- Spanish-language services implemented.
- HHSa partnership created to provide employment and vocational services at DRC sites twice per month.
- An MOU between SCOE and YCOE was established to provide YCOE-delivered HISET and Career Navigation services to DRC participants through 2026.
- The Woodland DRC relocated to an impactful and state-of-the-art new facility on the grounds of the Sheriff's Detention Complex.

SCOE Reentry Model



Referral

Prior to enrollment, all participants are referred by their supervising agency. The supervising agency notes mandated and suggested programming on the referral.



Intake and Assessment

Participants are contacted for intake by DRC staff within 24 hours of referral. Once enrolled, participants are assessed for risk level and criminogenic needs.



Individualized Case Planning

Transition Specialists review assessment outcomes, supervision mandates, and participant goals to design individual case plans within 30 days of enrollment.



Service Delivery

Based on the case plan, participants are placed in DRC courses, linked with area resources, and scheduled for weekly individual planning sessions with their Transition Specialist. Case plan progress is reviewed by staff every 30 days.

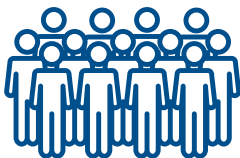


Community Reentry

Transition Specialists provide support and guidance to participants aimed at sustaining change, remaining out of custody, preparing for new needs and challenges, and prioritizing pro-social relationships and activities.

Referrals to DRC

When referring to the Day Reporting Center, supervising agencies complete a participant referral form noting the individual’s contact information, ADA needs, primary language, recommended and mandated services, and special conditions of supervision. SCOE’s DRC staff process all referral forms within 24 hours of receipt with the goal of scheduling an intake appointment as quickly as possible.

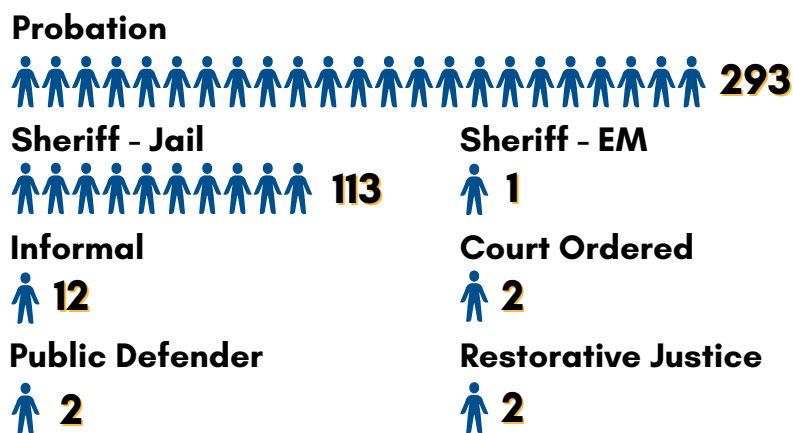

425 Total Referrals

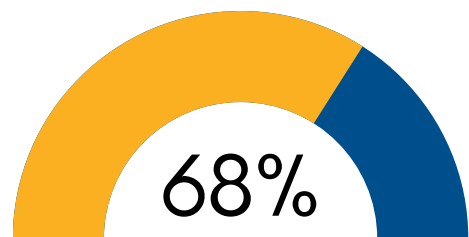
Representing 337 unduplicated individuals

In 2023–2024, supervising agencies submitted a total of 425 referrals, representing 337 unduplicated individuals. Compared to the previous year, this represents an increase of **15%** in total referrals received by the DRC.

Increased Intake Completion Rates

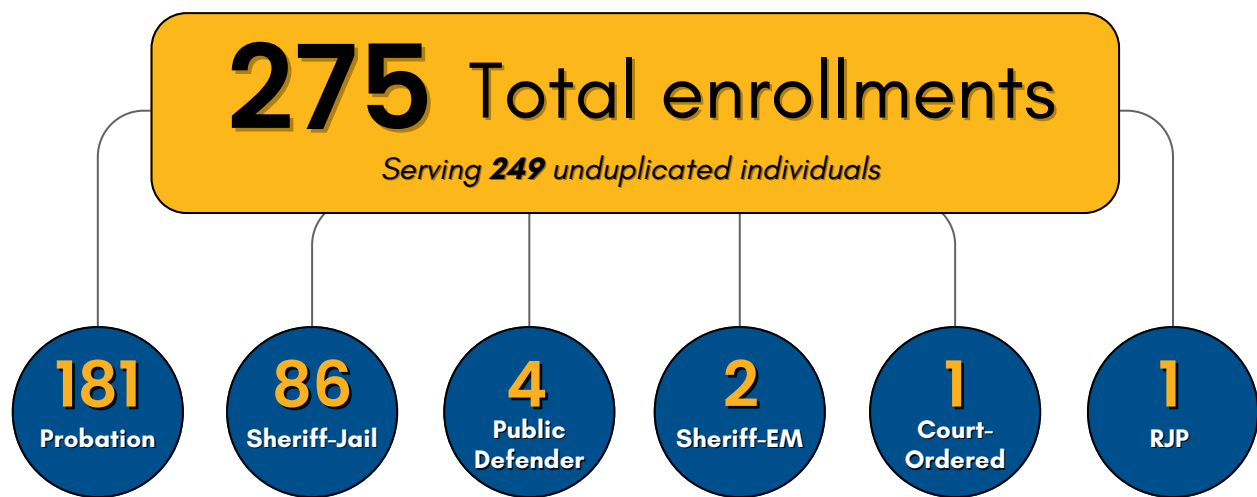
Participants completed their intake at a higher rate in 2023–2024 than in 2022–2023. **68%** of individuals referred to the DRC completed their intake, representing an increase of **10 percent** from 58% over the 2022–2023 program year.

