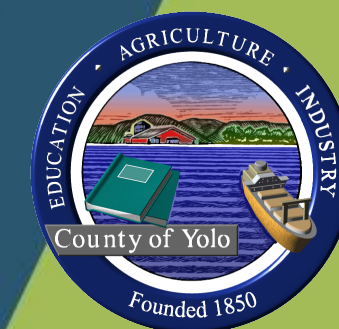

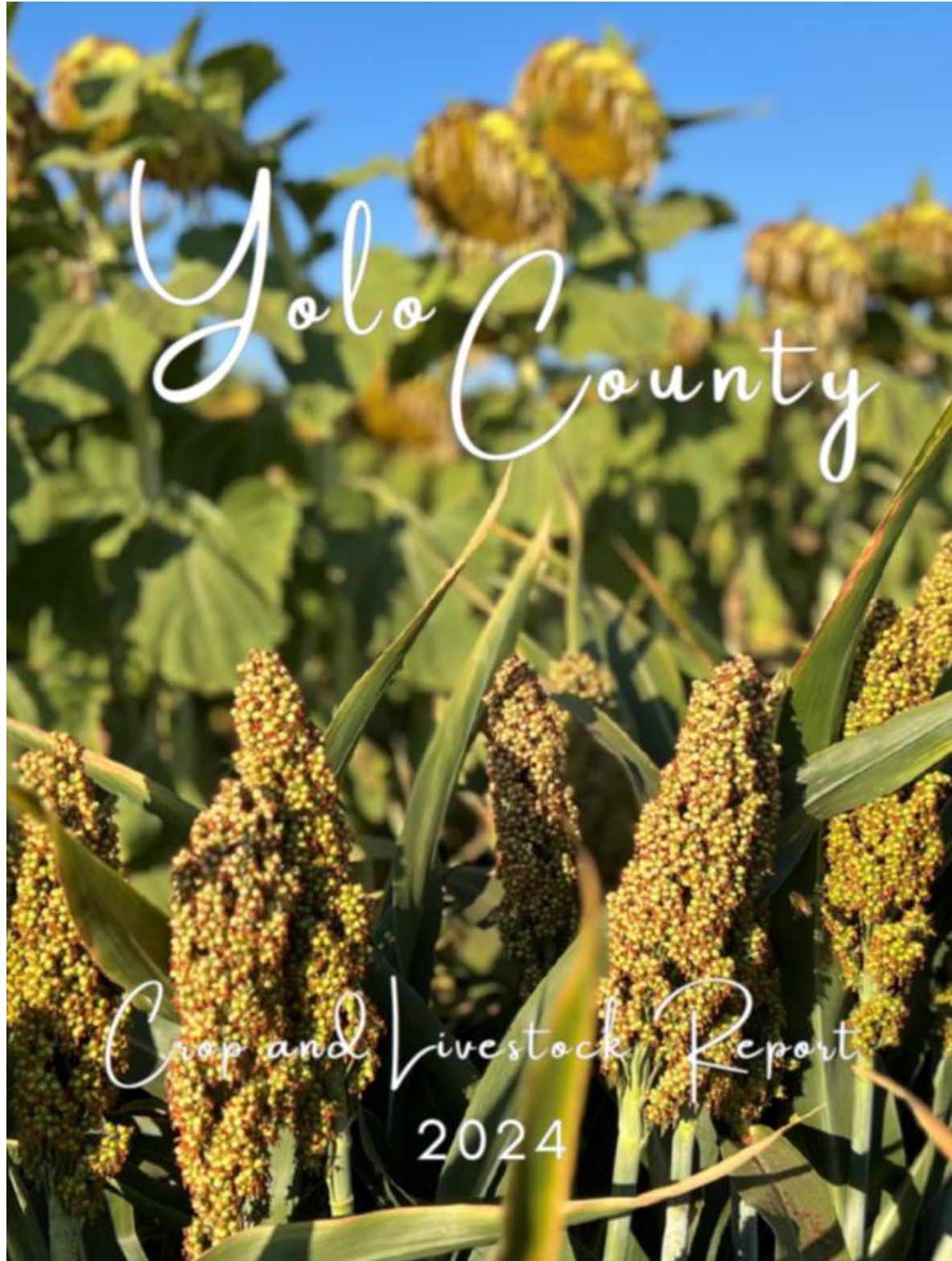

# 2024 CROP REPORT



- California Food and Agriculture Code mandates an annual Crop Report
  - Condition of agriculture in the county
  - Acreage
  - Production
  - Value
  - Additional information includes:
    - Pest Eradication, Pest Management and control activities
    - Pest Exclusion and Quarantine activities
    - Other pertinent information related to production agriculture

