

Attachment A: Contributions of Non-Profit, Volunteer, For-Profit, and other Community Partners

Resource	Contributions
Shelter Volunteers: Dogs-40, Cats-40	Dogs: Socialization, exercise, day trips, training, foster Cats: Socialization, feeding, cage cleaning, kitten fosters Both: Adoption showings, off-site community events, photography, social media, outreach, dishes/laundry, office support, fundraising, grant writing
Foster care providers: Kittens-300, Dogs-15	Kittens: bottle feeding, socialization, medical care, marketing to promote adoption after spay/neuter Dogs: day trips or overnight stays to socialize in a home setting and out in community, marketing Medical fosters are also utilized following complicated procedures or to manage medical conditions.
High School Volunteers/Interns	Opportunities to meet graduation requirements or develop skills before entering the workforce include: Cleaning/husbandry, clerical, donation distribution, adoption events, community vaccine clinics, assistance with medical procedures.
High School students of Woodland Joint Unified School District: 10	Momentum partnership provides approved high school students for kennel cleaning and animal husbandry support at no cost to YCAS.
Community Members	Follow social media to direct residents to community resources, including County services for lost and found animals; participate in community discussions related to spay/neuter and cost structures; fundraising and in-kind donations; promotion of adoptable animals, events, and supplies needed
Sandy Rogers Dog Agility Trainer (BAM)	Weekly enrichment for shelter dogs and professional training with volunteers on site
Yolo Food Bank	On a weekly basis, provides pet food and supplies to the shelter and community members in need
Yolo County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (YSPCA)	Transfers animals - primarily puppies, kittens, and medical cases - from the shelter's care to their own care for placement in a foster or long-term adoptive home; sponsors vaccine clinic supplies and resources for community spay/neuter of owned animals and TNR cats
Yolo Spay and Neuter Group	Transfers animals needing placement – primarily puppies, kittens, medical cases, livestock, and exotics; sponsors vaccine clinic supplies and resources for community spay/neuter of owned animals and TNR cats; works closely with the shelter to focus on targeted TNR within the community.
Animal Rescue Groups	Approved partners throughout California, Oregon, and Washington, including transportation providers to transfer animals by ground or air travel out of the shelter

Friends of YCAS	Provides funding directly to YCAS for smaller improvement projects, enrichment items, dog handling equipment, special medical procedures (dentals and imaging); sponsors adoption events, promotes adoptable animals (including online appointment scheduling) and community resources; works directly with YCAS to support program goals and division mission. Provided \$7,300 in funding and volunteer support to improve dog exercise areas by installing artificial turfgrass and taller fencing in 2025.
UC Davis Koret Shelter Medicine Program	Resource for shelter standards of care, best practices, industry trends, and online training for staff and volunteers; in-kind support for Clinic in a Can and planning/development of community spay/neuter clinic.
California for All Animals	Statewide shelter assistance program (\$45MM), administered by the UC Davis Koret Shelter Medicine Program, that awarded YCAS in 2024-2025: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$363,450 to increase spay/neuter capacity for shelter and owned animals • \$107,500 for Outreach, Access to Care, and supplies/equipment for new community spay/neuter clinic • \$337,000 for “Clinic in a Can” - a compact, on-site veterinary clinic
California Animal Welfare Association (CalAnimals)	Contributes to key legislation and represents/supports animal care and control agencies, SPCAs, humane societies, and other animal welfare organizations; provides scholarships and training for leadership, Animal Service Officers and kennel staff; partners with other Animal Service Agencies and shelters on best practices and emergency assistance.
Philanthropic contributors	Team or Individual volunteers include: Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts, sororities and fraternities, UCD Vet Aide Club, UCD Athletic Teams, local Church congregations, AAA, Target Corporation, Countywide elementary and middle schools, Yolo County Department Supervisors. Host supply drives, fundraise, share shelter needs/information, organize donation drives, host bake sales, make cat beds and toys, donate for shelter animals.
Private businesses	Host and donate staff time, space, and supplies for adoption events, including discounted services/coupons to adopters and a free first veterinary clinic visit for adopted animals. Local businesses include: Pet Supplies Plus, Pet Food Express, TruValue, ACE Hardware, Tractor Supply, Growing Groves, Blue Note, The Gallery, Davis Creamery, The Hive, and Berryessa Brewing Company.
Retail distribution Centers	Weekly pickup of pet food to supply pet food pantry for community members in need. Includes: Walmart, Costco, Pet Food Express
Unleashing the Possibilities	Local non-profit dedicated to raise community support/awareness for improvements to current shelter.
