

Appendix B: Low-Income Testimony and Agency Response

As required by California Government Code Section 12747(b)-(d), agencies are required to conduct a public hearing for the purpose of reviewing the draft CAP. All testimony presented by low-income individuals and families during the public hearing shall be identified in the final CAP. During the public hearing and comment period held by the Yolo County Community Services Action Board (CSAB), there was no testimony from any individuals who identified as low-income. CSAB did get feedback from an individual who identified being from a community-based organization and feedback from someone who has family who is low-income. Their feedback is presented below.
