CAP Month Impact

- **Community Participation**

- Libraries, public agencies, and families showed a strong countywide commitment to prevention and awareness

- **Media Campaign - Coverage by Good Day Sacramento**

- Good Day Sacramento amplified these community participation efforts, highlighting local voices and initiatives

- 1,262 accounts reached

- 8,217 views during CAP Month

Yolo County Health & Human Services Agency Prevention Efforts

Child Abuse Prevention, Intervention and Treatment Program (CAPIT) - supplement child welfare services including day care, respite, mental health services, home visiting, and parent education. **2011 Realignment** - Expended \$10,111 FY 24/25 Q2

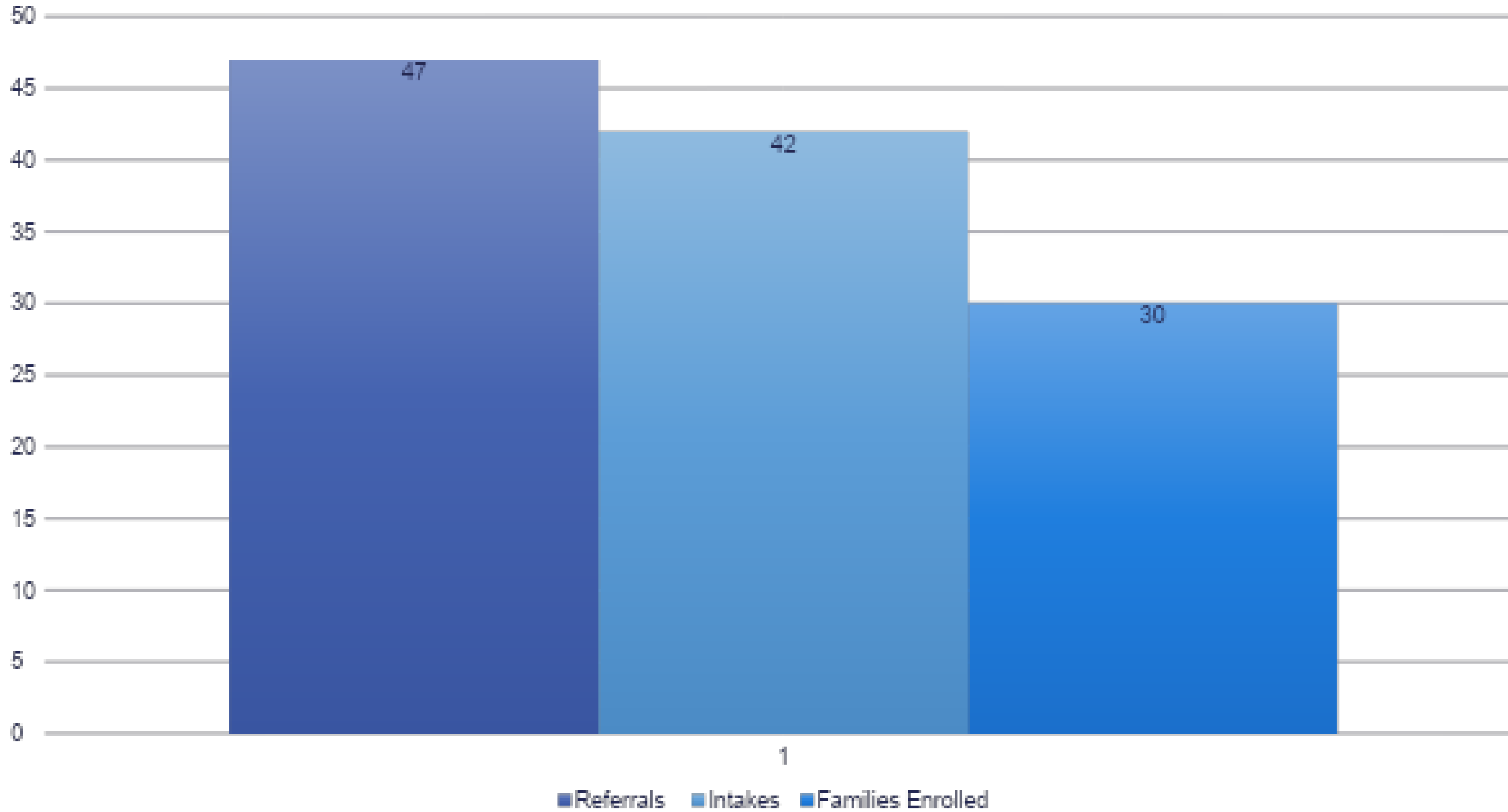
Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) - develop community-based prevention focused programs that aid families, providing early support and promoting parenting skills. **Federal Funds** – Expended \$45,000 FY 24/25

Promoting Safe and Stable Families Program (PSSF) – family preservation, Community-based family support, Family reunification and Adoption promotion and support. **Federal Funds** – Expended \$17,146 FY 23/24 Q2

Family First Prevention Services Program (FFPS) – provide primary, secondary and tertiary services including evidence-based home programs to those who may be at risk of entering foster care but can remain safely at home with service provision. CWS is utilizing an **Alternative Response** approach to these services. **One-Time State Block Grant** – Expended \$467, 737

HHSA - Alternative Response (AR)

- AR is a strategy that allows CWS to respond in a more flexible manner, providing evidence-based home visiting programs to families via community based, contracted service providers:
 - First 5 Yolo
 - Yolo County Children's Alliance
- AR is the pathway to provide Family First Prevention Services (FFPS):
 - Healthy Families America (ages 0-5)
 - Family Check Up (ages 2-17)

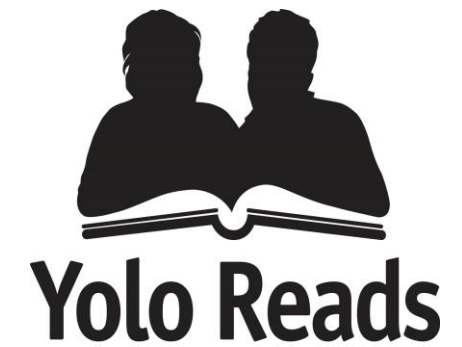