Enrollments

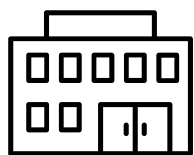
At the enrollment appointment, DRC Transition Specialists focus on rapport building and meeting the participant’s immediate needs. The participant receives an overview of DRC services and is scheduled to return for further assessment and case planning.

Total Enrollments Grouped by Supervision Level

In 2023-2024, the DRC completed a total of 275 enrollments, comprised of 249 unduplicated participants. This represents an **increase of 9.1%** in total enrollments and **9.7%** in unduplicated participants enrolled.



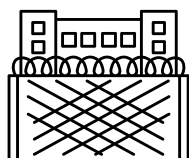
Enrollments by DRC Location

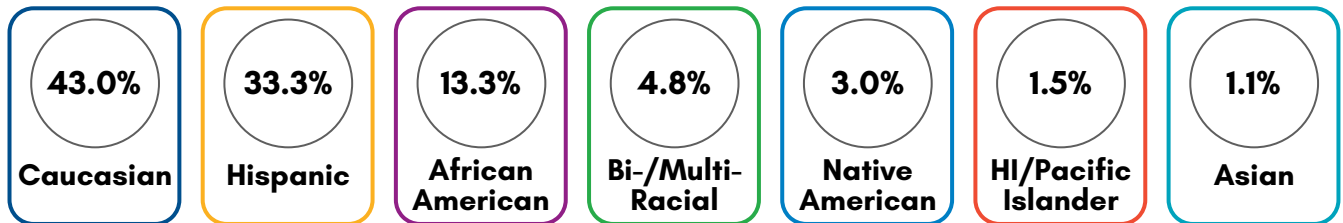
Demographics of Enrolled Participants

Language



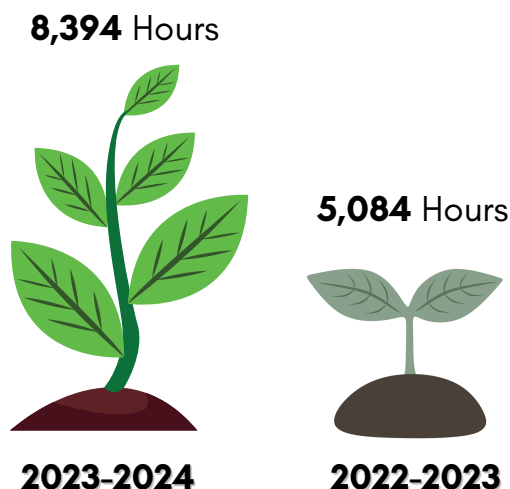
SCOE Reentry employs Spanish bilingual staff and maintains subcontracts with translation service providers, including ASL providers.



Participant Engagement

Dosage Hours

DRC participants are placed in classes and activities that support their case plan goals. DRC staff record attendance and dosage hour outcomes within 24 hours of the class session or activity.



In 2023-2024, DRC participants completed a **total of 8,394 dosage hours**. Compared to the 2022-2023 program year, this represents an **increase of 3,310 hours**.

Course Offerings

The DRC offers an array of courses to participants both in and out of custody. All participants are given a course schedule that reflects their case plan and is designed to meet their needs. Additionally, all participants are scheduled for recurring one-on-one case planning appointments with their assigned Transition Specialist.

Community Reentry

Out of Custody and Engaged in Program

SCOE's DRC Transition Specialists review case plans every 30 days, meet individually with participants weekly, and provide supportive services to participants throughout the community reentry process. The goal is to sustain engagement in the program, remain out of custody, and prepare for the post-DRC reentry experience.

During 2023–2024, just 8.3% of participants were exited from the DRC due to a return to custody while active in the DRC. Among all enrollments, the average length of stay in the DRC was 135 days. Successful participants displayed a 53% increase in exit employment rates when compared to rates at entry, and all DRC participants displayed a 33% increase in employment rates when compared to their employment rates at entry.

2023-2024 Successful Participation

For some participants, the entirety of their case plan goals are addressed at the DRC. When the case plan is complete, this group of participants becomes eligible for a **Successful Completion** exit. For other, the DRC may serve as a stepping stone or launch pad to the next step in their reentry experience. This group of participants, referred to as **Administrative Completions**, are in full compliance with their DRC case plan at the time of exit and are discharged for a reason conducive to achieving their case plan and reentry goals. Administrative Completions also include jail participants who were in full compliance with their DRC participation requirements at the time of their release.

