requested from the agency’s DOGE Team Lead, build a centralized technological system within the agency to seamlessly record every payment issued by the agency pursuant to each of the agency’s covered contracts and grants, along with a brief, written justification for each payment</p>	<p>All payments from federal funds issued to the County may be recorded using this new methodology and new requirements for payments may be developed.</p>

<p>02/19</p>	<p>Executive Order: Ending Taxpayer Subsidization of Open Borders</p>	<p>The head of each executive department or agency will identify all federally funded programs administered by the agency that currently permit illegal aliens to obtain any cash or non-cash public benefit, and, take all appropriate actions to align such programs with the purposes of this order which is to uphold the rule of law, defend taxpayer resources, and protect benefits for American citizens. Eligibility verification systems must, to the maximum extent possible, ensure that taxpayer-funded benefits exclude any ineligible alien. Within 30 days of this order, the Director of the Office of Management and Budget and the Administrator of the US DOGE Service shall refer any improper receipt of use of Federal benefits to the Department of Justice and the Department of Homeland Security for appropriate action. Ensures that Federal payments to States and localities do not, by design or effect, facilitate the subsidization or promotion of illegal immigration, or abet “sanctuary” policies that seek to protect illegal aliens from deportation.</p>	<p>Impacts the 2017 Board of Supervisors resolution which ensures Yolo County is a safe, welcoming place for all.</p> <p>The 2025 Intergovernmental Advocacy Policy approved by the Board, February 11, 2025, includes commitments such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support actions that uphold the U.S. Constitution and due process rights for all people and protect the people and economy of Yolo County (Thriving Residents) • Oppose actions that that may be harmful to families or children or that interfere with a person’s right to pursue asylum in the United States or that result in a denial of due process of law. (Thriving Residents) • Support actions which work to promote the health and safety of residents, without regard to immigration status. (Thriving Residents) • Seek legal resources to support Yolo County residents with immigration issues (Thriving Residents) • Support actions which ensure family unity, community security, respect, due process and support for all residents

(Thriving Residents)</p> <p>Per the recent Memorandum “Yolo County as a Safe and Welcoming Place for all”, HHSa services, as described, may be impacted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• HHSa operates without regard to individuals’ immigration status unless specific state or federal benefit programs require the collection of this information.• Our safety net programs: CPS and APS protect the public regardless of immigration status. Our general employment programs and agriculture worker programs generally serve the public regardless of immigration status.• CalWORKS has some specific programming for refugees and allowances for benefits for some mixed immigration families. The agency actively works with immigrations rights groups and legal services to make referrals when warranted. At this point, Medi-Cal or health insurance for low-income individuals and families regardless of immigration status is essentially fully in place whether that be through Medi-Cal expansions, PRUCOL exemptions or CMSP.

Families or individuals with mixed immigration status are often hesitant to apply for benefits they may be eligible for out of fear that their data may be used against them when legalizing their residency status.
<p>02/19</p>	<p>Executive Order: Commencing the Reduction of the Federal Bureaucracy</p>	<p>This order commences a reduction in the size of the Federal Government. Within 14 days of the date of this order, the head of each eliminated governmental entity (listed) shall confirm compliance to the Office of Management and Budget. In reviewing budget requests submitted by the governmental entities, the OMB Director or the head of any executive department or agency charged with reviewing grant requests by such entities shall reject funding requests for such governmental entities.</p>	<p>This order may impact the County’s grant funding requests submitted to the governmental agencies deemed “unnecessary” by the Office of management and Budget.</p>
<p>02/18</p>	<p>Executive Order: Ensuring Accountability for all Agencies</p>	<p>It shall be the policy of the executive branch to ensure Presidential supervision and control of the entire Executive branch. Moreover, all executive departments and agencies including independent agencies shall submit for review all proposed and final significant regulatory actions to the Office of information and Regulatory Affairs (OIRA) within the Executive Office of the President before publication in the Federal Register.</p>	<p>Worth noting the potential reduction of checks and balances on executive authority, specifically, over the control of independent agencies’ determinations and direction. Difficult to quantify a direct local impact to date.</p>