## 2024 Highlights

- The gross value of Yolo County's agricultural production for 2024 was **\$824,597,000**
- This represents a **decrease** of \$77,507,000 or approximately **8.6%** less than 2023's value of \$902,104,000.
- **Almond** value rebounded in 2024, with a value of \$178,925,000. In 2024, the price increased by \$1,030 per ton.
- **Processing Tomatoes** value decreased in 2024 due to contract limitations. This resulted in less acreage and a lower price. At price of \$173,152,000, processing tomatoes moved to the number two spot.

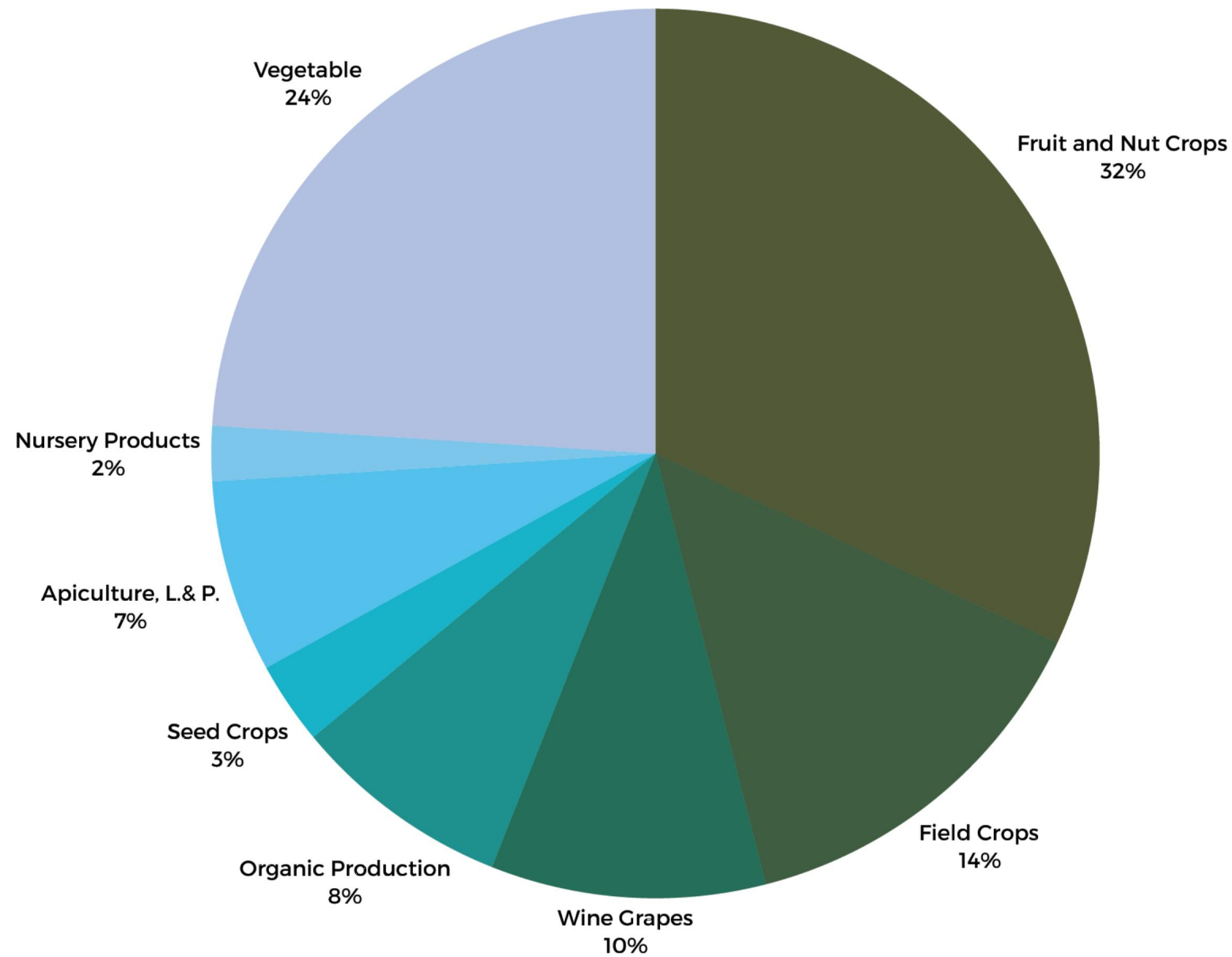

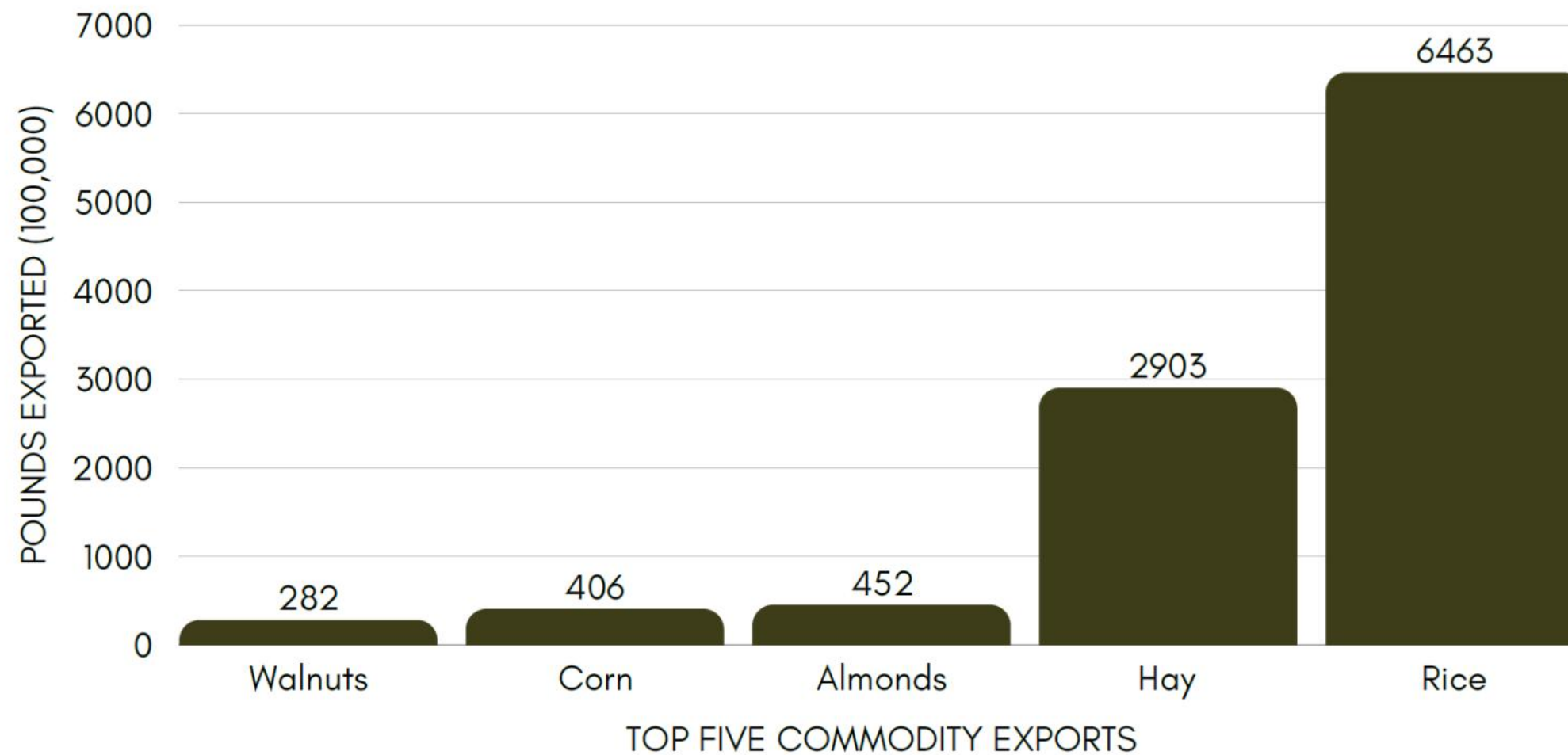

# PEST EXCLUSION

- In 2024, Yolo County welcomed their first Agriculture Detector Dog Team
  - Christine Tyler and Berty
- 1,051 High risk plant material shipments were inspected
  - 663 of the shipments were found with the Agriculture Detector Dog Team
- 260 shipments were found to be in violation of Federal or State Quarantine violations<sup>8</sup>
- 149 shipments were rejected due to pests of concern