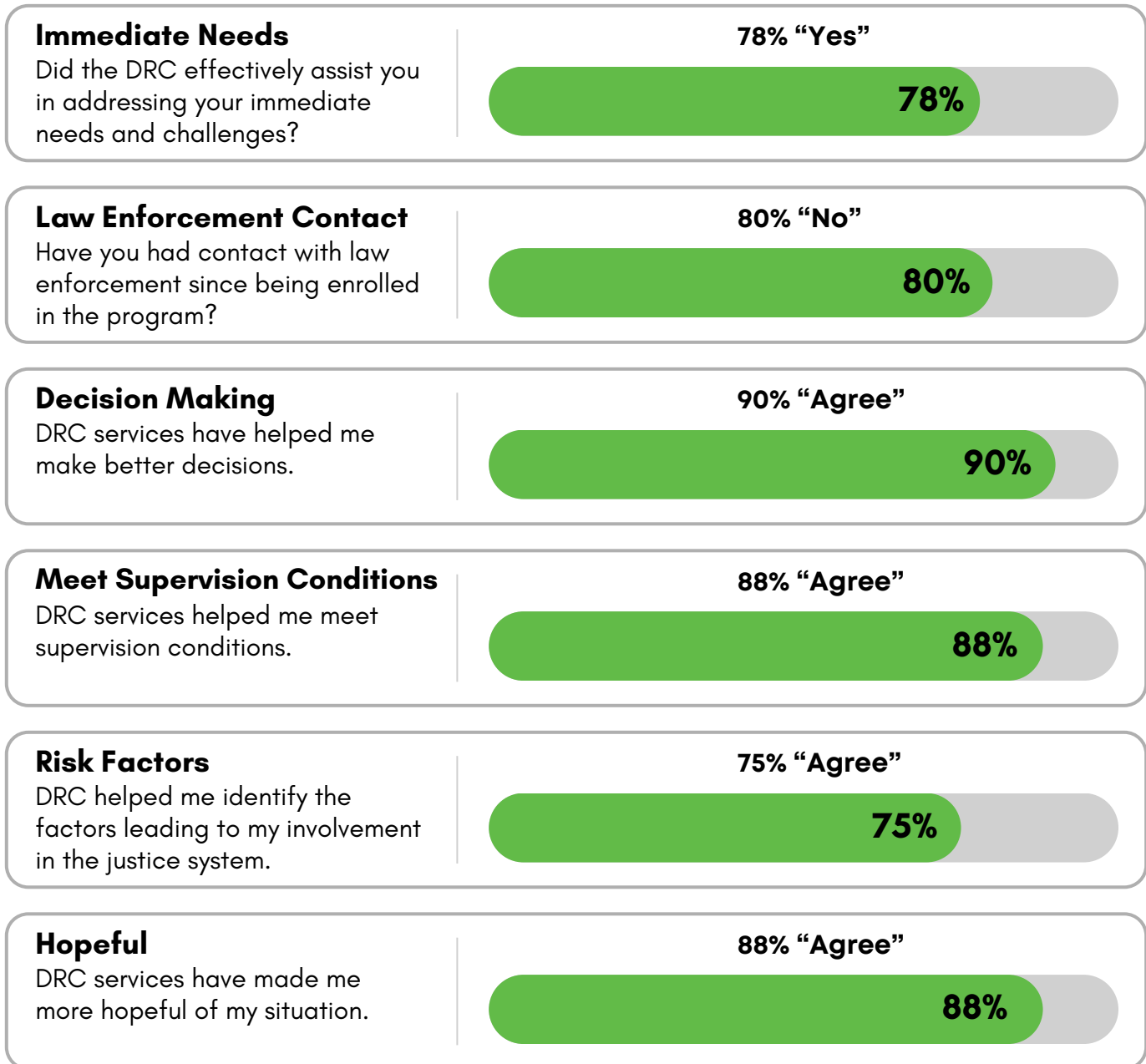

Funding and Cost to Yolo County

The Yolo DRC is collaboratively funded by Yolo County and California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR). The DRC serves populations referred by both agencies and funding contributions are relative to numbers of participants served.

During 2023-2024, the DRC team completed a total of 349 enrollments stemming from 618 total referrals by Yolo County and CDCR. Collectively, 318 unduplicated CDCR- and Yolo County-referred individuals enrolled in the DRC during 2023-2024. Yolo County accounted for 68.8% of total referrals and 78.8% of total enrollments.

Year Ahead

During 2023-2024, SCOE delivered 8,394.70 dosage hours to participants, representing an increase of 3,300 hours over the 2022-2023 program year. Moving into the 2024-2025 program year, the participant experience will remain at the forefront of SCOE’s DRC operations with delivery and tracking of participant dosage hours, criminogenic need-centered case planning, and participant engagement and success remaining at the forefront of operations.
