Resolution No. 25-104

***Recognizing September 13, 2025 as
“The Silver Anniversary of the Cache Creek Nature Preserve”***

WHEREAS, Yolo County and has worked diligently through the decades to maintain and grow its parks and rural areas for the benefit of those who live, work and visit; and

WHEREAS, the Cache Creek Conservancy was founded in 1996 by the Yolo County Board of Supervisors as a means of preserving the native habitat along Cache Creek west of the city of Woodland; and

WHEREAS, the Nature Preserve - which itself was established in the year 2000 - have cooperated with area businesses which mine gravel from Cache Creek to ensure the health of the local environment, including water, soil and wildlife; and

WHEREAS, the staff at the Nature Preserve has worked with the Patwin people of the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation to honor the culture and heritage of those who first inhabited this region for thousands of years; and

WHEREAS, the Cache Creek Nature Preserve acts as a steward of the land, slowly restoring native grasses, trees and wildlife that might otherwise be lost to development; and

WHEREAS, the Nature Preserve serves as an open-air research laboratory for students and staff at UC Davis and elsewhere for those who study ecosystems and how we might better live in harmony with nature.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims September 13, 2025 as the Silver Anniversary of the Cache Creek Conservancy and Nature Preserve so that all of Yolo County residents recognize and celebrate the efforts being undertaken to preserve the environment as it once existed.
