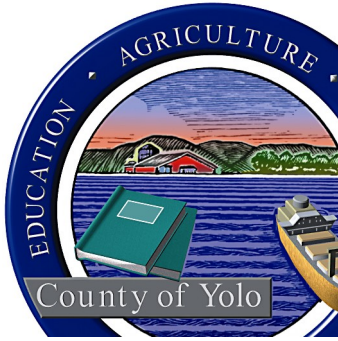

1. Be an owner, chief executive officer, chief operating officer, or other individual with optimum policy-making or hiring authority; and
2. Provide employment opportunities in in-demand industry sectors or occupations, as those terms are defined in WIOA sec. 3(23).
3. Additional Business Representative Criteria to Consider:
 - a. Business representatives may include economic development entities and chambers of commerce, when they are a private entity (for profit or non-profit) or a public-private partnership, but are not a governmental entity, **and** meet the WIOA requirements of a business representative.
 - b. Business representatives should not typically include non-profits unless they are set up as a business cooperative. The exception would be a non-profit economic development or chamber of commerce organization.
 - c. Business representatives should represent a business that offers employment opportunities.
 - d. Business representatives should not be a sole proprietor or entrepreneur.
 - e. Business representatives should not be a public sector employer, even if it is a major employer in the local economy.

Each Workforce/Labor representative must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a representative of a labor organization (for a local area in which employees are represented by the labor organization), who have been nominated by local labor federations, or (for a local area in which no employees are represented by such organization) other representative of employees.
2. Be a representative who is a member of a labor organization or a training director, from a joint labor-management apprenticeship program.
3. May include representative if community based organizations that address the employment needs of individuals with barriers to employment, including organizations that serve veterans or provide competitive integrated employment for individuals with disabilities.
4. May include representative of organization that address employment training or education needs of eligible youth.

Applicant of Membership Category Other:

1. The Chief Local Elected Official may appoint other individuals to the Local Board at his or her discretion, such as local agencies or entities administering transportation, house and public assistance and philanthropic organizations.
