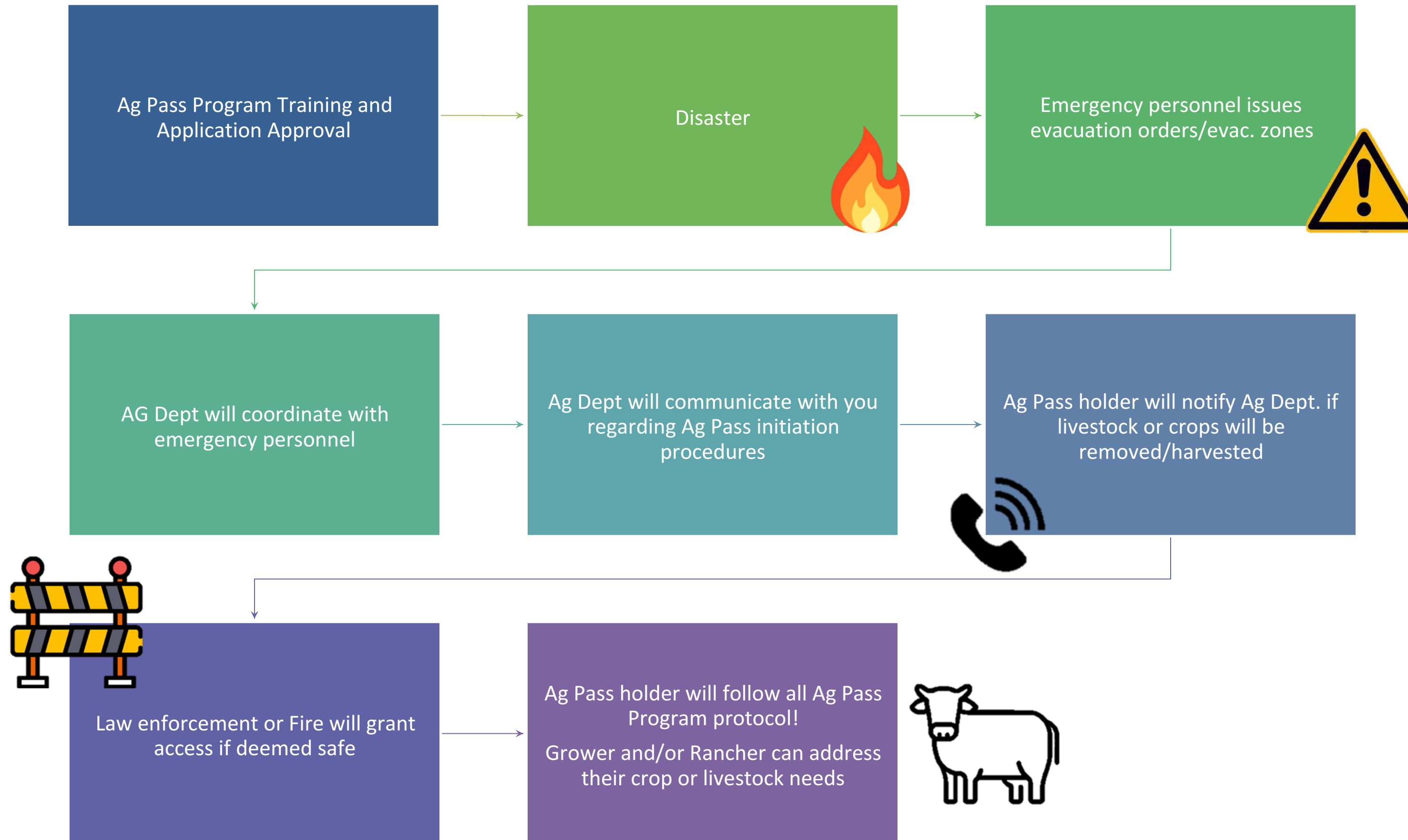

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE AG PASS PROGRAM

Meet eligibility requirements

- Commercial livestock or agricultural producers
- Horse Stable Operators/Owners
- Provide documentation- listed on Page 3
 - Pesticide permit No., land lease, brand ID, APN proof with applicant's name, IRS Schedule F, etc.

Employees of operation

- Ag Pass holder is allowed to bring up to 10 support staff
 - Support staff must be escorted and supervised by the ag pass holder
- Managerial Employee
 - Designated employee can apply but must provide verification of employment

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE AG PASS PROGRAM

Liability Waiver

- Review conditions
- Applicant is aware that he or she will be entering a restricted access area
 - Risks and hazards presents
- Yolo County will not be held liable

Conditional Access

- Possession of Ag Pass does not grant any rights or privileges nor guarantee access
- Access will be dependent on safety conditions and approved by emergency personnel

Mandatory Training/Renewal

- Initial course
- 1 hour annual refresher
- Expires at the end of the year

Possession of an Ag Pass does not grant any rights or privileges nor guarantee access into evacuation areas through road blocks or other pathways during emergency events. Access will be dependent on safety conditions at the time and upon approval of emergency personnel. If your livestock and agriculture operations are in an evacuation zone, the Ag Pass holder will be notified that their pass is active. **DO NOT GO TO A ROAD BLOCK AND ATTEMPT TO USE THE COMMERCIAL AG PASS WITHOUT PRIOR NOTIFICATION.** Ag Pass holders must enter and exit restricted areas at the same access point and check-in/check-out with emergency personnel. Access will only be granted during daylight hours. Failure to adhere to the Ag Pass Program terms and conditions and orders issued by emergency responders or program administrators will result in revocation of Ag Passes.

If you intend to remove livestock, or other animals from the evacuation zone, please provide prior notification to the Yolo County Agriculture-Weights and Measures office, 530-666-8140.
