The presentation also included information relevant to local implementation of the Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) that was implemented by Proposition 1, which will take effect on July 1, 2026.
- Approved staff recommendation funding scenario 2 to address the MHSA deficit in fiscal year 2025-26 (\$4 million) as follows:
 - Allocation of \$146,000 of cannabis revenue and Board directed project funds
 - 25% MHSA cut to providers totaling \$695,333

 - Use of Fund balance of \$869,807
- Delayed making a decision on funding cuts for fiscal year 26/27 (\$5 million)
